
REMINDER: TOWN ELECTION ON TUESDAY, JUNE 13th

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Town of Vienna has embarked upon a far-reaching Town Beautification and Community Betterment Campaign, and

WHEREAS, the aim of this continuing campaign is "MY KIND OF TOWN - VIENNA", and

WHEREAS, each resident, group and organization in the Town of Vienna are being urged to participate in the program, and

WHEREAS, all business establishments within the Town of Vienna are being urged to cooperate to the fullest extent possible,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES C. MARTINELLI, MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF VIENNA, VIRGINIA, DO PROCLAIM THAT SATURDAY, APRIL 15, 1967, WILL BE SET ASIDE AS "KICK-OFF DAY" FOR THE "MY KIND OF TOWN - VIENNA" CAMPAIGN, and

MY KIND OF TOWN

The campaign for the beautification and betterment of "My Kind of Town - Vienna" is beginning to gain momentum. Mayor Martinelli and "Egbert", along with representatives of the Vienna Police Association, have begun visiting all of the elementary schools, emphasizing anti-litter and "What I can do to help".

Many organizations have already adopted projects and other groups are studying possible areas of improvement. Each resident can contribute greatly by concentrating on his home.

The town has prepared a supply of certificates which will be presented regularly to individuals as well as organizations who make a significant contribution to the campaign. The first certificate was presented on Tuesday, April 4th, to Lieutenant Governor Pollard, who accepted it on behalf of Governor Godwin, in recognition of the Governor's proclamation designating April as Clean-up Month for the State of Virginia. The next two will be presented to the Vienna Trust Company and the First National Bank of Vienna for furnishing litter bags, which are being distributed as Town tags are issued.

CLEAN-UP PARADE

Saturday, April 15th has been designated as "Kick-Off Day" for the campaign. The kick-off will be formally inaugurated by a "Clean-up" Parade led by the Town Council and the Vienna Jaycees. These two groups will sweep the street - Maple Avenue from Lawyers Road to Glyndon Street - beginning at 11:00 a.m. Many groups will have marching units and decorated cars, all emphasizing "My Kind of Town".

ARLINGTON SYMPHONY CONCERT

On Sunday, May 21st at 3:30 p.m., the Vienna Business and Professional Women's Club will sponsor the Arlington Symphony in a special concert at James Madison High School. This concert is being presented for the purpose of providing a music scholarship award to a James Madison student who plans to continue his music education upon graduation from high school. The Arlington Symphony is under the direction of Karl Rucht.

Tickets will be \$2.00 each and will be available May first.

Officials of the Town of Vienna are pleased to have clubs or local organizations bring cultural events to the Town. Our thanks to the Vienna Business and Professional Women's Club for sponsoring this concert which promises to be a delightful evening of music by the old masters, and one which should be enjoyed by all.

The entire town is urged to turn out for this parade. The Town Council wants to again join with "Egbert" in announcing that "If everyone helps, everyone wins - a better town".

SPRING CLEAN-UP WEEK

The annual spring clean-up campaign this year will be divided into two sections - yards and residences. Every Vienna resident is urged to look around his back yard and clean up every board, box and any other refuse that no longer has value. This material, together with tree limbs and shrub trimmings, should be placed on the curb or at the street line by the morning of Friday, April 14th. This material will be picked up Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Leaves may also be raked to the roadside for pickup.

Discarded household articles should be placed at the curb line during the following week. Beginning on Monday morning, April 17th, the Town trash crews, following the regular pickup schedule, will pick up household articles which normally require a "special pickup". Leaf removal may not be completed entirely during this week, but crews will continue until they have covered the entire town once. They will not double back.

MOVING AHEAD

At the regular Council meeting of May 3rd, the Town Council approved three new projects of interest to Vienna residents. It awarded two road construction projects totalling \$129,668 to Sidney R. Johnson, Inc., the company which completed last summer's program. These projects are Kingsley Road from Park to Cottage, and Court House Road from Glen Avenue to Nutley. Kingsley Road is the principal route for many youngsters who will be attending the new Cunningham Park School.

The Council also approved the plans and authorized the Town Manager to advertise for bids for the new two-story addition to the Community Center.

These three projects will all be financed from General Fund Bond funds.
