

Rabies Clinic At Fire Station

A rabies vaccination clinic for dogs and cats will be held on Sunday, May 20, from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department. Town ordinance requires all dogs and cats over six months old to be vaccinated.

Vaccine for animals over a year old costs \$6 and gives protection from rabies for three years. Vaccine for animals under a year old costs \$4 and protects for one year.

Certificates will be given to pet owners at the clinic to verify each vaccination. Town of Vienna dog licenses will also be sold at the clinic for \$5 each.

In bringing animals to the clinic, dogs should be on a leash and cats confined to a box or basket.

The clinic is sponsored by the Northern Virginia Veterinary Medical Association and the Fairfax County Helath Department with the support of the Volunteer Fire Department and its Ladies Auxiliary.

Boundary Changes Considered

The Vienna Town Council and the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors are considering possible adjustments of the town-county boundary.

At present, the boundary line splits individual pieces of property as well as subdivisions, causing confusion for some residents and making assessment of taxes and delivery of public services less efficient.
