Fellow Citizens of Vienna:

In the recent Jaycee sponsored Community Attitude Survey, which represented an 8% sample of all sections of Vienna, more than half the people contacted felt they did not have enough information in certain areas to indicate a rating as to the services being provided the Town's citizens. Among these were recreational and cultural opportunities.

We hope this NEWSLETTER will acquaint you more fully with some of the recreational activities which are presently available to you as a resident of Vienna.

As happens with most areas which have experienced rapid growth, all services to the people do not expand at the same rate. This can be attributed to many factors, including that old bugaboo, money.

While the present Recreation and Park Program is not as large as we all would like it to be, it has been expanded each year over the last few years. Our Recreation Director and the Recreation Advisory Council have been considering all aspects and age groups in their planning, so that our future recreational, cultural and social opportunities will meet the needs of all our people.

I call your particular attention to the May 6th public meeting of the Recreation Advisory Council and urge all individuals and groups to submit their recommendations and ideas to this committee.

RECREATION IN VIENNA

RECREATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Recreation Advisory Council is composed of interested and qualified citizens appointed by the Town Council to make recommendations regarding the recreational, cultural and social needs of the Town so that each of us can pursue our particular area of interest.

PUBLIC MEETINGS are being scheduled by the Recreation Advisory Council so that interested residents and groups can present their views and ideas for consideration. The first of these meetings is scheduled for Thursday, May 6th, at 8:30 P.H., at the Town Hall. Written ideas may be submitted in advance to the Advisory Council in care of the Town Clerk (Town Hall, 127 Center Street, South).

PARK DEVELOPMENT

Vienna has 11 potential park sites, with Glyndon and Meadow Lane Parks presently developed. These parks have sports and picnic facilities, play equipment, and restrooms. The most recent improvement at these parks was the resurfacing and fencing of the tennis courts.

Both Glyndon and Meadow Lane Parks can be reserved for groups in the evenings and on weekends by contacting the switchboard operator at the Town Hall (385-6000). As the other park areas are developed, these will also be available for group use.

The abandonment of the sewage treatment plants has afforded 45 additional acres of park land for which development plans are now being prepared, and some preliminary development is under way.

RECREATION PROGRAMS (JUNE 21 through AUGUST 6)

Summer playground programs will be held at Meadow Lane and Glyndon Parks from June 21 through August 6. These will be supervised programs which will include craft instruction, picnics, games, tournaments, sports, athletics and special events. All children in Vienna are invited to participate in this summer fun program by registering at the parks. Other facilities available at the parks include basketball, soccer, shuffleboard, tennis, croquet, chess, checkers, volley ball, table tennis, tumbling mats, softball and craft supplies.

Class instruction programs will also be available at both parks and will include tennis, archery, BB target shooting, tumbling, dance, drama and art. (Please see the enclosed SUMMER CLASS PROGRAM giving time, place and fee schedule).

The Day Camp Program will again be held at Glyndon Park, and is limited to children from 6 to 11 years of age. Activities will include games, sports, athletics, arts and crafts, nature, quiet games, cook-outs, special events, singing, story-telling, and other organized activities for boys and girls.

A Vienna Teen Center will open at the Town Hall on June 21st from 1:00 to 4:30 P.M., Monday through Friday, and will provide table tennis, shuffleboard, chess, checkers, records, cokes, candies, bridge, magazines, table games and "free conversation". If there is sufficient interest and parental sponsorship, the Center will also be open from 7:00 to 9:30 P.M., Monday through Thursday evenings.

Summer band concerts at Glyndon Park, provided by our Madison High School Band, will be held on four Friday nights in July and promise to be an outstanding treat for all.

COMMUNITY CENTER

The Town's Recreation Department already is making plans for a fall program of activities to be held in the new Vienna Community Center. A Citizens' Advisory Board was recently appointed by the Town Council to recommend programs and regulations for the use of the building. In addition to supervised programs sponsored by the Vienna Recreation Department, the building will be available for suitable activities sponsored by various Vienna organizations.

Consideration is being given for use of the building during the school year in the morning and early afternoon hours for preschool and adult activities. After-school programs are proposed for teen and pre-teen children, with evening hours devoted to teen, family and adult group recreation.

- LOOKING TO THE FUTURE -

As Vienna's recreational programs grow and diversify we may look forward to the inclusion of the following activities: A CHILDREN'S PARADE, so that the children could present their creations, innovations, and ideas... CHILDREN'S THEATER, providing additional cultural opportunities for the young people... "TEENS UNLIMITED", an organization formed so the high school students would have the opportunity to formulate and carry out recreational, cultural, and social activities...TENNIS CLUB, organized for both adults and students to further develop tennis in Vienna.
