Permit Required for Block Parties

Block parties are a great way to meet your neighbors, discover shared interests and have fun! If your event will require closing a street, you must submit a petition for a permit at least 21 days in advance; applications will not be accepted within 14 working days of the event.

As you plan your block party, please keep the following regulations in mind:

- Applicant must reside on the block being closed.
- Block party applications must include a petition signed by 100% of residents on the block, no exceptions granted.
- List affected addresses in numerical order by house number.
- Be sure to specify street(s) and cross street(s) where barricades Page 4

- are to be delivered and pickedup.
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted or processed.
- Return completed form to Town of Vienna, Town Manager, Attn: Block Parties, 127 Center Street, S., Vienna, VA 22180 or email nngo@ viennava.gov.
- The applicant will be responsible for the proper disposal of all recyclables and refuse associated with the event.
- Applicants who do not adhere to the noise restrictions or do not conclude the event by the permitted time of 11:00 pm will not be granted future block party permits and may be subject to penalties as contained in the Town Code.

- Alcohol is only to be consumed on private property and may not be sold during the block party.
- Use only removable barricades provided by the Department of Public Works to block the street.
- Do not obstruct public sidewalks or public rights-ofway with barricades, ropes or other objects.

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN!

Nutrients in stormwater runoff have been identified as the number one pollutant and threat to the health of the ecosystems of the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds. Much of this pollution is the result



of the activities of watershed residents who are unaware of the link between their daily behavior and the water quality downstream.

Stormwater runoff pollution comes from many sources including parking lots, lawns, driveways, golf courses and roads. Rainwater that runs off these surfaces picks up contaminants like motor oil, fertilizer, pesticides and bacteria from pet waste. This stormwater runoff flows into storm drains and then into local streams and the Potomac River, the source of drinking water for many residents in the Washington, D.C. area. The runoff ultimately contributes to the pollution affecting the Chesapeake Bay.

What can you do to prevent water pollution? Follow these simple tips:

- Dispose of used motor oil and household hazardous waste (paint, household cleaners, etc.) properly, rather than pouring it on the driveway or into the storm drain.
- Avoid excess fertilizer or pesticide use, especially before rain is predicted.
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, or in a location where the soapy water will not run into the storm drain.
- Sweep up grass clippings and other yard waste instead of washing them down the driveway or into the gutter.
- Always pick up pet waste from your yard, sidewalk or park
- Report storm drain dumping. During business hours, call the Town's Environmental Concern Line at (703) 255-6343. After hours, call the Police Department's non-emergency number at (703) 255-6366.

Recycling at Northside: June 7

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, June 7, from 8 am to 2 pm at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street NE (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Department of Public Works (DPW) provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products.

DPW also offers recycling of small rechargeable batteries at Town Hall and the Community Center. Rechargeable batteries include nickel-cadmium (NiCd), nickel-zinc (NiZn), lithiumion (Li-ion), nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), and small sealed lead-acid (SSLA or Pb). Rechargeable batteries come in many types, including standard AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-volt, or a special

design for a specific device. They may be removable or internal to a device.

Alkaline batteries (non-rechargeable) are not recyclable; however, they have been redesigned to have a very low toxicity and may now be disposed of safely in your household trash. For more information, call (703) 255-6380.



Why Monarchs Matter

Every spring I look forward to the arrival of butterflies in my garden – the monarch (Danaus plexippus) is one of my favorites! This beautiful black and orange butterfly visits our area throughout the summer and fall during its annual migration. Its life cycle is fascinating! Did you know:

- Monarch butterflies lay their eggs only on milkweed, an easy-to-grow plant that looks great in your garden.
- Monarch butterflies (the population on the eastern side of North America) overwinter in the mountains of central Mexico.
- Monarch butterflies migrate through North America each year and the migration can take up to five generations!

The monarch has been in the news lately, because this year monarch butterflies covered only 1.6 acres of forest in their wintering grounds, down from a 20 year high of 45 acres. Threats to the monarch occur in Canada, the U.S. and Mexico; herbicide use in the agricultural fields of the U.S. and Canada, and illegal logging in Mexico. Although monarchs rebounded from a similar crash in the 1930s, scientists are very concerned about the present-day population of monarchs. So, how can we here in Vienna, VA help? Here are a few great ways to get involved:

- Read about the migration! Four Wings and a Prayer, by Sue Halpern is a great springtime read about the monarch migration.
- Plant a monarch-friendly butterfly garden! Monarch butterflies lay their eggs only on milkweed (it makes them toxic to birds.) Check native plant sales and nurseries for milkweed plants and plugs.
- Tag a monarch! Participate in the annual citizen-science project at <u>www.</u> <u>monarchwatch.org</u>. You place a small tag on the monarch's wing, log the data and wait to hear if your Virginia monarch made it to Mexico!

This Month in History

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

May 2004: Beginning the week of May 3, the Vienna Police Department will conduct the first official test of its new emergency notification system, also know as reverse 911. Called "The Communicator!," the technology was developed by Dialogic Communications Corp. and is designed to alert the local community automatically in the case of an emergency such as a natural disaster or public health threat.

May 1994: Last month's dedication ceremony and open house at the new police headquarters building, 215 Center Street S., attracted a large turnout of residents to tour the facility, the construction of which was stalled for many months due to delays caused by the original contractor for the project.

May 1984: ViVa! Vienna! The first annual Town festival sponsored by the Vienna Chamber of Commerce and the Vienna Jaycees, will be held on Church Street on Sunday, May 27. Church Street will be closed between Lawyers Road and Mill Street, turning it into a pedestrian mall filled with craft booths, music, refreshments, children's entertainment and a special Memorial Day ceremony. Proceeds from the festival will be used by the Jaycees to send mentally handicapped children to a special summer camp.

May 1974: The Vienna Economic Advisory Committee intends to survey the business community's problems, strengths and weaknesses and is seeking citizen input to help in establishing a viable economic policy for the town. The Commission was created by the Town Council to recommend long-range goals related to the economic growth and well-being of Vienna.

Street Sweeping Ends in May
