FY 82-83 Budget Adopted; No Tax Increase

The Town Council has adopted the Town budget for fiscal year 1982-83. This year's budget, which becomes effective July 1, totals \$7,399,067, about 12% more than last year. Included in this increase is funding for capital improvements in the amount of \$85,000 to replace the police telecommunications system, which has become unreliable due to age and unavailability of repair parts.

There is no change in the Town real estate tax rate of 33¢ per \$100 assessed valuation. However, water and sewer rate increases have been proposed to meet the substantial rise in the price the Town pays for water and for sewage treatment, and to make the water and sewer fund self-sustaining. The Town Manager has asked that Council hold a public hearing on this matter, perhaps at the August 16 Council meeting. New water rates are proposed at 85¢ for town residents and \$1,13 for out-of-town customers per 1.000 gallons. The sewer rate for all users is proposed at \$1.90 per 1.000 gallons.

The FY 82-83 budget emphasizes maintenance of existing facilities rather than new programs and construction.

A summary of the budget is given here. Complete copies of the budget are available for public inspection in the Town Clerk's office at Town Hall.

Other Council Action:

- * Accepted the annual budget and operation report of Historic Vienna, Inc. for fiscal year 1982-83.
- * Accepted a bid of \$14,900 by Newton Asphalt Co., Inc. of Virginia to reconstruct the tennis courts at Meadow Lane Park.
- * Reappointed Richard Fisher to the Planning Commission for a three-year term.

April 19, 1982

Ten-year old John McDonnell, of Westerholme Way, received special recognition for his bravery in saving another child from drowning in Wolftrap Run. John was given a letter of commendation, a pen with the Town Seal on it and the Mayor's personal gift of \$20.

Other Council Action:

- * Took no action on approving the final plat of Ridgewood Subdivision.
- * Reappropriated \$2,117 in budgeted funds to purchase maintenance equipment for the Department of Parks and Recreation.
- * Approved an intra-fund transfer of \$13,000 to purchase two K car sedans for the Police Department.

May 10, 1982

The Mayor was authorized to send a letter to the Fair-fax County Planning Commission concerning the special exception permit to be issued for the construction of the Vienna Metrorail Station at Nutley Street and I-66. Two of the Town's recommendations were subsequently adopted by the Board of Supervisors: to ensure adequate parking facilities and for access ramps to be in place prior to the opening of the station. The Town's third recommendation, for covered walkways, is under study.

Other Council Action:

- * Approved the installation of a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Nutley Street and Windover Avenue, N.W.
- * Directed the Town Manager to gather information about the Virginia Non-entitlement Community Block Grant Program and make a recommendation to Council on whether the Town should participate in the program.
- * Adopted an ordinance amending the Town Code relative to disorderly conduct.
- * Established a policy that no articles by Council members be published in the *Newsletter* during the months of February, March, April and May.

May 24, 1982

Council directed that the use of Town vehicle licenses be studied. Motorists are currently offered a choice of a windshield sticker, metal plate or bumper sticker. These different types of tags, displayed in various places on vehicles, make it difficult for the police to determine whether a vehicle has a current license.

Other Council Action:

- * Recommended to the Fairfax County Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors that there be no rezoning of the property located at Route 123 and Glengyle Drive (Item 82-II-13V of the County's annual plan review).
- * Reappointed Rodger Seeman to the Planning Commission for a three-year term.
- * Adopted an amendment to the Town Code whereby the Planning Commission must notify adjacent property owners when a wall waiver is requested.
- * Approved the use of \$10,000 from contingency reserve funds to replace and repair Well #6 on Park Street. This cost will be removed from the 1982-83 budget.
