

Copies of the proposed budget will be available for public inspection in the Management Services Office at Town Hall beginning May 13.





Town Issues Bond Notes

On April 11, the Town of Vienna issued \$2.5 million in public improvement bond anticipation notes. The Town received Moody's highest rating on these notes.

Nine of the country's most prestigious financial institutions, including Merrill Lynch and First National Bank of Chicago, bid on the notes. The low bid accepted by the Town Council was 6.11%, received from the Lynchburg firm of Scott and Stringfellow. This is a lower rate than the City of Alexandria received on a recent issue of similar size.

Vienna's bond funds will be used for additions and improvements to the water and sewer system, storm water control system, parks and other public facilities.
