## TOWN COUNCIL ACTIONS

The following items are extracts of recent Town Council actions and are not official meeting minutes.

#### August 20, 2012

- Authorized \$12,300 for annual maintenance and support for Novus Agenda Software.
- Held a public hearing on a proposed ordinance to amend the height requirements of municipal parking structures in the Church Street district. Approved 6-1 (Polychrones voting Nay) to adopt the "more complex version."
- Approved a resolution authorizing the investment of 2012 bond proceeds with Virginia State Non-Arbitrage Program (SNAP).
- Approved TSC-recommended traffic calming measures at the intersection of Park Street SE and Locust Street SE.
- Awarded a survey and design contract to Rinker Design Associates for sidewalk improvements on Harmony Drive SE and Lullaby Lane SE for an estimated cost of \$44,679. (Approved 6 -1, Springsteen voting Nay.)

- All votes are unanimous unless noted otherwise. Approved a site plan revision for the installation of an underground fuel tank for Navy Federal Credit Union.
- Awarded a contract to Wiley Wilson to prepare a property survey and evaluate the site of the proposed municipal parking garage for an amount not to exceed \$20,000.
- Approved a 3% rate increase for GIS services provided by JMT Technology Group.
- Approved the continued use of RAM Productions of Burke, VA for cable TV consulting services at a cost of \$9,400.
- Approved the purchase of a replacement refuse truck through the Vehicle Replacement Program at an estimated cost of \$195,800.
- Approved additional funding to the Virginia Department of Health in the amount of \$8,580.60 for increased fees.

#### Elections

In the 2008 presidential election, 64% of the voting-age citizens voted. In the 2009 Town Council elections, roughly 15% of the Town residents voted. Franklin D. Roosevelt said, "Nobody will ever deprive the American people of the right to vote except the American people themselves and the only way they could do this is by not voting". Election Day is approaching. On November 6, voters throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia and the United States will be voting to determine who will represent us for the upcoming term. Virginia will see a great deal of the presidential candidates because it is considered a swing state. The senatorial candidates are also traveling the state to make their case for filling Senator Webb's vacated seat.

Are you registered to vote? If you are a United States citizen, at least 18 years of age by November 6th, and a resident of Virginia, you can register to vote in Virginia. Virginia Voter Registration Applications are available online at <u>www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections</u> or pick one up at any Fairfax County library or government center. Your registration form must be postmarked by October 15th to vote on November 6th. Absentee voting may also be available for citizens who can not vote on November 6th. You can find out details about absentee voting at <u>www.</u> <u>fairfaxcounty.gov/elections/absentee.</u> <u>htm.</u> I am particularly excited about the upcoming election because I have a daughter who will be voting for the first time in November.

My daughter, as well as some citizens, have asked me why the Town of Vienna elections are not held in November. I used to wonder this myself, especially because I believe turnout would be much higher at that time of year. Currently, the Town of Vienna holds its election on the first Tuesday in May. A few years ago, the Town Council did consider changing the election to November but decided against it for a few reasons. The Mayor and Town Council members run as independents and on their own merits. They are not partisan and do not run with a particular political party. The November elections are extremely partisan and both political parties spend a great deal of money supporting candidates and their campaigns. May elections allow the Mayor and Town



Council candidates to receive some media coverage and remain non-partisan.

I think it is important to encourage residents of the Town to vote in national and local elections. The Town will continue to advertise the May elections and try new ways of reaching residents. I feel very lucky to have the ability to vote and exercise that privilege whenever there is an opportunity. Please take the time this November (and May) to have your voice heard and vote. See you at the polls!

#### SUPPORT LOCAL GARDENS

I was jogging through Nottoway Park last week and noticed the beautiful community garden plots loaded with ripe tomatoes, peppers, melons and other goodies. Local gardens and backyard gardening have been getting a lot of press lately and for good reasons. Growing your own fruits and vegetables or buying from local farmers conserves energy due to reduced transportation costs, supports the local economy, saves you money and provides fresh, tastier, healthier food.

