Spring Cleanup This Month

Residents are reminded that the Town's Spring Cleanup will begin on Monday, April 16, in southwest Vienna. Cleanup crews will then proceed through the northwest, northeast and southeast sections of town.

The duration of the cleanup will depend on the volume of debris. To ensure pickup, all residents are asked to have their discards at the curbside on April 16. Residents may call the Public Works Department, 938-8000 ext. 241, to check on the progress of the cleanup.

Brush, building materials, furniture, appliances and other cleanup items should be placed at the curbside, away from regular trash, fire hydrants, water meters, gas valves and fences. Brush

and branches should be separated from other discards.

Furniture, appliances, carpets and other household items in good condition may be donated to CHO (Committee to Help Others). Call Earl Sawyer, 573-6198, or Walker Smith, 560-1980, for immediate pickup of donations. CHO is an all-volunteer, non-profit charitable organization helping needy families in the Vienna area.

VVFD Needs Support To Continue Services

Vienna residents will soon be receiving notices in the mail announcing the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department's annual fund drive. VVFD needs the support of citizens to continue to provide top-quality assistance by trained personnel using modern equipment.

Volunteer firefighters supplement paid personnel to help keep costs down. In addition, a modern, well-trained, active volunteer force means lower insurance rates for the community.

The department is largely dependent on contributions to meet mortgage payments and to replace worn equipment. VVFD is currently replacing chassis for both of its ambulances, and needs to replace at least one of its pumpers, which could easily cost in excess of \$150,000.

This year the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department is celebrating its 80th anniversary. VVFD asks you to help continue its tradition of excellence in fire prevention, fire suppression and emergency medical services by making a contribution or becoming a member.

Town of Vienna Election Is Tuesday, May 1

The annual Town election will be held Tuesday, May 1. All voting will take place at the Vienna Community Center from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

This year, voters will elect three Town Council members and the Mayor for two-year terms beginning July 1. Election results will be available on the Vienna Newsline, 938-4499, one to two hours after the polls close.

Voters who are physically unable to go to the polls or who will be out of town on election day may vote an absentee ballot by mail. To request a ballot, call the Fairfax County General Registrar's office at 385-8100. Or, you may vote an absentee ballot in person at the Registrar's office, 4031 University Dr. in Fairfax, weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday, April 21 and 28, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

THE CANDIDATES

For Mayor

Charles A. Robinson, Jr., is running unopposed for a fifth term as Mayor. He has served on Council since 1962 and was previously a member of the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Planning Commission. He is currently president of the Virginia Municipal League. Mayor Robinson is an attorney in Vienna and Deputy General Manager of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association. He lives at 124 Courthouse Rd., S.W., and is a 33-year resident of the town.

For Town Council

E. Ross Buckley has been a Council member since 1976. Prior to then he was president of Westbriar Civic Association and a member of the Economic Policy Advisory Commission, Bicentennial Commission, and Charter and Legislative Review Commission. A 12-year resident of Vienna, Councilman Buckley lives at 108 St. Andrews Dr., N.E., and is an attorney and member of the federal Occupational Safety and Health Review Commission.

George Juskalian was a candidate for Council last year. A retired U.S. Army colonel, he is active in a number of veterans groups. He is 1st vice president of the Vienna Chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons, chairman of the adult committee for Vienna Boy Scout Troop 979, and a parent volunteer at Westbriar Elementary School. A six-year town resident, he lives at 111 St. Andrews Dr., N.E.

George E. Lovelace is completing his first term on Council. Prior to his election, he was president of Malcolm-Windover Civic Association and chaired the Planning Commission. He also served on the Fairfax County Planning Commission. A retired U.S. Army Lt. Col., Councilman Lovelace is an engineer with Computer Sciences Corporation. He has been a Vienna resident for nine years and lives at 425 West St., N.W.

Vincent J. Olson was first elected to Council in 1976. He previously served on the Planning Commission. While on Council, he has chaired the Charter Review Committee and is currently the Town's liaison to the Fairfax County School Board. Councilman Olson lives at 603 Valley Dr., S.E., and is a distributor for the *Washington Post*. He has been a Vienna resident for 26 years.

Trash Collection Routes

Vienna is divided into Monday-Thursday, Tuesday-Friday and Wednesday-Saturday trash collection routes to provide efficient twice-weekly pickup for all town residents.

Because of several Monday holidays and Thanksgiving, the Monday-Thursday route will miss 7 of the total 105 trash collection days in 1984. Short of rotating pickup days among the three routes, which is likely to cause great confusion, the Town has been unable to find a cost-effective way to make up for the lost days.

The least expensive approach would be to schedule pickups on holidays. This would add approximately \$13,000 per year in wages and benefits to the current cost of trash collection.

Pickups made the day following a holiday would cost considerably more for the first year's implementation, since additional personnel and equipment would be needed to cover two routes on the same day.

Car Repair Crackdown

The Town has begun a "spring offensive" against illegal auto repair shops in residential zones. Residents may repair their own vehicles on their property, but servicing other vehicles for profit is prohibited.

All vehicles must display current tags and inspection stickers. A special license is required for stored vehicles unless they are kept within a completely enclosed structure.

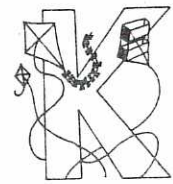
