# Group Ski Trip To Massanutten


# **Smoke Detectors Save Many Lives Each Year**

Over 6,000 deaths from fire occur in homes each year. Most people die from smoke and toxic gases rather than from the fire itself. Fifty-nine people in Fairfax County are alive today because smoke detectors saved their lives last year.


Smoke detectors may be purchased in most retail stores at prices ranging from \$8 to \$30. Smoke detectors should be placed near bedrooms, either in the middle of the ceiling or 6 to 12 inches below the ceiling on a wall. This enables the detector to sense smoke as it approaches the sleeping area.

Your smoke detector must be maintained properly to protect you and your family. Replace batteries at least annually and bulbs (necessary in some of the older models) according to the manufacturer's instructions.

# Public Hearing On Locust St. Set for January

The Town Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, January 21, on a petition from residents of Locust St., S.W., for relief from heavy traffic and its hazards.

The hearing will begin at 8 p.m. at Town Hall. All interested citizens, especially those living on Locust and adjoining streets are encouraged to attend.

The Transportation Safety Commission has recommended that the 100 block of Locust (between Center and Cottage Streets) be made one-way westbound (toward Cottage), contingent on 90% approval by Locust St. residents and on giving nearby residents an opportunity to speak on the issue.



#### October 15, 1984

- Appointed Maj. Donald Harper Chief of Police, effective upon his retirement from the Fairfax County Police Department. Council unanimously selected Maj. Harper from among over 200 applicants.
- Conducted a public hearing on proposed Town Code amendments concerning home occupations. Council will discuss the matter further at a work session on December 10.
- Denied a request for a reduction in water and sewer connection fees for the purchasers of a home on Ninovan Rd.
- Raised the speed limit in the Westbriar area from 15 to 25 mph. Neither the speed limit nor the "Do Not Enter" signs in this area will be considered again for a year except on request by a majority of Council.
- Awarded a contract for \$48,280 to Peake-Howell Partnership for architectural services for the addition to the Community Center.
- Authorized the Mayor to write a letter to Congressman Wolf indicating Council's support for use of the ramp from Trap Rd. onto Dulles Toll Rd. for car pools.
- Approved the installation, on an experimental basis, of a green arrow and "Right Turn on Green Arrow Only" sign at the Maple Ave./Nutley St. intersection. The Transportation Safety Commission is to make a final recommendation within 60 days of installation.
- Amended the Town Code to prohibit display of motor vehicles for sale in public parking lots.
- Approved an additional \$24,134.74 for the Cottage St. rehabilitation project and an additional \$5,384.15 for the Marshall Rd. rehabilitation project.
- Approved the public marketing of the Moorefield House. Solicitations of interest will be published in the National Trust's *Preservation News* and other papers this winter.
