PERMIT REQUIRED FOR BLOCK PARTIES

Block parties are a great way to meet your neighbors, discover shared interests and have fun! If your event will require closing a street, you must submit a petition for a permit at least 21 days in advance; applications will not be accepted within 14 working days of the event.

As you plan your block party, please keep the following regulations in mind:

- Applicant must reside on the block being closed.
- Block party applications must include a petition signed by 100% of residents on the block, no exceptions granted.
- List affected addresses in numerical order by house number.

- Be sure to specify street(s) and cross street(s) where barricades are to be delivered and picked-up.
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted or processed.
- Return completed form to Town of Vienna, Town Manager, Attn: Block Parties, 127 Center Street, S., Vienna, VA 22180 or email nngo@viennava.gov.
- The applicant will be responsible for the proper disposal of all recyclables and refuse associated with the event.
- Applicants who do not adhere to the noise restrictions or do not conclude the event by the permitted time of 11:00 p.m. will not be granted future block party permits and may be subject to

- penalties as contained in the Town Code.
- Alcohol is only to be consumed on private property and may not be sold during the block party.
- Use only removable barricades provided by the Department of Public Works to block the street.
- Do not obstruct public sidewalks or public rights-of-way with barricades, ropes or other objects.

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN!

Nutrients in stormwater runoff have been identified as the number one pollutant and threat to the health of the ecosystems of the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay



watersheds. Much of this pollution is the result of the activities of watershed residents who are unaware of the link between their daily behavior and the water quality downstream.

Stormwater runoff pollution comes from many sources including parking lots, lawns, driveways, golf courses and roads. Rainwater that runs off these surfaces picks up contaminants like motor oil, fertilizer, pesticides and bacteria from pet waste. This stormwater runoff flows into storm drains and then into local streams and the Potomac River, the source of drinking water for many residents in the Washington, D.C. area. The runoff ultimately contributes to the pollution affecting the Chesapeake Bay.

What can you do to prevent water pollution? Follow these simple tips:

- Dispose of used motor oil and household hazardous waste (paint, household cleaners, etc.) properly, rather than pouring it on the driveway or into the storm drain.
- Avoid excess fertilizer or pesticide use, especially before rain is predicted.
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, or in a location where the soapy water will not run into the storm drain.
- Sweep up grass clippings and other yard waste instead of washing them down the driveway or into the gutter.
- Always pick up pet waste from your yard, sidewalk or park
- Report storm drain dumping. During business hours, call the Town's Environmental Concern Line at (703) 255-6343. After hours, call the Police Department's non-emergency number at (703) 255-6366.

RECYCLING AT NORTHSIDE: JUNE 1

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, June 1, from 8 am to 2 pm at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street NE (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Department of Public Works (DPW) provides citizens a convenient

and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products.

DPW also offers recycling of small rechargeable batteries at Town Hall and the Community Center. Rechargeable batteries include nickel-cadmium (NiCd), nickel-zinc (NiZn), lithiumion (Li-ion), nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), and small sealed lead-acid (SSLA or Pb). Rechargeable batteries

BOARD AND COMMISSION SPOTLIGHT: TRANSPORTATION SAFETY COMMISSION

By Harold Bonacquist, TSC Member The Vienna of 50 years ago - before Tyson's Corner, I-495 and I-66 - was a bucolic community. Now, Route 123 is the main local road connecting Tysons with points to the east and south. Speeding, pedestrian safety and "cut-through" traffic have all become significant concerns. The ability of the Town to control cut-through traffic is, unfortunately, very limited; if access to one road is restricted, the traffic load on other neighborhood streets often increases. The Town has greater ability to deal with speeding and pedestrian safety through measures such as lane striping, enhanced enforcement and in limited cases - speed tables.

The Transportation Safety Commission (TSC) was created to enable members of the public to convey their concerns to the Town and to request traffic calming measures. The TSC studies these requests and decides upon the

best course of action. The TSC has the authority to implement certain economical items on its own, such as lane striping; however, for most measures, it will submit a recommendation to the Mayor and Town Council, which can approve, reject or modify the recommendation. Before a decision is made, the TSC will post signs on the street that will be affected by the proposed measure. Members of the TSC are residents of Vienna, chosen by the Town Council. We live in all four of the Town's quadrants to ensure that issues are fairly and thoroughly considered. The TSC has two subcommittees: the Bicycle Advisory Committee and the newly-created Pedestrian Advisory Committee.

If you are interested in having the Town consider a traffic calming measure, The Citizen's Guide To Traffic Calming in Vienna, available on the Town's website at www.viennava.gov/

index.aspx?NID=784, tells you how to proceed. Most importantly, you must show that your request is supported by a majority of the households on the affected street segment. After receiving a petition, the TSC will hold a public hearing at which the issue will be considered.

The TSC meets at 8:00 pm on the last Tuesday of every month except December. Meetings are open to the public and members of the public are given an opportunity to speak.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

May 2003: The Town of Vienna's general obligation bonds are rated "Aa1" by Moody's Investors Service. This high bond rating for a local government the size of Vienna is enjoyed by very few towns in the United States. The rating enables the Town to finance debt at more favorable interest rates compared to those municipalities with lower bond ratings, resulting in substantial savings for Vienna tax payers over the life of the bonds.

May 1993: A citizen's advisory committee has been established at the direction of Police Chief Daniel Kerr. The purpose of the committee is to advocate the interests of the citizens, serve as a forum for citizen input on police programs and policy, and advise on the delivery of police services and how well they are delivered. The committee comprises representatives from civic and homeowner associations, neighborhood watch groups and town businesses.

May 1983: Be a VIP and have a ball at the Vienna Invitational Police Association (VIP) Ball on May 13 at Westwood Country Club. Entertainment by the popular Jack Corry Orchestra will highlight the gala, proceeds from which will go exclusively to the Vienna Police Association's charitable activities.

May 1973: Voting in the Town election on May 1 will be held at the Vienna Community Center instead of Town Hall. Persons running for the three Council seats to be voted on include incumbents Neil M. Walp and Robert J. Skahan, also Boyd L. Booth, Raymond E. Hicks, Helen J. Demory, Martin J. Coyne, Jr. and Donald G. Richards.
