

VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

February 11, 2022

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from February 4, 2022 to February 10, 2022. Readers are reminded that an "arrest" is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean that an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post-arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court's website.

On July 1, 2021, citizens will be able to access Community Policing data via https://data.virginia.gov/stories/s/rden-cz3h. The Vienna Police Department had started complying with this state law in July of 2020. The portal will contain all non-consensual investigatory stops made by the Vienna Police Departments and other law enforcement agencies in the commonwealth.

Car Thefts and Tamperings

The National Capital Area and specifically the Northern Virginia area, has seen increased vehicle tampering incidents and vehicle thefts. In some incidents, suspects entered homes through unlocked doors and open garage doors to steal property and keys to vehicles. The suspects then used the vehicle keys to gain entry into vehicles and use them to get away. The Vienna Police Department would like to remind our community members to please stay vigilant, close, and lock all doors of residences and garages to prevent criminals from targeting your property.

A resident reported that an unauthorized charge was made on his PayPal account

Fraud 22-000858

Between January 11 at 9:00 a.m. and January 19 at 5:00 p.m.

An elderly resident was contacted by a person who claimed to be from his bank. The person advised him that his account had been compromised and that he should wire money from his accounts to an overseas account. The resident made three large account transactions before bank personnel and family members discovered the fraud and intervened.

A resident reported that his iPad was missing.

Arrest – Driving While Intoxicated and Accident 22-000843 Follin Lane and Echols Street, SE February 1 7:30 p.m.

Officers responded to the report of an accident involving two vehicles. Vehicle-2 was southbound on Follin Lane, stopped for the red traffic signal at Echols Street. Vehicle-1 ran into the rear of Vehicle-2. Rescue personnel responded and treated Driver-2 at the scene, but he refused transport to the hospital. Upon the officer's interaction with Driver-1, they detected signs of impairment. Driver-1 failed to complete a series of field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest.

Ofc. Reed transported the 43-year-old man from Lee Highway in Falls Church, Virginia to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center, where he was charged with Driving While Intoxicated.

An officer observed a driver commit a traffic offense and initiated a traffic stop. Upon the officer's interaction with the driver, he detected signs of impairment. The driver failed a series of field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest.

A resident made a purchase from a seller on Facebook Marketplace. After the resident wired the payment, the seller deleted their Facebook account which deleted the transaction.

Officers responded to the report of an assault at the hypothermia shelter. One of the guests assaulted another guest. The man who was assaulted received minor injuries to his face. Rescue responded and assessed the man, but he refused to be transported to the hospital. The injured man refused to pursue charges and was permitted to stay at the shelter. The other man was advised to leave.

Business Alarm 22-000994 Westwood Country Club 800 Maple Avenue, East February 5 11:41 p.m.

Officers responded to the report of an alarm and found an unsecured door. The officers searched the building and found that nothing appeared to have been disturbed.

An employee reported that a man was using a fake passport in an attempt to obtain money from one of their customer's accounts. The man left the bank before employees notified the police.

A woman and her juvenile daughter were in a verbal dispute. The daughter got upset and began throwing items out of the vehicle. After speaking to officers, the juvenile calmed down and left the area with her mother.

Officers responded with rescue personnel to a fight in progress where one person was injured. Officers found an unconscious man in the bedroom of the apartment. Others in the apartment reported that the man was drinking alcoholic beverages, became agitated, and began assaulting one of the other residents. During the assault, the man fell and hit his head. As the man regained consciousness, he became disorderly with the officers and rescue personnel. Officers assisted in restraining the man while rescue personnel treated him and transported him to the hospital with a non-life-threatening injury.

Grand Larceny 22-001096 Massage Envy 126 Branch Road, SE February 8 2:35 p.m.

A citizen advised that he left his backpack outside of Massage Envy and entered the business. When he came back out, he found that his backpack had been stolen. The backpack contained his wallet, various forms of identification and credit cards, U.S. currency, and an electronic device.

An officer observed a driver commit a traffic offense and initiated a traffic stop. A search of the driver's license status revealed a protective order in Fairfax County that had been issued against him. The officer served the paperwork on the driver and concluded the traffic stop.

An employee reported an incident that she had with another driver that continued from Chain Bridge Road in Oakton to the credit union. The other driver became angry with her, honking his horn and following her. No actual crime was committed. The officer advised the Navy Federal Security of the incident.

An employee reported that someone stole necklaces from a package in the employee's office.

Officers responded to the report of a burglary at the restaurant that is currently closed for renovations. A cash register, U.S. currency, and various bottles of liquor were taken.

Arrest - Emotionally Disturbed Person / Temporary Detention Order 22-001156 Meadow Lane, SW

February 10 7:29 a.m.

A resident requested transportation to a medical facility for a mental evaluation. The resident became increasingly agitated and assaulted one of the officers.

Ofc. Carne transported the woman to an area medical facility where her behavior became increasingly violent toward the staff and the officers, making it unsafe to keep her at the facility as a voluntary patient. The officer placed the woman under arrest and began to transport her to another facility. Once in the cruiser, the woman began to harm herself, resulting in an injury. The officer immediately called for rescue personnel who responded and transported the woman to an area hospital for medical treatment. A Temporary Detention Order was issued and served on the woman. While at the hospital the woman continued to assault officers and medical staff.

