## Use Fireworks Safely

During 1983, nine people were injured by fireworks in Fairfax County. Five of them were 19 years old or younger. Most of the injuries were to the hands and eyes, and several left permanent damage.

Any fireworks that explode, emit a flame or spark higher than 12 feet, or perform as a projectile are prohibited by the County fire prevention code. A permit is required for the sale of approved fireworks, and these permits are only valid from June 1 to July 15 of each year.

Firecrackers, cherry bombs, skyrockets and many other fireworks are not available in Northern Virginia because they are illegal. Even the possession of unapproved fireworks is prohibited in Fairfax County, and the person possessing them may be fined up to \$1,000.

# Revised Fees Effective July 1

Revised fees for water and sewer connections, special trash pickups, site plans and subdivision plats become effective July 1. The new fee schedule is as follows:

- Sewer availability, \$2,500; tap inspection fee, \$35 per tap. These fees are for both residential and commercial connections.
- Special pickup, \$30 per dump truck load.
- Preliminary subdivision plat, 50 plus \$10 per lot; revisions, \$100; final plat, \$75 plus \$5 per lot; reapproval, \$150.
- Preliminary site plan, \$250 plus \$10 for each 1,000 sq. ft. gross floor area; revisions, \$100; final site plan, \$75 plus \$5 for each 1,000 sq. ft. gross floor area; reapproval, \$150.

Also effective July 1, the Architectural Review Board will have a fee of \$75 for new development and \$35 for existing development.


