Groups who have volunteered to entertain will include the Kolenda family, Vienna's professional family singing group, who have kindly offered their services and will sing during the dinner hour.

Individual homes as well as businesses are asked to decorate their buildings with bunting and flags beginning on the weekend, so that the whole town will have a festive and patriotic look.


As usual, the day will end with a shower of colored stars. It is hoped that everyone will join together to enjoy a very special American holiday.
