Who Provides Vienna's Emergency Assistance for Police, Fire and Medical Services, and How Resident Calls Are Received and Dispatched

This fall I completed my 25th year of continuous service in the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department (VVFD) located at 400 Center Street South. Over the years, one thing is constant with the VVFD as I still find myself explaining to Vienna residents who provides emergency assistance (police, fire and medical service) and how residents' calls are received and dispatched.

Police assistance and coverage to the Town of Vienna is provided by the Vienna Police Department, which has been in existence for over 66 years. The department is a full-service law enforcement agency employing 41 sworn officers and 11 civilian members, who are supplemented by a 5-member police auxiliary unit. The Police Department is one of the seven Town Departments that comprise the Vienna Town government. The Police Department's yearly operating budget is approximately \$6.3 million and is funded by tax revenues received by the Town of Vienna. Last year, the Vienna Police Department responded to over 16,900 calls for assistance.

Fire and emergency medical service coverage is provided by a combined FairfaxCountycareerstaffandvolunteer effort. Of the 38 fire stations across the County, the Vienna fire station is one of 12 volunteer fire departments. The Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department, in existence for over 60 years, provides 24-hour coverage at the Vienna fire station, which includes a career staff of 20 personnel covering three 24-hour shifts. The VVFD, which began over 110 years ago in 1903, has over 90 members including over 40 operational volunteers who work closely with the career personnel and help staff an additional engine and ambulance providing supplemental assistance when needed. The VVFD volunteers own and maintain the Vienna fire station and purchase all the emergency vehicles at the station. This effort requires raising funds of over \$300,000 annually. Fairfax County covers the costs of the County career staff, station utility costs, vehicle repairs, fuel, maintenance and insurance costs that total approximately \$2.6 million annually. Last year, there were over 3,600 unit responses by the Vienna fire station.

When a Vienna resident needs emergency assistance for police, fire or medical service, you need to call 911 and the call is automatically routed to the Fairfax County 911 Emergency Operations Center located on West Ox Road in the Fair Oaks area. Vienna police calls are routed through the



County's 911 center and immediately passed to the Vienna Police Department dispatcher in the Vienna police station, who then dispatches the Vienna police. Non-emergency calls to the Vienna police can be received on the (703) 255-6366 number. Fire and emergency medical services calls are dispatched from the County's 911 center and assigned to either the Vienna fire station units or, if they are not available, to the nearest fire station that has available units. The dispatch time for either police or fire calls is usually less than a minute depending on the nature of the call.

I hope this information gives a good overview of our available emergency services. We as residents can be proud of these emergency services. As 2013 draws to a close, I hope you and your family have a wonderful holiday season and we as a community continue to thrive in 2014.

Please Shovel Snow if Possible

Fight this winter's feelings of being cooped up and trapped by getting out and helping your neighborhood clear its sidewalks of snow! Get a group together, fill your thermos with cocoa and get some muscle warming exercise. Please note that businesses who hire snowplows to clear their parking lots should make sure that snow is not piled onto adjoining sidewalks or pushed into the street. Also, it is illegal to block handicapped parking spaces with snow.

Town-Wide Loose Leaf Collection Continues Through December

Town-wide loose leaf collection began on October 28, 2013. Regardless of where you live in town, residents are asked to rake leaves to the curb **at any point** between October 28 and December 31, 2013.

Starting in North Vienna

In total, **three leaf collections** will be performed throughout town from November 2013 through January 2014, weather permitting. Each pass will begin in north Vienna and once the northern part of Town is completed, crews will begin collections in south Vienna. As in previous years, collection crews will only pass your house once during each of the three collections. Rake Your Leaves By December 31

It is important that your leaves are raked to the curb by December 31 or you may miss the final collection pass. If you miss the final pass, you will be asked to bag your leaves in clear plastic bags so that they can be collected on your regular weekly collection day.

Recycling at Northside: December 7

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, December 7, from 8 am to 2 pm at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street NE (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Department of Public Works (DPW) provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products.

DPW also offers recycling of small rechargeable batteries at the quarterly recycling events at Northside as well as at Town Hall and the Community Center. Rechargeable batteries include nickel-cadmium (NiCd), nickel-zinc (NiZn), lithium-ion (Li-ion), nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), and small sealed lead-acid (SSLA or Pb). Rechargeable batteries come in many types, including standard AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-volt, or a special design for a specific device. They may be removable or internal to a device.

Alkaline batteries (non-rechargeable) are not recyclable; however, they have been redesigned to have a very low toxicity and may now be disposed of safely in your household trash. For more information, call (703) 255-6380.

