TEMPORARY CHLORINE TASTE IN WATER

Beginning April 2 through July 2 you may notice a slight chlorine taste and odor in your drinking water as Vienna's drinking water supplier will temporarily switch the disinfectant it uses in the distribution system from chloramines to free chlorine. This temporary change is performed annually and is part of a regular process used to keep water mains clean and free from potentially harmful bacteria. As always, the Department of Public Works will continue to monitor the drinking water to ensure that it meets all federal and state drinking water standards.

If you are sensitive to the taste of chlorine, you may be able to reduce the taste by refrigerating a pitcher of drinking water overnight. If you have questions, please contact Acting Water and Sewer Superintendent Donald Kahn at 703-255-8610 or dkahn@viennava.gov.

TOWN COUNCIL ELECTION MAY 1

Vienna's annual Town election will be held on Tuesday, May 1. All voting will take place at the Vienna Community Center from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

This year, Vienna voters will elect Mayor and three Town Council members who will begin new two-year terms July 1.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE: APRIL 9

Monday, April 9, is the last day to register to vote in the May 1 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day and a U.S. citizen. You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county and at www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

If you are already a registered voter, no additional registration is required for the Town election; however, you should check your voter registration card to be sure your name and address are current.

ABSENTEE VOTING

If you will be out of town on election day or are unable to go to the polls because of illness or disability, you may vote by absentee ballot in person or by mail. In-person absentee voting will be conducted at the Fairfax County Government Center from March 16 through April 28, on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Saturday, April 28, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. April 28 is the last day to vote absentee in person.

The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot by mail is April 24, at 5 p.m. Ballots must be received in the Office of Elections by 7 p.m. on election day in order to be counted.

MESSAGE FROM THE TOWN MANAGER

The Town of Vienna's Proposed Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Operating Budget has been presented to the Town Council. The proposed budget attempts to keep tax payers' cost down while maximizing the Town government's operational efficiencies with regard to service delivery to the Town's citizens and customers. The largest impact to the Town's budget is in the Water and Sewer Fund. Overall, the Town's fiscal position is strong.

For 2012, the average existing residential assessments increased by .29% over 2011 while the average commercial assessment increased by 3.56%. The Town did experience new construction and improvements to existing properties of almost \$56 million during 2011 in both residential and commercial categories. As of January 1, 2012, the percentage ratio of residential to commercial value in Town is 78/22 versus a 79/21 ratio in 2011. While the change is slight it does show that commercial assessments are not keeping pace with the increase in residential assessments.

As in previous years, we have continued our practice of conservative revenue forecasting. The FY 2012-13 proposed budget is based on a real estate tax rate of 24.21 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation which represents no change from the FY 2011-12 rate and no effective tax rate increase as defined by law.

Expenditures for the Water and Sewer Fund total \$7,497,212, an increase of \$1,010,265 or 13.5 percent. Virtually all of this increase is due to increases in water purchase costs and in sewer treatment costs. The Director of Finance has continued to apportion costs for each utility to properly reflect the true operating costs so that we may accurately determine and recommend the appropriate rate structure for the coming year. Based on our projections for revenues and expenditures, we have determined that we must recommend a rate increase of \$0.91 cents per 1,000 gallons for water consumption and \$0.93 cents per 1,000 gallons for sewer use, effective July 1 of this year. Overall, the change in the rate structure is estimated to increase the average residential bill by \$139.84 per year, or \$0.38 per day.

I invite you to read the entire budget message and proposed budget. The budget is available for public review at Town Hall, the Patrick Henry Library and online at www.viennava.gov. We also have a tax calculator widget on the website so that citizens can compute their actual Town taxes for 2012-2013 versus the 2011-2012 rate. Citizens are also encouraged to attend a public hearing on the budget, scheduled for the Town Council meeting on Monday, April 2, beginning at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall. Also, a public hearing on the proposed tax rate and water and sewer rates is scheduled for Monday, April 16.



BUDGET PREPARATION AND ADOPTION

The Code of the Town of Vienna requires that by July 1 of each year, the Vienna Town Council adopt by ordinance a budget establishing the tax rate for the incoming year. Estimated revenues must be equivalent to estimated expenditures. It is mandated in the Code that the fiscal year begin on July 1 and end on June 30.

At least one public hearing must be held on the budget prior to its adoption. Seven days prior to this hearing, the Town Clerk must publish a notice of Council's intention to hold such an event. The budget cannot be adopted at the same meeting at which the public hearing is held. Two notices, again at least seven days apart, must then be published in a paper of general circulation announcing Council's intention to adopt the budget. Following this advertisement, Council may then adopt the budget. After this action is taken, the Town Clerk publishes the final notice of adoption.

