Voter Registration Deadline

Monday, April 14, is the last day to register to vote in the May 6, Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day and a U.S. citizen. You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county and at www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

person absentee voting will be conducted at the Fairfax May 3, on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 8 am to 4:30 pm, Thursdays from 8 am to 7 pm and Saturday, May 3, from 9 am to 5 pm. May 3 is the last day to vote absentee in person.

The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot by mail, e-mail or fax is April 29, at 5 pm. Ballots must be received in the Office of Elections by 7 pm on election day in order to be counted.

A Look at the Proposed Budget For Fiscal Year 2014-2015

MESSAGE FROM THE TOWN MANAGER

The Town of Vienna's Proposed Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Operating Budget has been presented to the Town Council. The proposed budget attempts to keep tax payers' cost down while maximizing the Town government's operational efficiencies with regard to service delivery to the Town's citizens and customers. Overall, the Town's fiscal position is strong.

For 2014, the average existing residential assessments increased by 5.26% over 2013 while the average commercial assessment decreased by 0.17%. The Town did experience new construction and improvements to existing residential properties of almost \$64 million during 2013, while during the same time period commercial properties increased slightly by \$0.3 million.

As in previous years, we have continued our practice of conservative revenue forecasting. The FY 2014-15 proposed budget is based on a real estate tax rate of 22.88 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation which holds the tax rate constant from FY 2013-14.


Expenditures for the Water and Sewer Fund total \$6,821,000, a decrease of \$397,847 or 5.5 percent. This puts the Town on course to recover \$300,000 of the \$900,000 loss to the Water and Sewer Fund balance experienced in prior years as part of our recovery plan. The Water & Sewer rates are currently being reviewed by Council and new rates will be set for FY 2014-15. Council will hold a Water & Sewer rate hearing on April 28, 2014 and will adopt new rates on May 12, 2014.

I invite you to read the entire budget message and proposed budget. The budget is available for public review at Town Hall, the Patrick Henry Library and online at www.viennava.gov. We also have a tax calculator widget on the website so that citizens can compute their actual Town taxes for 2014-2015. Citizens are also encouraged to attend a public hearing on the budget, scheduled for the Town Council meeting on Monday, April 7, beginning at 8 pm in the Council Chamber at Town Hall. Also, a public hearing on the proposed tax rate and water and sewer rates is scheduled for Monday, April 28.

Budget Preparation and Adoption

The Code of the Town of Vienna requires that by July 1 of each year, the Vienna Town Council adopt by ordinance a budget establishing the tax rate for the incoming year. Estimated revenues must be equivalent to estimated expenditures. It is mandated in the Code that the fiscal year begin on July 1 and end on June 30.

At least one public hearing must be held on the budget prior to its adoption. Seven days prior to this hearing, the Town Clerk must publish a notice of Council's intention to hold such an event. The budget cannot be adopted at the same meeting at which the public hearing is held. Two notices, again at least seven days apart, must then be published in a paper of general circulation announcing Council's intention to adopt the budget. Following this advertisement, Council may then adopt the budget. After this action is taken, the Town Clerk publishes the final notice of adoption.

The Town of Vienna's budget process begins in January of each year when Council presents to the staff its budget priorities for the upcoming year. Citizens who have suggestions about what items should be given priority for funding are encouraged to express their views in writing to the Town Manager. In addition, non-profit Vienna organizations may apply for donations of Town funds.

The Town Manager then prepares and submits to the Town Council his proposed budget and copies are made available to the public. This year, budget work sessions were scheduled for March 22 and 24. The public hearing on the proposed budget will be held at the Town Council meeting on April 7, which begins at 8 pm in the Council Chamber at Town Hall. If Council considers it necessary, a final budget work session to discuss comments made at the public hearing will be held on April 21, at 8 pm. A separate hearing on the proposed tax rate and water and sewer rates will be held on April 28. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for the May 12 Council meeting.

This Month in History From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

April 2004: At its next regular meeting on Tuesday, April 27, the Town's Transportation Safety Commission (TSC) will discuss a request to open Church Street NW between Lawyers Road and Pleasant Street, near the Vienna Post Office. The opening of this portion of Church Street has been a subject of discussion for 30 years, and several traffic studies of the area have been made.

April 1994: A new night deposit box has been installed in the basement door at the rear of Town Hall. This box is to be used to drop off payments of water bills, car tags and business taxes whenever Town Hall is closed.

April 1984: The Parks and Recreation department plans to kick off a new maintenance program for trees in Town rightof-way on Arbor Day, April 27. The emphasis of the program will be in four areas: (1) planting new trees in open spaces and replacing those that must be removed; (2) pruning and removals to maintain a healthy and safe condition; (3) chemical treatments where necessary to improve the vigor of trees to combat disease and insects; and (4) expansion and maintenance of nursery stock to provide an immediate, less expensive source of trees.

April 1974: An express bus site is being proposed by Vienna on the parking lot behind the Vienna Shopping Center. One or two express buses would leave the site for Washington at 7 am and return at 5 or 6 pm.

Temporary Chlorine Taste in Water

From April through July you may notice a slight chlorine taste and odor in your drinking water as Vienna's drinking water supplier will temporarily switch the disinfectant it uses in the distribution system from chloramines to free chlorine. This temporary change is performed annually and is part of a regular process used to keep water mains clean and free from potentially harmful bacteria. As always, the Department of Public Works will continue to monitor the drinking water to ensure that it meets all federal and state drinking water standards.

If you are sensitive to the taste of chlorine, you may be able to reduce the taste by refrigerating a pitcher of drinking water overnight. If you have questions, please contact the Water and Sewer Superintendent Donald Kahn at (703) 255-8610 or <u>dkahn@viennava.gov</u>.
