SOUTH CAROLINA PARK (formerly Meadow Lane Park)

A summer playground program will be held from June 25 through for 2 three week sessions from August 10 from 9:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. A pre-school playground will program is limited for children 6 be scheduled on Tuesday and Thursday mornings for children 3 will be made available and a Recreation Worker will be on the playground to direct this program, Additional mothers' help will be necessary and it is hoped that they will volunteer to assist.

OHIO PARK (formerly Glyndon Street Park)

July 2 to August 10 from 9:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., Monday through Friday. A summer day camp will be conducted 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. This to 12 years of age and a charge of \$13.50 is required for each session. to 5 years of age. Craft materials Activities will include low organized games, sports and athletics, arts and crafts, nature, quiet games, cook-outs, special events, singing, story-telling, drama, and Closing Day Ceremonies.
