TOWN NOISE ORDINANCE UNDER REVIEW

At the April 4 Town Council meeting, Council held a public hearing on proposed amendments to the Town's noise ordinance. Town Council did not vote to adopt any changes to the ordinance at the April 4 Town Council meeting and will once again review the ordinance and receive public input on proposed changes to the Town's Noise ordinance at the May 23 Town Council meeting.

At the April 4 public hearing, Town Council considered the following proposed changes:

- delaying the start time for commercial deliveries and commercial trash pickups near residences to 8 a.m. on Sundays and six Federal holidays (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas);
- changing the permitted hours of operation and prohibiting the use of power equipment and commercial yard services on Sundays;
- prohibiting home construction contractor work AND commercial yard services on the six Federal holidays mentioned previously;
- changing the start time from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. for property owners to perform work on their property on Sundays and the above listed six Federal holidays; and
- continuing to prohibit home construction contractor work on Sundays (this is in the Town's current noise ordinance.)

The public is encouraged to attend the May 23 Town Council meeting and provide their comments on the Town's Noise ordinance. If you are unable to attend the meeting, please send your comments by e-mail to council@viennava.gov.

- Continued a public hearing to March 7 on proposed amendments to the Town Code relating to noise.
- Renewed the July 4th Fireworks display contract with Pyrotecnico in an amount not to exceed \$14,500.
- Approved the purchase of a trailermounted chipper from Lawrence Equipment in the amount of \$24,449.
- Continued a notice of appeal of a denial of solicitor's license to February 28.
- Approved a one-time special pickup for storm damage from February 7 to March 1, for Vienna residents.
- Disallowed all bids received for leak detection equipment due to confusion regarding the equipment specification. Further moved to allow re-issuing the IFB with clearer specifications.
- Approved the purchase of an additional 1,100 tons of road deicing salt with International Salt Company for an estimated cost of \$96,101.

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN!

Nutrients in stormwater runoff have been identified as the number one pollutant and threat to the health of the ecosystems of the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds. Much of this pollution is the result of the activities of watershed residents who are unaware of the link between their daily behavior and the water quality downstream.

Stormwater runoff pollution comes from many sources, including parking lots, lawns, driveways, golf courses and roads. Rainwater that runs off these surfaces picks up contaminants like motor oil, fertilizer, pesticides and bacteria from pet waste. This stormwater runoff flows into storm drains and then into local streams

and the Potomac River, the sources of drinking water for many residents in the Washington, D.C., area. The runoff ultimately contributes to the pollution affecting the Chesapeake Bay.

What can you do to prevent water pollution? Follow these simple tips:

- Dispose of used motor oil and household hazardous waste (paint, household cleaners, etc.) properly, rather than pouring it on the driveway or into the storm drain;
- Avoid excess fertilizer or pesticide use, especially before rain is predicted;
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, or in a location where

- the soapy water will not run into the storm drain;
- Sweep up grass clippings and other yard waste instead of washing them down the driveway or into the gutter; and
- Always pick up pet waste from your yard, sidewalk, or park area.



A Look at the Proposed Budget For Fiscal Year 2011-2012

MESSAGE FROM THE TOWN MANAGER

The ability of the Town of Vienna to weather economic downturns is a result of our history of preparing realistic revenue projections and continually monitoring expenditures throughout the year. Another factor is that as a Town, we are not responsible for schools or social services, two areas where state cutbacks have hurt counties and independent cities. The Town has also maintained a history of conservative spending even during economic growth, and thus our budgets level the peaks and valleys that occur in the national and regional economies.

The economy in Vienna has improved significantly when compared to the last several years both in terms of assessed valuation and the activity taking place with the construction and remodeling of homes and commercial buildings. We will continue to face reductions in those revenues received from the Commonwealth of Virginia but locally generated revenues have held firm and in some cases are increasing.

For 2011 the average existing residential assessments increased by 4.27% over 2010 while the average commercial assessment increased by 1.99%. The Town did experience new construction and improvements to existing properties of just over \$66 million during 2010 both in residential and commercial categories. As of January 1, 2011, the percentage ratio of residential to commercial value in Town is 79/21 versus a 78/22 ratio in 2010. While the change is slight it does show that commercial assessments are not keeping pace with the increase in residential assessments.

As in previous years, we have continued our practice of conservative revenue forecasting. The FY 2011/12 proposed budget is based on a real estate tax rate of 24.35 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation which represents a decrease of .13 cents from the FY 2010/11 rate but an effective tax rate increase as defined by law.

Expenditures for the Water & Sewer Fund total \$6,486,947, an increase of \$34,177 or .53%. The proposed Water & Sewer Fund budget for FY 2011/12 is \$62,118 less than the amount budgeted for water and sewer expenses in FY 2008/09. The Director of Finance has continued to apportion costs for each utility to properly reflect the true operating costs so that we may accurately determine and recommend the appropriate rate structure for the coming year. Based on our projections for revenue and the classification of expenses we have determined that we can recommend a rate decrease of 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for water consumption for all customers beginning with bills rendered after July 1, 2011. Conversely, it is necessary to recommend a rate increase of 50 cents per 1,000 gallons for sewer use effective July 1 of this year. Overall the change in the rate structure is estimated to increase the average residential bill by \$26.84 per year.

