Over 300 active rabies cases have been found this year among wild animals in Fairfax County. Make sure your dog or cat is protected by a current rabies vaccination as required by law.

A special low-cost rabies inoculation clinic will be held on Sunday, November 13, from 12 noon to 4 p.m. at the County Animal Shelter, 4500 West Ox Rd. in Fairfax. Dogs over a year old will receive a three-year vaccine for \$6. Dogs under a year old and all cats will receive a one-year vaccine for \$3.

In bringing animals to the clinic, dogs should be on a leash and cats confined to a box or basket.

#### August 2 & 8, 1983

Council held a special meeting over these two dates to consider its position in the case of *Maple Avenue West Associates vs. Town of Vienna*. Council voted to take no further action toward compromise but to let the case be decided in court.

#### August 15, 1983

- \*Following a Court decision against the Town, Council directed the Town Attorney and Town Manager to negotiate a settlement with Maple Avenue West Associates concerning their property behind the Marco Polo restaurant. A public hearing was set for September 26 on the proposal to move the commercial-residential zoning boundary to the north side of Church Street to make the property eligible for the transitional zoning category.
- \* Following a public hearing, Council approved the rezoning of approximately 7,000 square feet of land occupied by the Vienna Villager Apartments from C-1 to RM-2 on Council's own motion, in which the owner joined and made certain proffers. Based on the proffer statement, approved a lot coverage waiver to allow 56% in lieu of 25%.
- \* Approved a modified proffer statement and development plan submitted by Locust Street Joint Venture showing that the six foot brick wall will be constructed along the northeasterly boundary on the property line and a maximum of 26 units between 924 and 1,237 square feet in size with Victorian style architecture.
- \* Approved a three-year rental contract for a Xerox 1045 copier at an approximate cost of \$554.57 per month for two years and \$642.36 per month the third year. The cost includes trade-in and service agreement.

- \* Accepted a bid by E.E. Lyons Construction Co., Inc., of \$33,000 for concrete repair work.
- \* Accepted a bid by Jennings Trane Service of Fairfax of \$56,699 for heating and air conditioning service for the Community Center.
- \* Granted draft authority and safe deposit box access to the Town Clerk, Marian S. Wallace, formerly Marian R. Sellers. Previously granted authority for other Town officials remains unchanged.

#### September 12, 1983

- \* Approved perpendicular parking for residents of Troy Court and Elaine Circle. Requested the Fire Department to study all cul-de-sacs in town to determine of this perpendicular parking would create a problem for emergency equipment entering and exiting cul-de-sacs.
- \* Approved a request for a street light between 302 and 306 Tapawingo Rd., S.W.
- \* Adopted a statement of position to be presented at the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation's public hearing September 14 on plans for the I-66/Nutley Street interchange.
- \* Approved the installation of a booster pump to correct a water pressure problem on Westwood Terrace. Directed that Fairfax County officials be contacted and every effort be made to assure that construction bonds involving public works currently under construction by the same developer that will ultimately be connected to the Town water system not be released until the Town has a chance to inspect them for adequate pressure. Also directed that every effort be made to secure reimbursement from the developer for the \$9,500 booster pump.
- \* Approved the lease/purchase of a Model V-3000 FMC street sweeper from Richmond Machinery & Equipment Co., Inc., for the total amount of \$71,156.25 over a five-year period subject to the first year's payments coming from federal revenue sharing funds.
- \* Extended the employment of James A. Grant with the Town indefinitely, subject to annual review.
- \* Reappointed Lowell Schweickart to the board of Historic Vienna, Inc., for a three-year term and recommended Robert Delaney to the Circuit Court for reappointment to the Board of Zoning Appeals for a five-year term. A special committee will be appointed to review the terms of membership of all boards and commissions and related matters. The committee will consist of three persons, to be named at a work session.

If you are looking for other commuters in your neighborhood to form a carpool or to expand your current carpool, RIDESOURCES can help.

RIDESOURCES was established by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors in 1982 and is operated by the County's Office of Transportation. RIDESOURCES offers a free ridematching service to identify commuters who live in the same area, travel the same routes and have similar destinations and common work hours.

Ridematching is done by computer, and applicants receive a list of commuters to contact by phone. RIDE-SOURCES also maintains an inventory of vanpools that originate in Fairfax County and travel to major

employment centers in the metropolitan area.