There are many opportunities to support local gardens in Vienna. Volunteer at one of the local school gardens. The Community Enhancement Commission has partnered with Vienna Elementary School and installed an educational garden. Freedom Hill Elementary School and Thoreau Middle School have also committed to vegetable gardens. Shop at the Saturday Farmer's Market and support the local farmers or simply start your own backyard garden. I've noticed many Town residents have creatively incorporated vegetable gardening into

their landscape with planters on their decks, vegetables amongst their flower beds, or backyards plots sometimes comprising the entire yard! Our growing season stretches from March to December. Fall is a perfect time to plant cool weather crops such as lettuce, spinach, kale, collard greens and garlic to name a few. ## TIPS ON HALLOWEEN PARADE <u>"PLACEHOLDERS"</u>

As the 66th Annual Vienna Halloween Parade approaches we ask for the safety of all, that spectators follow a few common sense rules:

- Do not place any items on Maple Avenue prior to noon on the day of the parade.
- When placing items, do not put them in bus shelters as they need to be clear for bus users during the day. Items placed in bus shelters prior to 5 pm on the day of the event may be moved for the safety of bus users.
- Keep items off the sidewalks and benches so that pedestrians can walk and use the benches without having to move or walk over items.
- Secure all items to ensure that weather conditions do not cause them to blow into the roadway or sidewalks.

## VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Monday, October 15, is the last day to register to vote in the November 6 general election. Registration applications are available at various locations around Fairfax County, including the Town Clerk's Office in Town Hall, and may also be downloaded from <u>www.fairfaxcounty.gov</u>.

Registered voters who will be away from Fairfax County on Election Day, or who are unable to go to the polls because of illness or disability, may vote by absentee ballot. You may vote in person prior to Election Day or apply to have an absentee ballot mailed to you. November 3 is the last day to vote absentee in-person.

## PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX DUE

Town of Vienna residents pay Fairfax County personal property tax on motor vehicles, due every year on October 5. The current tax rate is \$4.57 per \$100 of assessed value. New residents or those registering a vehicle for the first time must file a personal property vehicle registration form within 60 days of purchase or entry into the County.

Fairfax County provides car tax relief to citizens who are either 65 years of age or older, or permanently and totally disabled, and meet income and asset eligibility requirements. For more information, visit <u>www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dta</u> or call (703) 222-8234.

If you live in the Town of Vienna you will pay personal property tax to Fairfax County and Vehicle License fee (due November 30) to the Town. If your personal property tax bill from Fairfax County has a Fairfax County Vehicle License fee charge you may not owe it. ## FIREPLACE SAFETY - CAN YOUR ASHES

As the fall weather sets in, please be • reminded of these fireplace safety tips: •

- Have your chimney inspected annually, and cleaned as necessary.
- When cleaning the fireplace, store ashes in a noncombustible container with a tight fitting lid and place the container away from the house.
  **Do not** place ash containers on decks, porches or in garages.
- Dispose of ashes in a metal container.
- Never leave a fireplace fire unattended.
- Make sure the fire is completely out before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Allow ashes to cool before disposing in a metal container. (Sometimes it takes four days for ashes to cool down.)
- Call 911 immediately when a fire occurs. Residents should

not attempt to extinguish the fire themselves.

• Teach all family members to be safe with ashes from your fireplace or wood-burning stove.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR LANDLORDS AND RENTERS REGARDING WATER AND SEWER SERVICE

Effective October 1, 2012, in accordance with changes to the Code of Virginia, sections 15.2-2119 and 15.2-5139, Landlords must provide advance written authorization for a tenant to receive water and sewer services from the Town of Vienna. The Landlord Authorization Form is available on our website at <u>www.viennava.gov</u> under Departments, Finance, Water and Sewer Services, Starting a New Service.

Tenants must provide a signed copy of the Landlord Authorization Form,

a Customer Agreement form and pay a lien offset payment of \$225. This payment may be made by check or money order and mailed to the attention of Water and Sewer Customer Service, 127 Center Street S, Vienna, VA 22180, or paid by cash, credit or debit in person at Town Hall.

After the account is established, regular quarterly bills may be paid by any method accepted by the Town (see our website "I want to make a payment" for more details.)

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN!

Nutrients in stormwater runoff have been identified as the number one pollutant and threat to the health of the ecosystems of the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds. Much of this pollution is the result of the activities of watershed residents who are unaware of the link between their daily behavior and the water quality downstream.

Stormwater runoff pollution comes from many sources, including parking lots, lawns, driveways, golf courses and roads. Rainwater that runs off these surfaces picks up contaminants like motor oil, fertilizer, pesticides and bacteria from pet waste. This stormwater runoff flows into storm drains and then into local streams and the Potomac River, the sources of drinking water for many residents in the Washington, D.C. area. The runoff ultimately contributes to the pollution affecting the Chesapeake Bay.

