On September 26, the Vienna Town Council adopted an ordinance that requires anyone age 14 and under riding a bicycle, electric personal assisted mobility device, toy vehicle or electric-power assisted bicycle, to wear a helmet. COMMENT FROM THE COUNCIL TABLE

Community Preparedness Begins with Us All

November is a time for Thanksgiving. 1. Create a "Go-Bag" of essential The Town of Vienna can be thankful that we fared quite well in a year filled with nature's wrath of unprecedented and unexpected storms, floods, events. i.e. earthquakes, heat waves and heavy snows. Special thanks to our First Responders and Town Staff, who were put into sudden service during these recent events to maintain a safe and healthy environment, so that we all can continue having the benefit of living and working without undue interruption.

While attending the Virginia Conference Municipal League in Richmond last month, I was fortunate to attend informative sessions that addressed the issue of continuity of operations and disaster planning. There were some important lessons that I would like to share with you.

First, each and every one of us play an important initial link in our community's readiness, affecting how quickly we can emerge from the subsequent recovery. Whether a resident or businessperson in the Town, one of our most basic civic duties is individual responsibility.

Because we do not know if future disasters will be small or large, natural or man-made, it is essential for us to prepare now, so first responders can assist others who are unable to help themselves. Start at home or work as an active participant by practicing some simple strategies. I hope when asked, we can all answer the call: "Yes, we are ready."

- items for your home, business and/or vehicle. Store it in a place that is easily accessible, waterproof. portable and Organize items you might important need including documents, cash (coins and bills), first aid items, a list of allergies and vital medications with dosages for each person, essential gear (including LED batteries, flashlights, radio. whistle and phone that does not rely on electricity), water and imperishable food items.
- 2. Establish (and practice annually) a family or business emergency plan. Remember to include those with unique/ specific needs, including the elderly, handicapped, children and pets, those with mobility issues, medications, etc. Also, familiarize vourself with procedures while at other locations, such as government buildings, businesses, schools, and community groups, and other areas that might directly impact you (or could be impacted by you) in the event of an emergency.
- shelter-in-place Identify a location for various emergency scenarios, in case you and your family or business cannot immediately return to your main location.



- 4. Create communication plan, including out of town secondary numbers. Remember, utility services may be temporarily interrupted or overloaded in our area. Text messaging proves to be one of the most efficient ways to communicate as it utilizes a smaller bandwidth and the message continues indefinitely to be sent until received.
- 5. Helpyourselfandthecommunity by getting involved throughout the vear. Educate yourself in emergency preparedness strategies, as well as First Aid and CPR. Donate time or resources to organizations that support our community's readiness plan.
- 6. Subscribe to our Town of Community Alert Vienna and Emergency Notification Service (at www.viennava.gov under "Vienna Community Alerts" icon), so you and your significant others can be quickly informed by phone, SMS text or e-mail with essential news and instructions.

VEHICLE LICENSE FEE: TAX RELIEF FOR THE ELDERLY AND DISABLED

If you are an elderly or disabled person or a disabled veteran and have been approved for tax relief by Fairfax County for 2011, you are entitled to ONE vehicle exemption from the Town's vehicle license fee. The Town will automatically exempt one vehicle and send a bill for each of the remaining vehicles you own. You will not receive a bill for the exempt vehicle.

VEHICLE LICENSE FEE DUE NOVEMBER 30

Town of Vienna 2011 Vehicle License Fees are due on November 30 for vehicles garaged in town as of January 1, 2011. The fee is \$33 for vehicles and \$18 per motorcycle and bills will be mailed out on November 1. Payments postmarked after November 30 will incur a \$25 late fee and further collection costs may apply.

If you have a delinquent balance for 2010, it will be billed separately on November 1, 2011.

Vienna residents are responsible for paying the Vehicle License Fee to the Town and Personal Property Tax to Fairfax County. THEFT PREVENTION TIPS: AUTOMOBILE LARCENIES

The Vienna Police Department has noticed a resurgence of larcenies from vehicles in recent months. The following prevention tips are provided for your safety.

#1 Prevention Tip: Lock your doors and remove all valuables from an unattended vehicle.

- Remove all traces of a laptop or GPS unit including cable, suction cup and even suction cup residue.
- Make sure windows are rolled up all the way.
- Take all valuables and extra ignition keys inside with you.
- Document the serial numbers of electronics in case they are stolen. Keep the document in your house.
- Report any unusual foot traffic or behaviors in your neighborhood by calling 9-1-1.
- Quickly report all unusual sounds which occur at unusual times by calling 9-1-1.
- If you see someone or something unusual, and it is safe, note tag number, vehicle type, suspect description, etc. and give it to the police.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

November 2001: The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) will hold a public hearing on the proposed reconstruction of Branch Road, SE, on Wed., Nov. 28, from 7 to 9 p.m. The project, scheduled to begin in 2003, would entail rebuilding and asphalt overlay along the entire length of the street (Maple Ave. to Valley Dr.) at its current width plus new curb, gutter, sidewalk and driveway entrances. The Town has budgeted \$32,000 in Capital Improvement Program bond funds for the required 2% local match of state funding.

November 1991: At its November 4 meeting, the Town Council awarded the contract for the new police station to 722 Construction Corp. of Sterling at a price of \$1,169,722, to come from Capital Improvements Program bond funds. The award is contingent on the construction contract language concerning the testing and warranty of the firing range.

November 1981: A public hearing is set for November 23 on an application to rezone the property behind the Marco Polo Restaurant from residential to C-1A commercial. The applicant has stated his intention is to develop a professional office building on the site.

November 1971: The Vienna Comprehensive Plan, which is a complete revision and updating of the Vienna Master Plan, is nearing completion. The Comprehensive Plan is an official statement of long-range goals, policies and intentions of the community with regard to its future growth and development and determines what The layout depicts the Western North a community has, what it wants and how to get what it wants. Vienna's primary goal is to control its present and future character and identity as a predominantly single-family residential community, with a strong and expanding economic foundation, and as a cooperating jurisdiction of the Northern Virginia region. It is toward this attainment of this goal that efforts have been underway to prepare the Comprehensive Plan.
