# 1-66 Limited to Buses and Carpools During Rush Hours

The 10-mile segment of Interstate 66 between the Capital Beltway and the Theodore Roosevelt Bridge is scheduled to open December 22.

It is important for commuters to remember the limitations on the use of I-66 during weekday rush hours. From 6:30 to 9 a.m., inbound lanes will be restricted to buses and carpools carrying at least four persons. The same restrictions will apply to the outbound lanes between 3:30 and 6:30 p.m. There are no restrictions on weekends. Trucks are prohibited at all times on this segment of 1-66.

### Look for HOV Signs

Lanes reserved for buses and carpools are called HOV lanes (for High Occupancy Vehicles) and are designated by signs like this one:

HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE 4 OR MORE PERSONS PER VEHICLE



# Dec. Public Hearings Of Interest to Business

A public hearing on amendments to the Town's business license tax classifications will be held at the December 6 Town Council meeting, which begins at 8 p.m. in Town Hall.

A State-mandated reclassification of business license fees, which becomes effective January 1, requires the Town to combine three current classifications — personal services, repair services and business services — into one classification. A tax rate of 24¢ per \$100 gross receipts has been proposed for all businesses coming under the new classification.

At its regular meeting on December 20, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on proposed amendments to the zoning code concerning landscaping and front yard setbacks in commercial zones. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in Town Hall.

If adopted, the amendments would establish front yards (the distance from the building line to the front property line) in all commercial zones of 15 feet for one-story buildings, 25 feet for two-story buildings and 35 feet for three-story buildings. Landscaping would be required on at least 35% of the front yard.

These amendments were adopted on an emergency basis November 1 and became effective immediately. Council must now hold the public hearing and adopt the amendments in regular fashion for them to remain in effect.

Also at the December 20 meeting, Council will hold a public hearing on a proposal to allow increased sign space for businesses. Some town merchants feel that a more prominent display of business addresses would help solve the confusion caused by the duplication of street numbers on East and West Maple Avenue. If approved, the proposal would let businesses add an extra one and one-half square feet to their signs "for identification and location purposes only."

# Town Council Action

#### October 18, 1982

Mayor Charles Robinson announced that Officer Thomas P. Sherwood has been selected 1982 Vienna Policeman of the Year by the Vienna Woman's Club. The club's choice of Officer Sherwood was based on his "consistently outstanding daily performance... typifying the fine men who make our Police Department an excellent one."

Other Council Action:

\* Accepted the bid by Jennings Trane Air Conditioning, Inc., for \$4,000 to provide heating and air conditioning maintenance at the Vienna Community Center.

#### November 1, 1982

Council established a Citizen Advisory Panel on Commercial Land Development, to consist of the Chairmen of the Planning Commission and the Architectural Review Board and other community leaders. The panel will study commercial and industrial land development and recommend new ordinances and other procedures to "enhance the tax base and appearance of the Town." Council emphasized that it will not expand commercial zones or lift restrictions on commercial land use density or building height limits.

#### Other Council Action:

- \* Voted to pay 6% simple interest on water and sewer account deposits. No deposit will be required for residents moving from one location to another within the water and sewer system. Former residents with established credit as water and sewer customers who return to the system within two years are excused from making the \$50 deposit.
- \* Approved a sewer service surcharge for restaurants that discharge excessive amounts of grease into the sewer system.
- \* Denied the request for a wall waiver submitted on behalf of the owners of Park Terrace Apartments.
- \* Adopted an emergency ordinance relative to landscaping and front yard setbacks in commercial zones. Council will hold a public hearing on this matter December 20.
- \* Adopted a resolution requesting \$2,238 in State litter control grant funds to be used in conjunction with the spring 1983 townwide cleanup campaign.
