Boards and Commission Spotlight: Bicycle Advisory Committee

The Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC) serves as an advisory committee to the Town of Vienna's Transportation Safety Commission (TSC) by providing citizen input in planning the bicycle transportation infrastructure improvements and in promoting bicycling initiatives within the Town of Vienna. The BAC reports directly to the TSC who then reviews any recommendations and reports to the Mayor and Town Council.

The BAC meets every other month (alternating months with the Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC) before the regularly scheduled TSC meeting, on the last Tuesday of each month except December. Joint meetings with the PAC or the TSC may be held as deemed necessary by the TSC.

Leaf Mulch Delivery

The Public Works Department will take orders December 1 through Church Street will be held on Monday, December February 27 for leaf mulch to be delivered free of charge to residents who live within the corporate limits of the Town. Delivery will likely begin mid-January. To place your order, call the "Mulch Line" recording at (703) 255-6388 and leave your name, address, daytime phone number and the number of loads to be delivered. You may also order leaf mulch online by visiting www.viennava.gov/index. aspx?NID=164. One load is approximately 2.5 cubic yards, which roughly equals 30 bags of mulch from a home hardware/lawn care store. Half loads are available on request.

Please note the following important conditions:

- All mulch deliveries are based on availability of mulch.
- Mulch deliveries will be placed only in the driveway at the end closest to the house.
- Once mulch is delivered, it becomes the property of the homeowner and the Town will not remove any excess mulch ordered.

Residents may pick up leaf mulch themselves in any amount between the hours of 9:30 am and 3:00 pm Monday through Friday (except holidays) from January 2 through March 31 while supplies last. Please call the DPW Administration office at (703) 255-6380 to arrange a pickup time so that we can ensure a staff member will be on site. The mulch is stored on Town-owned property at 442 Beulah Road NE, near Glyndon Park.

Businesses, Non-profits May Order Mulch

Free leaf mulch delivery is available to all in-town businesses as well as churches, schools, the fire station, library and other non-profit organizations within the Town limits. Call (703) 255-6388 beginning December 1 to place an order. Please note the conditions outlined above, which also apply to non-residential deliveries.

By grinding leaves into recyclable mulch the Town saves thousands of dollars in landfill fees each year. To save even more, citizens are encouraged to recycle grass clippings as mulch or compost. For how-to information, call the Fairfax County Recycling Hotline at (703) 324-5052.

VOLUNTEERING TO SAVE OUR STREAMS



It was a chilly Saturday morning last winter, with temperatures in the 30s and the first Saturday in a very long time without an early morning hockey game or two. Was it the perfect morning to let the family sleep in, or was it my chance to take the family stream monitoring? Much to my family's chagrin, I chose the latter!

We drove off to help out with the search for benthic macroinvertebrates, or large bugs or other animals without backbones, in one of our local streams. We chose a monitoring spot near Lake Accotink, because it receives water from streams in Vienna. Any water that folks in our neighborhood use to water plants, rinse off the driveway, or wash a car will eventually end up in this stream.

In order to survey the stream, you need people to hold the net and people to "dance," or stir up the stream bottom to catch any invertebrates that come swimming away. Then the group takes a look in the net and counts the critters. High biodiversity, or variety in the types of animals we see, is one indicator of a healthy stream.

Activities like our winter stream count are happening throughout our area and you can get involved right here in Vienna. "Adopting" a local stream is fun and easy. Our family now surveys a section of Difficult Run 4 times per year and the data are sent to Virginia Save Our Streams. The training and certification are relatively simple. Vienna Leaf Collection Continues

Vienna leaf collection continues through December. As in previous years, Town crews will make a total of three passes (beginning in north Vienna and moving to south Vienna at the start of each pass) during the leaf collection period. All residents are asked to rake their leaves to the curb for collection. Leaf piles should be free of limbs, sticks, acorns or other debris which may clog the vacuum hose.

In an effort to keep residents informed, and to provide flexibility for weather delays, signs will be placed at entrances to neighborhoods advising of the projected date that the leaf vacuum truck will be in the area. Town residents also have the option to bag leaves for collection on your regular weekly collection day. Please place leaves in clear plastic bags or paper yard waste bags available at garden and home supply stores. Please don't rake leaves Into the street. 

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

December 2004: The house known as "Maple Shade" located at 403 Creek Crossing Rd., N.E., was recently added to Vienna's Historic Register. The home was build circa 1890 by Asa Dyer with beams and wood framework from the Hunter's Mill sawmill. The Town Council established the Historic Register to encourage recognition of and interest in historic places in Vienna.

December 1994: The Town of Vienna has agreed to join with other local jurisdictions in Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia in the Washington Metropolitan Council of Governments Water Supply Emergency Plan. The plan details steps to be taken by local governments and drinking water utilities to coordinate actions in the event of a regional water emergency.

December 1984: The Vienna Light Opera Comapany will perfom the one-act Christmas opera "Amahl and the Night Visitors" by Gian Carlo Menotti on Thursday, December 6. In addition to "Amahl," the Vienna Light Opera Company chorus will perfom "Twas the Night Before Christmas."

December 1974: The Town Council approved dropping consideration of connecting several streets in southeast Vienna as indicated on the Traffic Circulation Plan. No connections will be made from Locust Street to Hine Street across Wolftrap Creek, Brand Road to Talahi Road, Park Street to Electric Avenue via Dominion Road, and Glyndon Street across the Washington and Old Dominion Railway.

Recycling at Northside: December 6



The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, December 6, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street NE (entrance at the dead end of the street) and at 600 Glyndon Street NE. This service of the Department of Public Works (DPW) provides citizens a convenient and environmentally

responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products.

DPW also offers recycling of small rechargeable batteries at the quarterly recycling events at Town Hall. Rechargeable batteries include nickel-cadmium (NiCd), nickel-zinc (NiZn), lithium-ion (Li-ion), nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), and small sealed lead-acid (SSLA or Pb). Rechargeable batteries come in many types, including standard AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-volt, or a special design for a specific device. They may be removable or internal to a device.
