Business License Deadline March 3

March 3 is the deadline for payment of the annual business, professional and occupational license (BPOL) tax. All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses by March 3.

The amount of the tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business. The gross receipts threshold is \$50,000, below which the tax does not apply. Those businesses with total annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

Last Chance To Order Mulch

February 28 is the last day to order a free delivery of ground leaf mulch or ground wood mulch from the Public Works Department. To place your order, call 703-255-6388 and leave your name, address, daytime phone number, type of mulch desired (wood or leaf), and the number of loads to be delivered. Please speak slowly and spell your name and street. One load is estimated to be 2-2.5 cubic yards (about the size of a VW Beetle). Half loads are available on request.

Mulch deliveries will be placed only in the driveway at the end closest to the house. Once mulch is delivered, it becomes the property of the homeowner and the Town will not remove any excess mulch ordered.

Chesapeake Bay Ordinance Hearing

At its February 3 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on proposed amendments to the Town's Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas ordinance. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.

Local governments in Virginia are required to change their Chesapeake Bay protection program provisions no later than March 1, 2003. Revisions to the regulations include refining the definition of perennial streams, how these water bodies are determined, and the intent to preserve the entirety of the required 100-foot wide buffer that adjoins them. These areas are considered the most sensitive of lands, which by virtue of their natural location and function are susceptible to pollution caused by construction and other human activities.

DECEMBER 2, 2002

- Denied a request for a speed hump in the 200 block of Moore Avenue, S.E. Referred the item back to the Transportation Safety Commission to study the possibility of installing a four-way stop at Moore and Glyndon Street.
- Took no action on a request for a "No Right Turn on Red" sign on west-bound Maple Avenue at East Street. (Approved unanimously.) Directed that "Hidden Driveway" and "Do Not Block Driveway" signs, and a stop bar stripe on the street be installed on East Street at the Wolftrappe Square townhouses. (Approved 5-2, Boudreau and Polychrones voting nay.)
- Awarded a contract for construction of Pleasant Street water line improvements to Martin & Gass in the amount of \$115,-425. Awarded a contract for construction supervision services for the project to Tri-Tek Engineering in an amount not to exceed \$11,367.
- •Approved the purchase of 61 doublearm brackets to mount the street light fix-

tures for the Maple Avenue Enhancement Project at a total cost of \$27,633.

DECEMBER 16, 2002

- Approved the installation of a fourway stop at Tapawingo Road and DeSale Street, S.W.
- Vacated an easement at 530 Malcolm Rd., N.W., and relocated it to allow access for maintenance of an infiltration pit.
- Approved reimbirsement agreements with Fairfax County for installation and maintenance of streetlights for the Maple Avenue Enhancement Project in the total amount of \$88,703.
- Referred to the Planning Commission for a public hearing and recommendation proposed amendments to the zoning code concerning "uses, heights and area."
- Appointed Roy Baldwin as the Vienna-Tysons Regional Chamber of Commerce representative to the Town/Business Liaison Committee for a two-year term.



Carbon Monoxide Detectors Help Protect Your Family

A mother and her baby died in Fairfax County last month, apparently of carbon monoxide poisoning caused by a faulty water heater and furnace. Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless and tasteless gas that causes about 300 accidental fatalities in homes each year.

Your Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department recommends installing at least one CO detector per household, near the sleeping area. A second detector near the home's heat source provides extra protection. In addition to installing CO detectors, consumers should regularly inspect and service potential problem sources of CO. These include common home appliances such as gas or oil furnaces, clothes dryers, water heaters, fireplaces, charcoal grills, gas ranges, wood-burning stoves, and space heaters. Fumes from motor vehicles also contain carbon monoxide and can enter a home through walls or doorways if a vehicle is left running in an attached garage.

CO bonds with hemoglobin in the blood, displacing the oxygen. Although everyone is at risk, those with greater oxygen requirements, including the very young, the elderly, and people with respiratory or coronary problems, are at greater risk.

At low levels, CO poisoning causes symptoms similar to the flu, such as headaches, fatigue, nausea, dizzy spells, confused thinking (so victims cannot think clearly enough to get assistance), and irritability. As levels of CO increase, vomiting, loss of consciousness, and eventually brain damage or death can result.

If you suspect you are experiencing CO poisoning, get fresh air immediately, get everyone out of the house as quickly as possible, and call the fire department. The fire department will confirm the presence of CO, attempt to identify the source, and ventilate the gas from the building.

