- Held a public hearing to consider a proposal to vacate a portion of publicly owned unimproved alley behind the property at 112 Ayr Hill Avenue NW and directed the Town Manager to appoint three viewers to report any issues that would arise should the property be vacated.
- Approved an increase in the contract with RDA for additional work on Cottage Street SW for an estimated amount of \$18,041.
- Approved an increase in contracts with Ferguson Waterworks by \$18,000 due to an increase in needed materials to repair water main breaks.
- Approved an increase in a contract with Espina Paving, Inc. for \$13,000 due to repairs required from water main breaks.
- Approved an increase in the Town Hall HVAC Design contract with Wiley|Wilson for \$25,473 for

- additional design work. (Approved 5-2, DiRocco and Sienicki voting
- Approved a waiver of fees for the American Cancer Society's CPS Study on September 28, and granted permission for the overnight use of the Town Green for a Relay for Life event on June 1.
- Approved emergency funding in the amount of \$22,000 for HVAC controllers in the Vienna Community Center.
- Approved the additional position of Fiscal Agent in the Finance Department, which will be reimbursed by the Northern Virginia Regional Gang Task Force. (Approved 4-3, Cole, DiRocco and Sienicki voting Nay.)
- Approved supplemental appropriations in the amount of \$106,861 to the General Fund expenditure accounts.
- Approved a site plan revision and master plan to authorize the

- construction of three new cooling towers at 801 Follin Lane SE.
- Approved site plan modifications to permit construction of a new parking area for Cunningham Park Elementary School. (Approved 6-1, Polychrones voting Nay.)

TAX RELIEF FOR SENIOR & DISABLED, LOW-INCOME HOMEOWNERS

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old and over, or permanently and totally disabled. To qualify, the following requirements must be met:

• Total household income of \$72,000 or less. This amount excludes \$6,500 of income of relatives, other than the spouse, who reside in the household. Also excluded is \$7,500 of any income received by the disabled homeowner. One-hundred percent tax relief is given for total combined income of \$52,000 or less, 50% tax relief

between \$52,001 and \$62,000 and 25% tax relief between \$62,001 and \$72,000.

- Total combined assets of no more than \$340,000. This amount excludes the value of the residence, up to one acre of land and household furnishings.
- Disabled persons applying for the first time must show evidence of disability.

In addition to real estate tax relief, Fairfax County provides rental grants and relief from personal property tax for one automobile per household. Applications for 2013 for all programs are due April 1. This date may be extended to December 31 of this year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 1.

EMPLOYEES RECOGNIZED FOR SAFETY

Employees from the departments of Parks and Recreation and Public Works were recognized in December for their role in helping the town achieve a dramatic decrease in work-related injuries and were featured in the Virginia Municipal League's (VML) quarterly newsletter.

The recognition was attained due to a substantial decrease in overall workers' compensation costs and a decrease in the number of claims. Due to the decreased claims costs, the town's workers' compensation premium with VML Insurance Programs (VMLIP) will decrease by more than \$50,000 in the coming policy year.

As a result of the hard work and steps that these employees took to ensure on-the-job safety, the Town experienced its lowest employee on the job injury rate ever recorded. No lost time or days away from work due to injuries were recorded during all of 2012.

BOARD AND COMMISSION SPOTLIGHT: BOARD OF ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

Vienna's Board of Architectural Review encourages the construction of attractive buildings, signs and landscaping while helping to prevent the deterioration of the physical appearance of the town, which could create hazards to public safety and health.

The Board is charged with reviewing all applications for construction, alteration or restoration of any structure, building, landscape feature or sign within the town, except for detached single-family residences in single-family detached residential zones.

Recent applications before the Board have included a new addition to Marshall Road Elementary School, improvements to the community garden at 140 Locust Street SE and exterior modifications to Navy Federal Credit Union.

The Board of Architectural Review meets at 8 pm on the third Thursday of each month in the Council Chambers at Town Hall, 127 Center Street S; however, during the ongoing construction at Town Hall, meeting locations may be changed.

