The Boy Scouts Partnership with Vienna Parks and Recreation

As we enter the holiday season, I would like to share with you the appreciation felt by the many Boy Scouts in Vienna who have benefited from the special partnership that has developed between the Department of Parks and Recreation maintenance staff and the various Boy Scout troops, especially those scouts who have worked at obtaining the rank of Eagle Scout. This is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program, which only about two percent of the scouting

membership are able to obtain. I have experienced wonderful this partnership firsthand as one of Assistant Scoutmaster's 152, in Troop sponsored by Vienna the Presbyterian Church, which is one of several Boy Scout troops based in the Vienna area.

Before obtaining the rank of Eagle, a Boy Scout must complete one final requirement, an Eagle Scout project. This is a project that can span a two to six-month period and must demonstrate leadership and provide service to a worthy organization other than the Boy Scouts such as a religious institution, school, or the local community. Identifying, getting approval for, and carrying out the Eagle Scout project is meant to be a real challenge and learning experience.

Our Vienna Parks and Recreation Department, under the leadership of Director Cathy Salgado, provides a significant number of opportunities for Eagle Scout projects. According to Cathy, over the past five years her park maintenance staff have enjoyed partnering and working with local Vienna Boy Scout troops to complete several dozen Eagle Scout projects throughout Town. The Town provides the materials, and the deliveries are coordinated by

PLEASE SHOVEL SNOW IF **POSSIBLE**

Although some jurisdictions in our area require residents to shovel sidewalks, the Town of Vienna has no such requirement. mainly because it would impose a hardship on elderly and disabled residents.


Vienna area teens are available to shovel snow and help with other odd jobs. The teen and the person needing the work decide on the amount to be paid for the service. Teens can sign up at the Community Center, and residents can call 703-255-6360 to be matched with a young worker.

RECYCLE MOTOR OIL, ANTI-FREEZE, BATTERIES

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, December 4, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill St., N.E. (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Department of Public Works (DPW) provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products.

DPW also offers recycling of small rechargeable batteries at the quarterly recycling events at Northside as well as at Town Hall and the Community Center. Rechargeable batteries include nickel-cadmium (NiCd), nickel-zinc (NiZn), lithium-ion (Li-ion), nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), and small sealed lead-acid (SSLA or Pb). Rechargeable batteries come in many types, including standard AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-volt, or a special design for a specific device. They may be removable or internal to a device.

Alkaline batteries (non-rechargeable) are not recyclable; however, they have been redesigned to have a very low toxicity and may now be disposed of safely in your household trash. For more information, call 703-255-

ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

A number of energy assistance programs are available in the area for qualified families, including the Fuel Assistance Program (applications accepted from October 12 through November 12, each year) and the Crisis Assistance Program (open November 1, through March 15, each year). These programs are administered by the Fairfax County's Department of Family Services and are available to Town of Vienna residents. Another source of fuel assistance this winter is the Washington Area Fuel Fund (WAFF). This program helps families who do not qualify for, or who have exhausted, government energy assistance.