What can you do to prevent water pollution? Follow these simple tips:

- Dispose of used motor oil and household hazardous waste (paint, household cleaners, etc.) properly, rather than pouring it on the driveway or into the storm drain;
- Avoid excess fertilizer or pesticide use, especially before rain is predicted;
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, or in a location where the soapy water will not run into the storm drain;
- Sweep up grass clippings and other yard waste instead of washing them down the driveway or into the gutter; and
- Always pick up pet waste from your yard, sidewalk or park area.

Report storm drain dumping. During business hours, call the Department of Public Works at (703) 255-6380. After hours, call the Police Department's non-emergency number at (703) 255-6366.

How It Works: No matter where you live in Town, this fall you will be able to rake your leaves to the curb at at any point between October 22 and December 31. As leaves begin to fall and accumulate, Town crews will begin collecting leaves starting in north Vienna. Once the northern part of Town is completed, crews will begin collections in south Vienna. In total, three leaf collections will be performed throughout town from October 2012 through January 2013, weather permitting. As in previous years, collection crews will only pass your house once during each of the three collections.

**Rake Your Leaves By Dec. 31:** It is important that your leaves are raked to the curb by December 31 or you may miss the final collection pass. If you miss the final pass, you will be asked to bag your leaves in clear plastic bags so that they can be collected on your regular weekly collection day.

## **VEHICLE LICENSE FEE DUE NOVEMBER 30**

Town of Vienna 2012 Vehicle License Fees are due on November 30 for vehicles garaged in town as of July 1, 2012. The fee is \$33 for vehicles and \$18 per motorcycle and bills will be mailed out on November 1. Payments postmarked after November 30 will incur a \$25 late fee and further collection costs may apply.

If you have a delinquent balance for 2011, it will be billed separately on November 1, 2012.

In addition, Vienna residents are responsible for paying Personal Property Tax to Fairfax County. If you have any questions, please contact the Vehicle License hotline at (703) 255-5375 or send an e-mail to vehicle@viennava.gov. Questions for Fairfax County can be directed to (703) 222-8234.

#### **DIRECT BILL PAYMENT** Continued from Cover

How it works: Once you sign up for Direct Bill Payment, you will still receive a yellow postcard bill in the mail with this notice: \*\*Do Not Pay. Direct payment will be made on the first business day after (due date.)\*\* Your payment will automatically be deducted from the bank account you have specified on the due date for your bill. For example, your bill for the quarter ending September 30, 2012 will be calculated and mailed to you during the first week of October 2012 and is due October 31, 2012. The payment will be deducted from your bank account on November 1, 2012.

How to sign up: Complete and print the form on our web site at www.viennava.gov, "I want to Sign up for a Direct Payment" and mail it to Water and Sewer Customer Service, Town of Vienna, 127 Center Street, South, Vienna, VA 22180. It can also be dropped off at our office between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday, placed in the box on the front door of Town Hall any time, or attached to an email sent to water@viennava. gov.

Once signed up, cancellation must be made in writing 15 days in advance of the bill date. Service will be cancelled for customers once a payment is denied for insufficient funds.

## THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

**October 2002:** Town Council meeting minutes are now online at <u>www.</u> <u>ci.vienna.va.us.</u> To read or download the minutes, click on "Departments," then click on "Town Clerk" then scroll down and click on "Minutes." The minutes will be placed online the Tuesday morning after Council approves them and will remain for a month.

**October 1992:** The Town Council has adopted an ordinance requiring dog owners to clean up after their pets. First-time offenders of the new "pooper scooper" law will be given a warning; subsequent violations may result in a fine up to \$250.

**October 1982:** The original Vienna library, built in 1897 and now located on the grounds of the Freeman House, will be formally reopened October 3. The one-room library was originally located on Library Lane, a now-abandoned street in southwest Vienna, and was moved to the corner of Maple Avenue and Center Street around 1913. It was relocated, with its original stock of books, to the Freeman House on Church Street prior to the construction of Patrick Henry Library in 1971.

**October 1972:** A recycling questionnaire in last month's newsletter elicited more replies than any other questionnaire we have distributed. The vast majority were enthusiastically in favor of all kinds of recycling. At present, the Town is working out the logistics of the program, and we will report as soon as it can proceed.