CO detectors can be purchased at many local hardware and small appliance stores at a cost of \$35 to \$50. Make sure the detector that you purchase has an Underwriters Laboratory (UL) label.

"Beauty Spot"

February is a great time to get your garden tools ready for spring. They take their share of abuse during the warm months, so some care before the lawn-trimming season begins is vital to keeping their parts in good working condition. Sharpen and oil tools such as shovels, trimmers and mowers.

If a few warm days entice your bulbs to sprout, add a thick layer of mulch to protect the tender new growth. In the event of snow, be sure to shake or brush off the branches of your evergreens and shrubs. The light fluffy snow poses no real threat, but if it should become wet and frozen, the weight of the snow may break the limbs.

Don't Take the Bait!

The following information is provided by the U.S. Postal Inspection Service:

"Boiler Room Fraud" is the use of the phone or the mail by unethical companies who only want to take your money. It is a growing problem for both individuals and businesses and costs consumers billions of dollars a year. Usually, boiler room companies make offers that are too good to be true such as "You've won a valuable free prize," or "This investment is low-risk and provides a higher return than you can get anywhere else."

How can you protect yourself? Don't take the bait! If the answer to any one of these questions is yes, beware of boiler room fraud:

- Is my "free gift" or "prize" really free, or do I have to pay a registration fee or shipping and handling charge before receiving anything?
- Do I have adequate time to think this over, or am I being pressured for a decision right now?
- Will they send me additional information through the mail, putting their statements and promises in writing, or do they refuse?
 - Are they insisting on my credit card or checking account number right now?
 - Do they want to send a private courier tonight for my check?

Permit Required for Satellite Antenna

The Vienna Planning and Zoning Department reminds homeowners that a building permit must be obtained before erecting any satellite antenna larger than one meter in diameter on your property. The Town Code regulates the size and placement of satellite antennae as well as requiring specific screening.

GROUND MOUNTED: One satellite antenna dish not exceeding 14 feet in diameter may be installed at ground level on any residential lot. It must be located in the rear yard, no closer than 15 feet to the rear lot line or any side lot line, no closer than 10 feet to the rear of the house, and no more that 18 feet high when positioned for operation.

All ground-mounted satellite antennae over 4 feet in diameter must be screened from adjoining properties by a 6-foot high wood or masonry fence, or by a living screen of evergreens not less than 5 feet high at the time of planting and with trunks spaced no more than 5 feet apart, of a variety that will mature to a height of at least 6 feet.

ROOF MOUNTED: In lieu of a back yard location, one satellite antenna dish not exceeding 4 feet in diameter may be mounted on the roof of the house.

CORNER LOTS: On corner lots, no satellite antenna may be erected in front of the building line of any adjoining lot.

This Month in History

from the Vienna Newsletter archives

FEBRUARY 1993 – Hunter Mill is now officially the name of Vienna's magesterial district, which was previously known as Centreville District. Fairfax County Supervisor Bob Dix., Jr., had sought the name change to eliminate confusion for residents of Centreville, which is not located in the district. The new name was selected from among dozens of citizen suggestions.

FEBRUARY 1983 – The snowstorm of February 10-11 will go down in history as the "Blizzard of '83." It was one of the biggest and costliest storms ever. In all, 2,074.5 man-hours were spent on snow removal. Approximately 300 tons of salt and 300 tons of sand were spread on town streets. The total cost of digging out of the Blizzard of '83 is estimated at \$31,321.88.

FEBRUARY 1973 – Vienna's newly adopted street map includes one new road and extensions of several existing roads. The new road will be the much-discussed second access road into Vienna's Technology Park. Street extensions include Church Street extended to connect to Pleasant Street, which takes into consideration the possibility of a new Post Office being constructed on Lawyers Road at Church Street and may or may not be required.

How to Report Malfunctioning Streetlights

Streetlights help deter crime and enhance traffic and pedestrian safety. To help keep Vienna safe during nighttime hours, citizens are requested to report malfunctioning streetlights on public roads to Dominion Virginia Power. Malfunctions may include such problems as a light being out at night or a light being on during daylight hours.

To report a malfunctioning streetlight, call 1-888-667-3000 toll free 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The utility company does not "self-patrol" the streetlight system to identify malfunctioning lights, so it is important that citizens report malfunctions.

When you call, please have adequate information regarding the location of the malfunctioning streetlight. For instance, "In front of 123 Smith Street," or "The fourth and fifth streetlights on the south side of Smith Street west of the intersection with Jones Drive." A pole number (located on the pole) is also helpful.

The Town of Vienna is not responsible for streetlight repairs.