The Town of Vienna's budget process begins in January of each year when Council presents to the staff its budget priorities for the upcoming year. Citizens who have suggestions about what items should be given priority for funding are encouraged to express their views in writing to the Town Manager. In addition, non-profit Vienna organizations may apply for donations of Town funds.

The Town Manager then prepares and submits to the Town Council his proposed budget, and copies are made available to the public. This year, budget work sessions were scheduled for March 10 and 12. The public hearing on the proposed budget will be held at the Town Council meeting on April 2, which begins at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall. If Council considers it necessary, a final budget work session to discuss comments made at the public hearing will be held on April 23, at 7:30 p.m. A separate hearing on the proposed tax rate and water and sewer rates will be held on April 16. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for the May 7 Council meeting.

SEEKING CANDIDATES FOR AUXILIARY POLICE OFFICERS

The Town of Vienna Police Department is seeking interested citizens for the volunteer Auxiliary Police Officer Program. Potential candidates must be U.S. citizens, over the age of 21, not have a criminal record or history of drug use, be physically and mentally able to complete the training program and able to become certified in Virginia as an auxiliary police officer.

Typical duties include traffic direction at special events, office duties, crime prevention tasks, fingerprinting activities, traffic surveys, security inspections for businesses, courtroom assistance and more. Training is scheduled to begin in January 2013 and is held on weekends and evenings for approximately six months.

TAX RELIEF FORMS DUE APRIL 1

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old or older, or permanently and totally disabled. Total household income and total combined assets requirements must be met, and both Town and County applications must be filed.

Applications for 2012 for all programs are due April 1. This date may be extended to December 31 of next year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 1. A REVIEW OF RECYCLING AROUND THE TOWN

Vienna residents can boast of having one of the highest recycling rates in Virginia; however, there is always room for improvement. Increasing the recycling rate is a triple win for the Town. First, the Town makes money from selling recyclable materials which provides a revenue stream. Second, the Town saves money by recycling as transportation costs (gas and wear and tear on the trash vehicles) to the recycling plant (in Merrifield) are lower than the transportation costs to the Fairfax County Landfill (I-66 Transfer Station). Third, recycling is an environmentally friendly, socially responsible act.

Listed below are a few items that can be easily recycled locally. To add other items to the list, please email csalgado@viennava.gov. The Community Enhancement Commission will maintain a list for periodic publication.

- 1. <u>Town of Vienna Curbside Recycling</u>: Did you know that you no longer need to separate recyclables? All recyclable items and newspapers can now be placed together in the same container for recycling. A full list of recyclable items is available on the Town website.
- 2. <u>Batteries:</u> All non-alkaline batteries including rechargeable batteries for power tools, laptops and cell phones are collected at Radio Shack and Home Depot. Household alkaline batteries are collected at the Whole Foods Customer Service Desk.
- 3. <u>Light Bulbs:</u> Compact fluorescent bulbs and fluorescent tubes are collected at most Home Depot stores.
- 4. <u>Eyeglasses</u>: Eyeglasses are collected at the Patrick Henry Library and at the Vienna Community Center and redistributed by Lions Recycle for Sight program.
- 5. <u>Shoes:</u> Gently used shoes are collected at the Austin's Big and Tall store in Oakton and The New Balance store at Tysons Corner Mall. Shoes are redistributed for re-use by Soles4Souls. For more information visit www.soles4souls.org.
- 6. <u>Keys and Cleats:</u> Cleats are collected in a box located in the lobby of the Vienna Community Center. All are welcome to "take some cleats and/or leave some cleats". Metal keys are also collected in the lobby of the Vienna Community Center.
- 7. <u>Cork:</u> Winebottle corks are collected at Whole Foods.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

April 2002: Baring unforeseen delays, Phase II of the Maple Avenue Enhancement Project should be underway the first week of May. The project area, from Park Street to East Street, will include brick sidewalks on each side of Maple Avenue, new curb and gutter, brick crosswalks at all intersections, new asphalt pavement surface, increased turning radii at intersections and driveway entrances, improved street lighting with ornamental poles and fixtures, elimination of utility poles on the north side of Maple Avenue, planter areas for shrubbery and trees, trash receptacles, benches and new bus shelters.

April 1992: During its first six months of use, Vienna's tub grinder machine has saved the Town over \$12,000 in landfill fees while providing residents with tons of free leaf and wood mulch.

April 1982: The Vienna Bikeway Plan is being updated as part of a review of the Town's Comprehensive Plan. The bikeway map is under revision to place primary emphasis on recreational, rather than commuter, bicycling. Using the W&OD Trail as the spine of the system, the proposed map will blend bike paths (in stream valleys and parks) and bus routes (on streets) into an integrated town-wide system.

April 1972: The Vienna Policeman's Association will sponsor a oneday circus on April 19 on the playing fields between Vienna Elementary School and the Community Center. The Royal Wild West Circus will feature elephants and other wild animals.