All meetings are open to the public and interested citizens are invited to attend. VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE: APRIL 15

Monday, April 15, is the last day to register to vote in the May 7 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day and a U.S. citizen. You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county and at www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

TALKING 'TRASH' AT SCHOOL

Every night I pack my lunch into reusable containers and into my lunch box and every morning I fill my reusable water bottle to take to school. Unfortunately, I am one of very few students at Marshall High School who do this. The tables in the cafeteria are always covered in Styrofoam trays, one-time use plastic bags and black plastic utensils. There is not a recycling can in sight. Nearly every food item, save the fruit, is wrapped individually in plastic that never gets recycled. I cringe every time someone sits down near me with an arm load of plastic that will inevitably be thrown away and end up in our oceans or burned and emitted into the atmosphere as carbon dioxide.

As much as it hurts to watch all this, the blame is not solely on the individuals who buy lunch at school. Reusable containers and lunch boxes are not available to everyone, especially the 45,170 students who receive a free or reduced-price lunch in Fairfax County. Much of the responsibility goes to the school system. Simply investing in reusable plastic trays could eliminate tons of Styrofoam (polystyrene) a year. Understandably, the food must be wrapped in plastic to ensure it does not get contaminated. But, a quick fix would be to use recyclable plastic and pair each trash can with a recycling bin that is clearly labeled and easily identified.

With over 180,000 students in all of Fairfax County Public Schools, simple changes like recycling and eliminating the use of polystyrene could positively affect the environment and my generation's future.

WATER MAINS FLUSHED IN SPRING

Each spring the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. The preventive maintenance program begins in early April, and flushing usually occurs between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm; however, some flushing will be performed during nighttime hours due to the hydrant's location or not to interrupt traffic flow on major roadways.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sediment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration. If you encounter discolored water in your home, run the faucet until the water is clear. The Town appreciates your tolerance of this inconvenience. RECYCLING AT NORTHSIDE: DROP OFF USED MOTOR OIL, ANTIFREEZE AND CAR BATTERIES

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, March 2 from 8 am to 2 pm at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street NE (entrance at the dead end of the street.) This service of the Public Works Department provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products. For more information, call (703) 255-6380.

Too often, used oil is improperly poured down storm drains or into sewers. Just one quart of oil can pollute 250,000 gallons of water, releasing toxic metals such as lead, cadmium and arsenic into the environment. Recycled oil is a valuable resource that can be remanufactured into new fuels. Antifreeze, like oil, can contaminate water and should never be disposed of in drains or sewers. In addition, antifreeze stored around the house presents a great danger to children and pets; it tastes sweet but is deadly poison. Improper disposal of automobile batteries is a leading cause of lead contamination in landfills and energy recovery facilities. In Virginia, it is illegal to dispose of automobile batteries with refuse.



THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

March 2003: A new street sign has been erected as the intersection of Mill and Cherry Streets SE, near the Vienna Community Center in memory of Hector L. Allen, Vienna's Director of Public Works from 1962 to 1982. He also served as interim Town Manager in 1984 and oversaw the construction of the addition to the Community Center in 1988.

March 1993: A public meeting will be held March 20 at Patrick Henry Library to discuss construction and renovation plans for the facility. Plans incorporate features recommended by citizens, including maintaining a temporary facility on site during construction, which is expected to last approximately 75 weeks.

March 1983: At its March 21 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on a proposed ordinance to regulate video games and other mechanical and electronic game machines. The ordinance would allow game machines in a business provided the building contains at least 1,000 square feet of floor space open to the public and the machines occupy no more than 5% of that area.

March 1973: The Virginia Department of Highways will hold a public hearing on the proposed widening of Park Street from maple Avenue to Cedar Lane on March 14. The widening of Park Street is not a new proposal since it was agreed to by a majority of the Town Council in 1966. However, conditions have changed since that time and widening the street to four lanes may now be unnecessary.
