Media General Cable of Fairfax County, Inc., was awarded the franchise for cable television service in Vienna. It is estimated that construction of the cable system will be completed in about a year.

- * Adopted a resolution authorizing the sale of \$3 million public improvement bonds, adopted a bond payment schedule and selected the Bank of Virginia as the Paying agent.
- * Requested the Fairfax County Electoral Board to appoint the following persons as election officials for the 1983 Town election: Chief Election Official, Mrs. Regina Jordan; Assistant Chief, Mrs. Emerald Giss; Clerks, Mrs. Ivodine S. Lyle, Mrs. Eileen Rollman, Mrs. JoAnn Dinsmore, Mrs. Thelma Haslam, Mrs. Lois Holland, Mrs. Delores Hill; Alternates, Mrs. Mary Thompson, Mrs. Teresa Dobson. Set the rate of compensation for election officials and other election expenses.
- * Requested the Transportation Safety Commission to study directionalizing traffic on Maple Avenue during rush hours and other possible ways of improving traffic problems on that street. The study is not to include consideration of adding through traffic to side streets.

March 31, 1983

At a special meeting, Council committed itself to issue \$3 million worth of public improvement bonds and authorized the Town Manager to have prepared a bond acticipation note in the amount of \$2 million for a period of two years.

- * Authorized the Town Manager to negotiate acquisition of electronic data processing and word processing services from Data Management Design, Inc., and hardware for these services from WANG Corp. and to negotiate the disposition of the Town's present equipment. Council is to approve any contracts.

April 4, 1983

Council approved the purchase of property from the city of Falls Church for construction of a 1.5-million gallon water storage tank. Installation of the new tank will help provide relief from recurring water shortages.

- * Acknowledged receipt of the annual report of Historic Vienna, Inc.
- * Adopted an ordinance to regulate video games.
- * Adopted an ordinance concerning bingo games and raffles.
- * Approved an agreement between the Town and VEPCO, negotiated by the Virginia Municipal League, for the cost of electricity to the municipality.

April 11, 1983

At a special meeting, Council adopted the resolution authorizing the sale of \$2 million public improvement bond anticipation notes.

Community Center Use

The Vienna Community Center permits rental of its gymnasium and game room for club and private social events such as dances, receptions, reunions, installations, parties and banquets. Because these activities are generally closed to the public, they are classified as private social functions and charged higher building use fees than events open to the general public.

For in-town groups and individuals, the gym rental for social functions is \$125 plus \$15 for each hour of reservation. The game room rents for \$100 plus \$10 each hour. Rent includes use of available Community Center equipment and access to the kitchen.