I invite you to read the entire budget message and proposed budget. The budget is available for public review at Town Hall and Patrick Henry Library, and online at www.viennava.gov. We also have a tax calculator widget on the website so that citizens can compute their actual Town taxes for 2011-2012 versus the 2010-2011 rate. Citizens are also encouraged to attend the public hearing on the budget, scheduled for the Town Council meeting on Monday, May 9, beginning at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.



BUDGET PREPARATION AND ADOPTION

The Code of the Town of Vienna requires that by July 1 of each year, the Vienna Town Council adopt by ordinance a budget establishing the tax rate for the incoming year. Estimated revenues must be equivalent to estimated expenditures. It is mandated in the Code that the fiscal year begin on July 1 and end on June 30.

At least one public hearing must be held on the budget prior to its adoption. Seven days prior to this hearing, the Town Clerk must publish a notice of Council's intention to hold such an event. The budget cannot be adopted at the same meeting at which the public hearing is held. Two notices, again at least seven days apart, must then be published in a paper of general circulation announcing Council's intention to adopt the budget. Following this advertisement, Council may then adopt the budget. After this action is taken, the Town Clerk publishes the final notice of adoption.

The Town of Vienna's budget process begins in January of each year when Council presents to the staff its budget priorities for the upcoming year. Citizens who have suggestions about what items should be given priority for funding are encouraged to express their views in writing to the Town Manager. In addition, non-profit Vienna organizations may apply for donations of Town funds.

The Town Manager then prepares and submits to the Town Council his proposed budget, and copies are made available to the public. This year, budget work sessions were scheduled for April 9, 11 and 19. The public hearing on the proposed budget will be held at the Town Council meeting on May 9, which begins at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall. If Council considers it necessary, a final budget work session to discuss comments made at the public hearing will be held on May 16. A separate hearing on the proposed tax rate will be held on June 6. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for the June 20 Council meeting.

SEWER BACKUPS ARE EXPENSIVE; **BACKUP INSURANCE IS NOT!**

The Town of Vienna makes every attempt to prevent sewer backups from occurring. Sewer lines are specially designed to reduce accumulation and stoppages. In addition, a maintenance crew is devoted to inspecting and cleaning sewer lines throughout the Town on a regular basis. Degreasing chemicals are also injected into lines in areas that are prone to stoppages, such as those near restaurants and apartments. Even with this rigorous maintenance schedule; however, backups can still occur.

All insurance companies writing homeowner policies in Virginia Meet the Town offer special coverage for damage resulting from backups of drains and sewers, and this additional protection is available at very reasonable rates. For information on obtaining sewer backup coverage, contact your insurance company. The Town's insurance carrier rarely approves claims resulting from sewer backups unless negligence in maintaining the system can be shown. Therefore, residents are encouraged to protect their property by obtaining sewer backup insurance.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION WITH APES

Spring is a time of nature's renewal, and it inspires us to protect the environment. James Madison High School offers an AP Environmental Science (APES) course, which facilitates environmental education and is very popular among high school seniors. THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

May 2001: The water tank at the Town's Nutley Street property yard has been covered while painting and repairs are under way. The project, which is expected to be finished in mid-June, will not affect water quality or pressure. The project includes repair of the tank's walkway and ladder, which have deteriorated with age and exposure to the weather, and repainting all surfaces inside and outside the tank to prevent corrosion.

May 1991: Vienna's first auxiliary police officers have been sworn in. They are Dalip K. Gupta, Walter Elliott, T.R. Cook, John F. Connifey, and Robert F. Bodroghy. Auxiliary officers assist regular duty officers in patrol, traffic control, record processing and other assignments. After completing in excess of 125 hours of intensive training in police procedures, they are required to work a minimum of 24 hours per month.

May 1981: "Moorefield Day," sponsored by Historic Vienna, Inc., and the Town of Vienna, will be held on Saturday, May 2. The purpose of Moorefield Day is to acquaint citizens with the historic significance of Moorefield, the oldest house still standing in Vienna, and to encourage support for efforts to restore it. The day's activities will include displays and information about Moorefield and about Jeremiah Moore, historic fighter for religious freedom in Virginia, who built the house around 1790.

May 1971: Do you have Town water and sewer? If not, this is the time to think about getting them. Costs go up September 1. The front footage will double from \$2.50 to \$5 per running foot. In addition, after that date the Town will no longer make the connection at the street. Homeowners will be required to obtain a plumber to do this work.

STREET SWEEPING ENDS IN MAY

Spring street sweeping wraps up this month. The town has been divided into eight sections for cleaning, and residents are requested not to park on the street during the scheduled time for their section to allow the street sweeper to do a thorough job. As the time for each section approaches, signs are placed on streets as a reminder, and residents can also call 703-255-6380 for information.
