New Cross-County Bus Link

A new Metrobus link now provides cross-county transportation between Tysons Corner and Springfield Mall—and access to the many educational, employment, cultural, medical, professional office, recreational and social service facilities along or adjacent to the route. The new link is Route 26A,T, which operates along Gallows and Backlick Roads.

Route 26A operates on weekdays between 6 a.m. and 10 p.m. Route 26T operates on Saturday between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. Both routes operate on a 60-minute frequency. The single base fare for 26A,T is 65¢, and 30¢ for elderly and handicapped riders.
