

## Revenue Sharing

A \$35,971 Federal Revenue Sharing budget has been proposed for the July 1 to Dec. 31, 1976 period.

Some \$3,371 is being appropriated for channel improvements through the Moore-field area, \$20,000 for an engineering study for infiltration and inflow of the sanitary sewer system, and recreation appropriations of \$12,600 for a picnic shelter in Peterson Lane Park, a piano for the Community Center and crushed stone for hiking and biking trails.

### Bike Registration Set

The Vienna Police Department will have a free bike registration program at the Police Department June 5 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. On June 12 the Department will sponsor a Bike Rodeo for children 6-to 12-years-old at the Vienna Elementary School at 10 a.m.

# Vepac: Makes Report

The Vienna Economic Policy Advisory Commission has recommended to Town Council that the Town should attempt ''to attract a department store into Vienna to serve as a 'draw' and which indirectly will support the small specialized shops.''

The department store recommendation was just one of many by the Commission after considerable inquiry and analysis of the commercial and industrial businesses. The Commission was established in 1972 and charged with recommending long-range policies concerning the commercial activities of the Town of Vienna which would secure Vienna's future as a predominantly single-family residential community but which would insure location of compatible attractive commercial and industrial enterprises.

Another recommendation included a comprehensive study to determine exactly where the heavy traffic in Vienna originates and its destination, as well as a study of possible by-pass routes.

Other recommendations include:

\*Enforcement of speed limits in large parking lots and directional arrows and signs marking entrances and exits in Vienna shopping

\*An increase in parking of 25 percent in all future shopping centers,

\*Investigation and possible revamping of business license taxes of firms in the Industrial Park,

\*Expedient construction of the Mill Street extension to north Center Street,

\*Creation of an Economic Commission to be responsible for redeveloping those long-range commercial and industrial policies that will insure Vienna's future as an attractive residential community and at the same time provide for the location of compatible commercial and industrial enterprises.

\*A series of beautification suggestions, including, underground wiring, sprucing up shopping centers and the Industrial sections of Town, campaigns to upgrade deteriorating exteriors of some of the older businesses and full enforcement of the weed and debris ordinance.

The Commission offered several other suggestions and recommendations in its report. Council and the Planning Commission will probably act on the report at a later date.
