Vienna Ranks 3rd in Money Magazine's 50 "Best Places to Live" List

Money Magazine has selected the Town of Vienna as one of the top three "Best Places to Live" in the United States for 2013. Vienna made the number three slot behind Sharon, MA and Louisville, CO. The last time Vienna made the top five on this list was in 2005 when Vienna was ranked number four behind Moorestown, NJ, Bainbridge Island, WA and Naperville, IL.

Money Magazine staff spent months looking for great American towns and began with a list of 1,326 of U.S. towns with populations of 10,000 to 50,000. They then further refined the list by only considering those communities with an above-median household income that was not more than 200% or less than 85% of the state average, as well as high educational attainment and low crime. They also considered job growth, housing, health care, arts and leisure, diversity and ease of living.

Unlike other places in the Northern Virginia region, "Vienna offers walkability, a historic center and unique businesses that give Vienna an identity all its own," the magazine notes. "The small-town feel comes with access to all the DC metro area attractions."

Vienna was one of two Virginia localities to make the list this year with neighboring Leesburg, VA coming in at 35. Money Magazine also named Vienna as number 24 on their list of 25 Top-Earning Towns and number 12 on their list of 25 Best Places for the Rich and Single. The available diversity of native plants means that no matter what your location or particular site requires, or what your personal needs and wants are, there is a native plant to meet the task. The economic benefits of choosing natives are many as native plants require less maintenance and watering, are resistant to most pests and disease issues, are already adapted to a multitude of soil types and light

It Doesn't Cost a lot to Be Prepared: September is National Preparedness Month

It's no secret that disasters, both natural and manmade, seem to be occurring frequently in the U.S. September is National Preparedness Month and the perfect time for Virginia families to get ready for whatever may come, including tropical storms. Being prepared for emergencies doesn't have to cost a lot.

Make a plan. This may be • the single most important thing you can do, and it's free. Make sure everyone in your family understands where to go and what to do in case of an emergency. Update your contact information and post it in visible places in your home and workplace. For help, the Virginia Department of **Emergency Management's** (VDEM) emergency plan worksheet at www. <u>ReadyVirginia.gov</u> or get the

Ready Virginia app from the App Store and Google Play.

- Set aside emergency supplies. • Don't wait for a storm. Buy preparedness items throughout the year instead of all at once. Shop at sales and used goods stores. Choose the essentials that fit your needs and budget. If you don't have emergency supplies, September is a good time to get started. Get a list at www.ReadyVirgina.gov.
- Request a gift. We all get things we don't need. Suggest preparedness supplies as gifts from friends and family.
- Store water. You don't have to buy expensive bottled water. Just make sure your water containers are disinfected and airtight. Have at least a threeday supply of water on hand that's one gallon per person per day.
- Check your policy. Take a few minutes to review your insurance policy during National Preparedness Month. Get with your agent to make any necessary changes. Consider adding flood insurance because most policies don't include it. Renters, you can get flood insurance, too. When a disaster strikes, you want to be sure that your coverage will get you back on your feet.

Fairfax County Personal Property Tax and Vienna Vehicle License Fee Due October 7

Town of Vienna residents pay Fairfax County personal property tax on motor vehicles due every year on October 5 (Monday, October 7, this year). The current personal property tax rate is \$4.57 per \$100 of assessed value. New residents or those registering a vehicle for the first time must file a personal property vehicle registration form within 60 days of purchase or entry into the County.

Fairfax County provides car tax relief to citizens who are either 65 years of age or older, or permanently and totally disabled, and meet income and asset eligibility requirements. For more information, visit <u>www.fairfaxcounty.gov/</u><u>dta</u> or call (703) 222-8234.

If you live in the Town of Vienna you will pay personal property tax to Fairfax County and a Vehicle License Fee to the Town. Vienna Vehicle License taxes are \$33 per car and \$18 per motorcycle. The Vehicle License Fee deadline has now been changed to October 5 (Monday, October 7, in 2013) to align with Fairfax County's Personal Property Tax deadline.

If your personal property tax bill from Fairfax County has a Fairfax County Vehicle License fee charge you may not owe it to the County. Please call the Town's Vehicle License hotline at (703) 255-5735 or e-mail <u>vehicle@viennava.gov</u> for more information.

Westbriar Civic Association Donates Stop Sign

On July 10, 2013, the Westbriar Civic Association presented Westbriar Elementary School with a new stop sign to be used by the crossing guard at the intersection of Old Courthouse Road and Pine Valley Drive. The new sign features high intensity flashing LEDs, as well as a reflective red background that combine to enhance visibility.

The Westbriar Civic Association recognized the need to increase safety at this crossing since many children walk through this busy intersection to get to school at Westbriar Elementary. In an effort to increase safety, the Association sought to increase pedestrian visibility by arming the crossing guard with a highly reflective and attention grabbing sign.

"We have been looking at ways to enhance safety [at the intersection], and have recently tested some high tech traffic control signals intended

for use by crossing guards and other traffic workers," the article noted. "The signals have features that give it much more visibility and authority, especially under low visibility conditions."

Westbriar Civic Association presented the new stop sign as a "thank you" to the crossing guard for their service in ensuring the safety of the children at this intersection. Westbriar Civic will be responsible for maintenance of the sign should it be needed.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

September 2003: At its September 8 meeting, the Town Council will hold public hearings on requests to remove five properties from the Windover Heights Historic District in Northwest Vienna. The Town Planning Commission recommended that the properties at 130 Pleasant Street NW, 346 Windover Avenue NW, 222 Lovers Lane NW, and 200 and 224 Walnut Lane NW not be removed from the historic district.

September 1993: Fairfax County Public Library's Patrick Henry branch in Vienna will be closed September 1 - November 17, for the start of a major construction and renovation project. The collection and furnishings will be removed while workers prepare the site for a new addition. Basic library services will resume November 18 in part of the existing structure.

September 1983: The Town Council will hold a public hearing September 26 on the rezoning of the Maple Avenue West Associates property behind the Marco Polo Restaurant. Maple Avenue West Associates dues the Town last year after Council denied their application to rezone the property from a residential to a commercial category. The Fairfax County Circuit Court ruled that the Town could not enforce the current residential zoning for the property and sent the rezoning application back to Council for reconsideration.

September 1973: The Town Council will hold a special work session to study the problems and alternatives of building a road from Park Street to the town's corporate limit at Electric Avenue. Alternatives include a two-lane road, a four-lane road or a four-lane divided road next to the VEPCO right-of-way. The Council can also, of course, decide not to construct any road at all.