Leaf Mulch Delivery

The Public Works Department will take orders December 2 through February 28 for leaf mulch to be delivered free of charge to residents who live within the corporate limits of the Town. Delivery will likely begin mid-January. To place your order, call the "Mulch Line" recording at (703) 255-6388 and leave your name, address, daytime phone number and the number of loads to be delivered. You may also order leaf mulch online by visiting www.viennava.gov/index. aspx?NID=164. One load is approximately 2.5 cubic yards, which roughly equals 30 bags of mulch from a home hardware/lawn care store. Half loads are available on request.

Please note the following important conditions:

- All mulch deliveries are based on availability of mulch.
- Mulch deliveries will be placed only in the driveway at the end closest to the house.
- Once mulch is delivered, it becomes the property of the homeowner and the Town will not remove any excess mulch ordered.

Residents may pick up leaf mulch themselves in any amount between the hours of 9:30 am and 3:00 pm Monday through Friday (except holidays) from January 2 through March 30 while supplies last. Please call the DPW Administration office at (703) 255-6382 to arrange a pickup time so that we can ensure a staff member will be on site. The mulch is stored on Town-owned property at 442 Beulah Road NE, near Glyndon Park.

Businesses, Non-profits May Order Mulch

Free leaf mulch delivery is also available to all in-town businesses as well as churches, schools, the fire station, library and other non-profit organizations within the town limits. Call (703) 255-6388 beginning December 1 to place an order. Please note the conditions outlined above, which also apply to non-residential deliveries.

By grinding leaves into recyclable mulch the Town saves thousands of dollars in landfill fees each year. To save even more, citizens are encouraged to recycle grass clippings as mulch or compost. For howto information, call the Fairfax County Recycling Hotline at (703) 324-5052.

RECYCLING KEEPS VIENNA "MERRY AND BRIGHT"

Searching for a holiday gift for everyone? Ever consider increasing your recycling? This idea may not be on the top of your holiday list, but Americans throw away 25% more trash during the holiday time from Thanksgiving to the New Year than any other time of the year. Recycling is a gift for yourself, your loved ones, and all of Vienna.

Recycling also makes a positive impact on our Town's budget. Last year, the Town spent almost \$400,000 to dispose of trash and collected approximately \$30,000 for recycling. Simply put, we pay to dispose of trash and we get paid to recycle. Plus, recycling in Vienna is so easy: no need to separate anything, just place it outside on the day of collection in a transparent plastic bag, or purchase a large blue recycling bin to quickly wheel out onto the curb. The following are a few ideas to give your holiday recycling a boost:

- Recycle your shopping bags, cardboard boxes from toys, gifts and stores as well as the nonmetallic wrapping paper, ribbon and bows that adorn gifts.
- Send E-Cards instead of paper ones, and recycle the paper ones you receive.
- Reuse gift bags, newspaper, boxes and create gift tags with saved cards.
- Recycle food and drink containers, plastic plates and silverware, napkins and other paper products when you entertain.
- Remove your name from unwanted catalog mailing lists to save paper.
- Use real, unbuttered popcorn to pack gifts, and reuse Styrofoam peanuts or return to UPS stores (call before delivering).

- Buy rechargeable batteries and a battery charger to cut down on battery consumption.
- Purchase recycled products as gifts, especially those with high post-consumer content, and support retailers who demonstrate sustainable business practices.

Don't forget your Christmas tree! The Town will pick up live trees left on the curb - no need to bag - on each scheduled collection day in January. The trees are picked up along with brush and recycled into mulch to be used in our community once again.

Seeking Volunteers for the Vienna Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committees

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

December 2003: The Sons & Daughters Cemetery, located on Orchard Street NW, recently became the twentieth property in town to receive a Historic Designation Marker. There are over 200 graves in the cemetery, many belonging to former slaves, freed citizens and their descendents along with soldiers who served under Capt. Harmon Salsbury in the Union Army's 26th Regiment. The cemetery is still in use and belongs to the First Baptist Church of Vienna.

December 1993: The Town of Vienna has completed its transition plan for compliance with the physical accessibility standards set by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The plan identifies the modifications required to provide physical accessibility for all citizens at Town Hall and other government facilities, including handicap parking, elevators and specially designed restrooms, drinking fountains and telephones.

December 1983: The Town Council has sent the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation a position paper on the proposed I-66/Nutley Street interchange, objecting to VDH&T's current construction plans and recommending alternatives that would minimize adverse impacts on the town.

December 1973: The country is facing a serious energy crisis. To curb the use of energy, Vienna will not light the Town Christmas street decorations this season, although they will be installed. Residents are asked to keep Christmas lighting to a minimum and to decorate their homes this year with non-lighting outdoor displays.

Preparation of Vienna's budget for the fiscal year 2014-2015 has begun. Citizens will have an opportunity to comment on the proposed budget and tax rate at public hearings during the April 7 and 28, 2014 Town Council Meetings.
