

# Fall Cleanup Begins Oct. 14

Vienna's annual Fall Cleanup Program will beain Oct. 14 and will continue throughout the following three weeks.

The Town's program is an annual event in which residents may put anything out at the curbside to be picked up by Town crews, free of charge. Normally this service costs residents \$10.

Residents can aid to the success of the program by having all their trash and debris at the curbside prior to Oct. 14. The Town will collect anything put at the curbside prior to Oct. 24.

There are certain precautions residents must take: Wood and brush must be separated from metal and other household trash, leaves must be bagged, and everything that is to be removed must be at the curbside. Residents should be sure they leave nothing at the curbside they don't want carted away.

To eliminate damage to Town equipment and private property residents should not pile trash and debris over valves, meter box covers or fire hydrants.

The Town's crews will start collecting at one side of Town and continue circling the Town until the cutoff date. No trash or debris will be collected that is put out after Oct. 24. Special equipment will circle the Town, picking up extra heavy items, such as washing machines and refrigerators, so residents should not be concerned if only part of their debris is picked up at one time.

The special cleanup program must be squeezed in between road maintenance work and leaf pickup, therefore the cooperation and support of all residents is required. Leaf pickup will begin shortly after Oct. 24, after the first frost.

The annual Fall Cleanup Program is just another service offered to Town residents to supplement the twice-weekly household trash removal and biweekly newspaper pickup.

# Palm Reading Bill Being Drafted

Vienna Town Council passed a 120-day moratorium at its Sept. 8 meeting preventing palm reading businesses in the Town and at the same time instructed the Town Attorney to draft an ordinance governing the operation of palm reading businesses with strict guide-

The proposed ordinance would make any palm reading business a conditional use in the C-2 zone.

Tentative date for the public hearing on the proposed ordinance is Nov. 24. The Vienna Newsletter will have details of the ordinance prior to the public hearing date.

Presently the Vienna Town Code does not provide for the operation of palm reading businesses. Council's action came after a palm reader expressed interest in locating in the Town.

### Crime Down

Reported cases of crime were down during the first half of 1975 according to figures released by the Vienna Police Department.

Felonies, misdemeanors and juvenile crimes were all down over the first six months of the year compared to the first half of 1974.

Felonies were down to 173 cases from 177 reported last year, misdemeanors were down to 615 reported cases from 700 and juvenile crimes dropped from 181 to 135.

Vandalism was reported higher, 152 cases compared to 97 last year at this time, however, Vienna Chief of Police Vernon L. Jones attributed the increase to a recent publicity campaign that asked Vienna residents to report vandalism incidents no matter how small they may be,

Burglary increased from 45 to 56 cases, however, assault with the intent to kill, sex offenses and auto theft were down. Petit larceny dropped from 214 cases in the first half of 1974 to 154 cases this year.

Juvenile felonies, misdemeanors and runaways were all down.

### Improvements Okaved

The Board of Zoning Appeals issued a use permit Sept. 17, that would allow a French restaurant to operate in Town as a non-conforming use at 416 Maple Avenue West in the old 7-Daniels Restaurant building.

The permit enables the owners, B. Amestoz and M. Garsiso, to remodel the building and add an addition without coming into complete conformity with Town laws which require 125 seats. The proposed restaurant will be able to seat 56 people.

## A Salute to Home States

The Vienna Bicentennial Commission has announced plans for a unique celebration that will bring people from their home states together in a series of special state weeks throughout 1976.

Starting Jan. 4, the Bicentennial Commission will implement State Weeks in Vienna--a series of 50 weeks dedicated to the Nation's great states (including the District of Columbia) and the people from those states.

Delaware will be the first state honored as the Commission and Mayor have declared the week of Jan. 4-11 as Delaware State Week in Vienna. The remaining weeks will honor the other 49 states and the District of Columbia in the order they were admitted into the Union.

The purpose of this special series of programs is to bring people from their home state together. Part of the Bicentennial is to renew our heritage in America -- that includes our home states also:

The flag of the state being honored will fly on the Town's flag pole throughout the week and on each Wednesday night there will be a reception in the Patrick Henry Library for all those from the honored state. Those attending will include the honored state's Congressional delegation.

A list of your home states and when it will be honored is printed below.

Delaware

The most difficult task in organizing the State Weeks Program is getting people from the different states together. To make the task easier the Town had sign-up booklets at the last Fourth of July Celebration at the Community Center fairgrounds so people could sign up from their home state. Those who missed signing one of the booklets may send in the form below. People who sign up under a state will be contacted either by phone or mail on details of their home state week.

Largest of the state week celebrations will include a parade during Virginia State Week, March 7-13. The week will include a Founder's Day parade on March 7 and a series of three Bicentennial Balls on March 6. There will be more details on the Virginia State Week events in future Newsletters.
