## Tax Exemption Deadline of May 1 Proposed

Senior citizens who are residents of the Town of Vienna and who qualify for relief from real estate and automobile tax will be given until May 1 of each year to apply for tax exemptions if Council approves an amendment to extend the annual deadline.

The proposed change would make the Town's tax exemption rules and regulations the same as Fairfax County. The ordinance will be the subject of a public hearing May 17 at Town Hall, beginning at 8 p.m.

#### Banner Restrictions Waived

The Town's restriction against pennants, banners and streamers will be waived during certain holiday periods this year.

Businesses may use the decorations as long as they are recognized and identified as being patriotic decorations and not incorporating any advertising, between June 12 and July 16 to celebrate Flag Day, Independence Day and Bastille Day, and October 23 to 30 for Veteran's Day Week.

# General Election for New Mayor, Council May 4

The Town's voters will elect a new Mayor and three new Councilmen in the upcoming May 4 General Election at the Vienna Community Center.

Polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. All four of Vienna's voting precincts will be located at the Vienna Community Center, 120 Cherry Street SE. The Community Center is behind the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department.

The election is unique in that no incumbents are running for reelection. Winners will take office July 1 and serve two-year terms.

Two men, Paul M. Lyons and Charles A. Robinson Jr., are running for the Mayor's seat. The office is being vacated by Joseph R. Spriggs. Both Lyons and Robinson are presently serving the Town as Councilmen.

Six residents are running for three Town Council seats. Voters will get to cast three ballots among Elliot Ross Buckley, Ruth M. Donovan, Vincent J. Olson, Wanda C. Pellicciotto, Robert W. Robinson and Louis J. Zone.

Councilman Stephen G. McConahey, who earlier announced he was going to seek reelection, has dropped out of the race. His name will not appear on the ballot.

All winners are elected by popular vote. The election is non-partisan.
