TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

April 18, 1983

Council established as policy that the second Council meeting in July and the first meeting in August each year be canceled. This policy will allow Council members to take summer vacations with their families without having to miss any meetings. (The Town Charter requires at least one Council meeting per month.)

Other Council Action:

- * Approved the record plat of Council Square II-A subdivision, subject to posting of required bonds and approval by the Architectural Review Board.
- * Rejected all bids for a walk/don't walk light at Maple Avenue and Center Street and directed the Town Manager not to reissue the bids. Asked the Transportation Safety Commission to study the intersection again and make some recommendation for protection of elderly citizens attempting to cross the street.
- * Waived collection of \$291.84 in retirement pay erroneously paid to a former Town employee.
- * Approved transfer of funds within the current budget as requested by the Director of Finance, except for \$15,500 to the traffic light account.

May 9, 1983

Motorola's bid for replacement of the Police Department's communication system was accepted, the cost of \$78,082 to come from bond note revenue. This new system will replace 10- to 20-year old equipment, resulting in greater safety and efficiency for citizens and officers on patrol.