A resident reported that a rebate check was delivered to her residence addressed to someone who has never resided there.

Trespassing 22-001180 Molly's Yogurt 521 Maple Avenue, West February 10 7:08 p.m.

An employee reported issues with a man who continues to come into the business after being told repeatedly not to return. The man was trespassed from the premises. An officer advised the man that he would be charged with trespass if he returned.

CRASHES

100 Block Locust Street, SW 22-000862

Vehicle-1 was traveling eastbound on Locust Street when it struck Vehicle-2 (a legally parked vehicle that was occupied), and pushed Vehicle-2 into Vehicle-3 (also legally parked). One of the passengers in Vehicle-2 was transported to an area hospital for an evaluation.

Driver-1 was issued a summons charging Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.

Vehicle-1 was traveling westbound on Hine Street. Vehicle-2 was traveling northbound on Follin Lane when the two vehicles collided. A passenger in Vehicle-1 was evaluated by rescue personnel but refused transport.

Maple Avenue and Branch Road, SE 22-001133 February 9 3:10 p.m.

Vehicle-2, a tractor-trailer, was traveling northbound in the right lane of Branch Road, turning right onto Maple Avenue. Vehicle-1 was behind Vehicle-2. As Vehicle-2 made a wide right turn, it created space in the right turn lane. Driver-1 attempted to turn at the same time and the two vehicles collided.

Driver-1 was issued a summons charging Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.

Church Street and Center Street, NW 22-001136 February 9 7:00 p.m.

Vehicle-1 was eastbound on Church Street, turning southbound onto Center Street. Vehicle-2 was traveling southbound on Center Street when the two vehicles collided in the intersection.

Tapawingo Road and Ware Street, SW 22-001185 February 10 8:40 p.m.

Vehicle-1 was traveling northbound on Ware Street. Vehicle-2 was traveling eastbound on Tapawingo Road. The two vehicles collided in the intersection, causing Vehicle-2 to swerve and strike a utility pole.

Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department Media Information Release Warning: McAfee Scam Email

Detectives with the Vienna Police Department are investigating two separate scam incidents related to a "McAfee Antivirus" email. Detectives advised that the scam usually begins with an email that purports to be from McAfee informing citizens that they are being charged \$300 for "McAfee Total Protection anti-virus software" unless they cancel the order by calling a phone number provided in the email. If you call the number provided, you will be greeted by a scammer posing as a McAfee employee who will ask for personal information, including a bank account number supposedly to verify the account. After receiving the personal information, the scammer will request a wire transfer of funds which will be nearly impossible to reverse once it is completed. The Vienna Police Department provides the following guidelines for spotting and avoiding a "phishing" email:

- 1) Always check the sender's email. Phishing emails may look like they are from a legitimate company you trust. Most of the time, you can tell it is a phishing scam if the sender's email address consists of random numbers and letters. If you are unsure, research the email of the company.
- 2) Look for spelling and grammatical errors. Phishing emails tend to have multiple spelling and grammatical errors in them.
- 3) Phishing emails will attempt to trick you through a sense of urgency in order to click on a link or open an attachment. You can inspect the link by hovering the mouse over it without clicking on it—only open attachments from trusted and verified sources.
- 4) Phishing emails may trick you by saying:
 - a. They've noticed suspicious activity or login attempts
 - b. Claim there are account problems or problems with payment information
 - c. Ask to confirm personal information
 - d. Attach fake invoices
 - e. Provide a link to allow for a payment
 - f. Threaten to arrest
 - g. Offer money or free items

If you feel you have fallen victim to a phishing scam, please call the police non-emergency number, 703-255-6366, to report it. You can also report phishing emails to your email provider or the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) using their website. Operations Modifications

March 18, 2020

In the interest of public safety for our residents, businesses, and visitors, the Vienna Police Department has modified its operations to increase social distancing and reduce the chance of spreading the COVID-19 virus.

This modified operation entails taking certain police reports for relatively minor and non-violent crimes by telephone. There will be cases where there is no need for evidence collection, not a crime in progress, but the incident still needs to be documented.

If you are calling to file a police report, Communications personnel will ask you questions to help determine if your call meets the criteria for a telephone follow-up and if so, you may be advised that an officer will call you back to assess the need to respond in person or complete the report via telephone. If you feel that an officer is required, you may make the request, and an officer will respond. The incident report over the telephone will go into the same records management system and will be tracked the same as if an officer responded.

If a police officer responds to your location, please be prepared to step outside to meet the officer to encourage social distancing and avoid the spread of the virus.

By using telephone reporting, you will help us limit exposure. We thank you for your understanding and support as we continue to maintain our mission of providing a safe community for all of our citizens, businesses, and visitors.

Out of an abundance of caution, we have also suspended some low-priority services, which include: Ride-Along, PIO public engagements, VIN verifications, and child safety seat installations. Access to our police lobby will be restricted to immediate police assistance only. We do encourage our citizens to call the police department with questions at 703-255-6366 instead of visiting our lobby.

The Vienna Police Department continues to remain staffed, operational, and ready to respond to all emergencies, in-progress incidents, and priority calls. Day and night patrols remain at full strength so you should not hesitate to call for assistance.

The process of handling some calls for service over the phone and limiting other services is temporary and will be continually reevaluated in the coming weeks.
