## Passing the Season's First Test

ublic Works staff members always brace for impact when snow and ice are in the forecast, and the season's first test came December 15 – a week before the first day of winter! As most people were finishing up holiday cards and making plans for holiday meals and travel, Town of Vienna snow removal crews were in the process of pre-treating roads and planning for the worst-case scenario-icy weather.

"We deployed our brine trucks with newly trained staff aboard, and everything went according to plan," said operations superintendent Jonathan Wooden. "We spent the night monitoring the situation at the Northside Property Yard, and it turned out to be a non-event because the temperature stayed just above freezing, but it was a good opportunity for our new employees to put their training to the test, and there were no surprises."

A community's ability to effectively respond to weather emergencies depends on proper training and prior preparation. Wooden says Public Works crews tuned up snow-removal equipment and reviewed response plans in the fall, and the staff passed the season's first test in December with flying colors! Regardless of whether the forecast calls for snow, ice or a wintry mix, Wooden says Public Works is prepared to work around the clock in 12-hour shifts

to address whatever situation winter brings. Residents and businesses can do their part when removing snow from private property by ensuring shoveled snow does not block public streets, sidewalks and rights-of-ways. 🔰

## A Little Scruff Goes a Long Way

or the second year in a row, Town of Vienna Police officers went "undercover" and took part in #NoShaveNovember to raise awareness about prostate cancer and to generate support for research to find a cure as part of the Zero Cancer Grow-and-Give Campaign. The organization also provides educational materials to men and their families and offers screenings for men who would otherwise be unable to afford them.

Police Chief Jim Morris suspended the dress-code rule, relaxing the department's no-beard policy for the entire month of November so officers could participate, and boy did they raise a lot of money! This year's goal was to raise \$5,000 for the non-profit organization. The department raised the most money in the competition and took home first place. They also exceeded their goal, raising \$5,869.57.

"Our small department raised more money for the cancer charity than any other participating public safety organization in the country," said Vienna Police Chief Jim Morris, "and that's thanks to the generosity of our community."

Nearly 250,000 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States this year alone, and the illness is very treatable if diagnosed early. This year's campaign shows that a little scruff in a small Town can go a long way and make a huge impact in the fight to find a cure for prostate cancer.  $\checkmark$

## **Stormwater Reports Due for Homeowners**

ewer homes may be beautiful, but they often come with an increase in impervious areas, such as roofs and driveways, that reduces the land's ability to effectively disperse stormwater. The stormwater must go somewhere, and if it isn't managed well, it can cause big problems.

That's why stormwater management facilities, or best management practices (BMPs), are installed with new home construction to control the quality and quantity of stormwater runoff. Common examples of BMPs include infiltration trenches, bioretention rain gardens and planter boxes. For the most part, these systems are worry-free, and proper maintenance helps to extend their life. If not properly managed, BMPs can become overgrown or clogged, leading to failures that can have a negative impact on the surrounding environment.

To ensure proper stormwater management, property owners with BMPs are required to submit certified inspection reports by a qualified professional engineer, architect, or land surveyor licensed in Virginia every five years. These inspections, along with photo documentation, certify that a property's stormwater treatment facilities are in good working order and comply with the approved plan.

Beginning this year, homes that received new occupancy in 2018, where owners signed a stormwater maintenance agreement, will receive a notice from the Town of Vienna requesting this maintenance report. Proper maintenance and inspections help achieve the Town's goal of protecting streams and rivers, and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay.  $\checkmark$

## **163 Acres of Vienna's Tree Canopy Has Been** Lost in the Last 10 Years

es, you read that correctly - 163 acres! This is according to a recent Vienna Urban Tree Canopy Assessment

approved by the Town Council and compiled by Davey Research Group with strong support from Vienna's Conservation and Sustainability Commission (CSC) and Town Urban Arborist Scott Diffenderfer. The purpose of the assessment was to identify tree loss between 2011 and 2021, establish a baseline, prepare an urban forest management plan, set a tree canopy goal, and have measurements in place to guide efforts to reduce future tree loss.

The assessment's comparison revealed a 13% decrease in Vienna's tree canopy within that 10-year timeframe. However, opportunities exist to mitigate this trend: approximately 214 acres of planting area were identified as having "very high" and "high" potential for future planting. If these areas were to be planted, it could bring the canopy level to 46.3% (a 19.6% increase).

By assessing open spaces for viability of planting, Vienna can determine which areas would be best served with increasing canopy cover. Planting locations were created by combining all grass/open space/bare soil areas and removing nonfeasible planting areas such as agriculture, recreational fields, and major utility corridors. This data can be used as a

starting point to identify areas for tree planting and field check the sites for future tree planting suitability.

Other findings include:

- Current tree canopy covers 38.7% of Vienna (the national average is 39%)
- Our tree canopy provides an annual reduction of 23.6 million gallons of stormwater runoff and 37,710 tons of carbon stored within Vienna's trees
- The largest decrease in canopy loss occurred in the southeast section of town
- The lowest decrease occurred in the northwest section
- Areas with more development activity (more new builds) experienced the greatest loss percentages, and
- Vienna may benefit by prioritizing tree planting in town right of ways.

The bottom line is this: more trees are being cut down than are being planted, and this is unsustainable. To make a difference, we must work together as a community by having the Town plant more trees on public land and encouraging homeowners to plant more trees on private property.
