This Month in History


Comments from the judges included "The silver color is sharp and the combination with the black and yellow goes together well. We like the way the graphics were executed. It is trendy and modern."

New Curbside Recycling Guidelines

The Vienna Department of Public Works has begun collecting recyclables using a "single stream" method. This means that all recyclables - with the exception of brush - will be collected with the same truck, thereby reducing the number of times trucks must pass each house. Brush will still need to be separated from recyclables. Residents may use plastic bins. clean trash cans, cardboard boxes, kraft paper bags, or clear plastic bags for recyclable materials (40-lb. weight limit per container). If a trash can-type container is used for recyclables, it should be clearly labeled and preferably blue. See page 3 for more information.

Leaf Collection Schedule Extended

Last year, the Town of Vienna experienced a delayed autumn season, with leaves falling throughout December and into January. To provide better service in case of another late autumn, a fourth pass through town has been added to the leaf collection schedule, and the Special Pickup program will resume in February instead of January.

Department of Public Works crews using leaf vacuum machines will collect leaves that residents have raked to the curbside. Crews may take several days to finish in an area, but they will pass your address only once during each collection period. If you miss your vacuum collection dates, the Public Works Department will still collect your leaves; however, the leaves must be bagged and placed at the curbside for pickup with your regular trash. Up to 20 bags of leaves will be picked up on any single refuse collection day throughout the year.

Please rake leaves just to the curbside, not into the street. Cars parked on leaf piles may catch on fire, and children playing in the leaves may be struck by a passing vehicle. Also, leaves may prevent rainwater from reaching stormwater inlets. Residents may wish to move vehicles off the street to avoid dust from the leaf vacuums when the weather is dry; the Town cannot be responsible for washing cars.

NEW RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Please help the environment by recycling. Recycling helps to reduce the amount of trash going into landfills and takes materials out of the waste stream.



MIXED RECYCLABLES AND NEWSPAPER: These items can now be placed together in the same container for recycling and do not need to be separated. Residents may use plastic bins, clean trash cans, cardboard boxes, brown kraft paper bags, or clear plastic bags for containing recyclable materials (40-lb. weight limit per container). If a trash can-type container is used, it should be clearly labeled and preferably blue. (Please continue to separate brush.)

Recyclables include, but are not limited to:

- Newspapers (including all inserts), magazines, and catalogs
- Junk mail
- Cardboard and paperboard boxes (including cereal boxes without liners) and corrugated boxes
- Books (including paperbacks, textbooks, and hardbacks)
- Aerosol cans
- Telephone books
- Office paper (including typing, fax, copy, computer printouts, letterhead, NCR) and envelopes
- Brown paper bags
- Glass containers such as jars and bottles
- Ferrous and bimetal food and beverage containers
- Non-metalic wrapping paper
- Aluminum food and beverage containers, aluminum foil, and aluminum pie pans
- Narrow-neck plastic containers (other than for motor oil) labled with plastic resin identification code #1 through 7
- Wide-mouth containers such as peanut butter, margarine/butter, yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise, whipped topping, and prescription drug bottles (please note that the lids and caps **do not** need to be removed)
- Rigid plastics, which include plastic milk/soda crates, plastic buckets with metal handles, plastic laundry baskets, plastic lawn furniture, plastic totes, plastic drums, plastic coolers, plastic flower pots, plastic drinking cups/glasses, plastic 5-gallon water bottles, plastic pallets, plastic toys, and empty plastic garbage/recycling bins
- Bagged plastic film (for example, grocery bags contained within one bag, or stretch-film and/or shrink wrap contained within one bag)
- Aseptic/gable-top milk and juice cartons

Plastic items and cardboard items that are recyclable will not longer be eligible for collection as a Special Pickup and should be placed at the curb on your normal recycling day.

Police Offer Internet Safety Presentation

Personal Property Tax Due

Town of Vienna residents pay Fairfax County personal property tax on motor vehicles, due every year on October 5.

The current tax rate is \$4.57 per \$100 of assessed value. New residents or those registering a vehicle for the first time must file a personal property vehicle registration form within 60 days of purchase or entry into the County.

Fairfax County provides car tax relief to citizens who are either 65 years of age or older, or permanently and totally disabled, and meet income and asset eligibility requirements. For more information, call 703-222-8234 or visit www.fairfaxcounty. gov/dta.

Voter Registration Deadline Oct. 6

Monday, October 6, is the last day to register to vote in the November 4 general election. Registration applications are available at various locations around Fairfax County, including the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, and may also be downloaded from the County Web site, www.fairfaxcounty.gov/eb. To be eligible to vote, you must be a U.S. citizen, a Virginia resident, and at least 18 years old on or before election day.

If you are already a registered voter, you should check your voter registration card to be sure it lists your current address and update it if necessary. You can submit your notice of change of name and/or address either by mail (12000 Government Center Pkwy., Suite 323, Fairfax, VA 22035-0081) or by fax (703-324-2205). In either case, the notice must include your signature to be valid. Notice cannot be made by telephone or by e-mail. After your change is processed, you will be mailed a new Voter Information Card.

Registered voters who will be away from Fairfax County on election day, or who are unable to go to the polls because of illness or disability, may vote by absentee ballot. Eligible voters may vote in person prior to election day or apply to have an absentee ballot mailed to them. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot by mail or fax is Tuesday, October 28

No Campaign Signs in Right-of-way


The Department of Planning and Zoning reminds candidates for public office and their supporters that it is unlawful to place campaign signs on street lights, utility poles, or signs, or to place a sign within ten feet of the curb or edge of pavement. Property owners may erect signs for the candidates of their choice on their own property, and signs may be placed on other private property with the owner's permission.
