This Month in History

from the Vienna Newsletter archives

DECEMBER 1998 – Renovation of the Vienna Community Center is scheduled to begin in December. The major components of the renovation project are replacement and/or upgrading of all HVAC systems; ADA modifications and improvements; additional storage space; new flooring, wall tiles, ceiling tiles, doors, and paint; and exterior improvements to include re-roofing and installation of thermal pane window panels.

DECEMBER 1988 – The Town Council has adopted an ordinance to establish a register of Vienna's historic sites. These sites will be marked with a special plaque and described in a pamphlet. The purpose of the register is to encourage recognition of and interest in historic places within the town and does not constitute an official designation of any kind.

DECEMBER 1978 – The Vienna Police Department has recently acquired, through a grant, a composite drawing machine. The equipment consists of a special projector with facial features stored on six 35-mm film strips, one each for hairlines, eyes, nose, mouth, chin and ears, and accessories such as eyeglasses and beards. The film strips are superimposed and projected on a life-size screen with thousands of combinations possible.

Don't Be the Victim of a Money Scam

Money scams in the Vienna area seem to be occurring with a bit more frequency. Typically preying on the elderly population, individuals negotiate verbal contracts with homeowners and then perform bogus services in exchange for cash. Citizens are reminded to verify the validity of individuals and businesses before agreeing to have work done in or around their homes. Some recent scam examples are:

- Tree service workers offer to do a predetermined amount of work for a price. Later they come back and say they need more money for more work that "must" be done. The workers then pretend to complete the work in areas that are not easily inspected or never do the work at all, yet they demand their money.
- Water service construction workers pretend to be remorseful and come to "pay" for water they used near the victim's home. They try to pay using a bogus large denomination bill in hopes the homeowner will give them change in real currency.
- Sidewalk/driveway crack sealers negotiate a verbal agreement and then say they have completed the repair of sidewalk and driveway cracks. They then say they need much more cash than originally agreed upon because they did much more work. Upon closer inspection the "sealer" is found to be used motor oil and worthless as a repair.

Residents who suspect that service workers are operating under fraudulent pretenses or that they may be "casing" the neighborhood for burglary targets should call the Police Department's non-emergency number, 703-255-6366, immediately.

He was also a member of the Northern Virginia Community Appearance Alliance, the Northern Virginia Transportation Coordinating Council, and the Virginia Commission on Intergovernmental Relations. Planning Commission to Consider Park and Conservation Zone

At its December 10 meeting, the Vienna Planning Commission will consider a proposed ordinance to establish a Park and Conservation (PC) Zone to encourage the preservation of open space. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall, and all interested citizens are encouraged to attend.

The intent of the proposed ordinance is for land zoned PC to remain or be restored to a natural, undistrubed, and undeveloped state. Indigenous plants and trees would be preserved whenever possible, and efforts to establish indigenous plants and trees would be strongly encouraged.

The Planning Commission will make a recommendation to the Town Council concering the proposed ordinance, which will then be placed on a future Council agenda. For more information, contact the Planning and Zoning Department at 703-255-6341 or dpz@viennava.gov.

Order Mulch Beginning Dec. 1

The Public Works Department will take orders December 1-February 28 for mulch to be delivered free of charge to town residents beginning in mid-January. To place your order, call the "Mulch Line" recording, 703-255-6388, and leave your name, address, daytime phone number, type of mulch desired (wood or leaf) and the number of loads to be delivered. One load is estimated to be about the size of a VW Beetle, or 2-2.5 cubic yards. Half loads are available on request.

Please note the following important conditions:

- All mulch deliveries are based on availability of mulch.
- Mulch deliveries will be placed only in the driveway at the end closest to the house.
- Once mulch is delivered, it becomes the property of the homeowner and the Town will not remove any excess mulch ordered.

Residents may pick up mulch themselves in any amount between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (except holidays) from January 2 through March 30. The mulch is stored on Town-owned property off Beulah Road near Glyndon Park. Look for the sign, "Free Leaf Mulch & Wood Mulch."

Dog Tag Reminder

Town of Vienna licenses are required for all dogs four months of age or older and must be renewed by January 31 each year. Dog tag applications are available in the Finance Department at Town Hall, by mail, and online at www.viennava.gov/Town_Regulations/licdog.pdf. The fee is \$10 for a fertile dog and \$5 for an infertile dog. A current rabies vaccination certificate is required to obtain a license, and a spay/neuter/infertile certificate is required for a reduced price license. Call 703-255-6323 for more information.

Dogs trained and serving as guide dogs for the blind, hearing dogs for the deaf or hearing impaired, and service dogs for the mobility impaired must be licensed but are exempt from the license tax.

The Town of Vienna Police Department and the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department are continuing with the Emergency/Inclement Weather Notifications Registry. In the event of severe weather, emergency, widespread power outages or hazardous road conditions, a "check on the welfare" telephone call list will be activated and, if needed, a temporary emergency shelter will be opened and kept in operation either until the Fairfax County Disaster Operations Center can open a shelter or until the situation resolves itself. Additionally it can provide the police with additional numbers in the event they need to contact someone regarding an emergency event.

This program was designed in response to the severe ice storm that struck the town during the winter of 1998-99 and is directed at citizens who have special needs, such as the elderly, the physically challenged and individuals with severe medical conditions. The purpose of the program is twofold: first, in the event of severe weather to provide a point of contact to check on the status of each individual on the list, and second, if needed, to provide a temporary shelter location until the power has been restored, a longer-term shelter is opened or the weather and road conditions improve.

To register for this program, all that is required is that you fill out the form on the following page, check one or both choices and return it to the Vienna Police Department, 215 Center St., S., Vienna, VA 22180. RESIDENTS CURRENTLY REGISTERED MUST ALSO COMPLETE A NEW FORM TO REMAIN IN THE PROGRAM SINCE THE FILES ARE PURGED ANNUALLY.
