Rabies Clinic

A rabies vaccination clinic for dogs and cats will be held at the Vienna Community Center on Sunday, November 10, from 12 noon to 2 p.m. Town ordinance requires all dogs and cats over six months old to be vaccinated.

Vaccine for animals over a year old costs \$6 and gives protection from rabies for three years. Vaccine for animals under a year old costs \$4 and protects for one year. Certificates will be given to pet owners at the clinic to verify each vaccination.

In bringing animals to the clinic, dogs should be on a leash and cats confined to a box or basket.

1986 Town of Vienna dog licenses will be sold at the clinic for \$5 each.

September 30, 1985

- Presented Councilman Fisher with a service award for his years on the Planning Commission before his election to Council.
- Conducted a public hearing on a request to remove the properties at 224 Walnut La. and 222 Lovers La., N.W., from the Windover Heights Historic District. A decision on the matter is scheduled for the November 4 Council meeting.
- Approved the installation of a four-way stop at John Mar-shall Drive and McKinley Street, N.E.
- Adopted a resolution to start work on the Town's 1990 Centennial celebration.
- Authorized improvements to the Town's water system in fire flow pressure, flow characteristics and monitoring of storage tanks. The cost is not to exceed \$181,000, to come from bond funds.
- Approved funds not to exceed \$350 for the Planning Commission chairman to attend a conference.
- Accepted Lawrence King's resignation from the Planning Commission and expressed appreciation for his years of service.
- Reappointed Stuart Liss as the architect member on the Board of Architectural Review for a one-year term.
- Rescinded a previous action limiting the number of terms a person may serve on Town boards and commissions. Effective immediately, all appointments or reappointments, except for the Board of Zoning Appeals, will be for twoyear terms, with no limit on the number of terms a person may serve. Persons seeking reappointment are subject to interview by Council.
- Approved a civilian position in the Police Department to oversee the computerization of records. The cost is not to exceed \$30,495, from budgeted funds. This is not an increase in personnel but a reclassification.
- Approved a clerk-typist position, pay grade 5, for the Public Works Department and deleted the vacant garage attendant position from the current budget.

October 7, 1985

- Took no action on a request to waive the parking requirement for the professional building at 133 Maple Ave., E., and directed the matter to the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- Approved renewal of the agreement between the Town of Vienna, the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority and the Northern Virginia Model Railroaders for use of the railroad station building.
- Approved the construction of restrooms and a concession stand at Glyndon Park at a cost of \$28,500 and repairs to fencing and ballfields at Southside Park at a cost of \$10,000, to come from bond funds. Approval of improvements to Meadow Lane Park was deferred pending recommendations from the Chief of Police.
- Accepted a bid of \$5,688 by Wilbar Truck Equipment and a bid of \$25,685,56 by District International Trucks, Tuxedo, Md., for a two-ton dump truck body and cab and chassis for the Public Works Department, subject to Council approval of an interest rate.
- Accepted a bid of \$28,500 by Havenhurst, Alexandria, Va., for design and construction of the restroom and concession building at Glyndon Park, from bond and insurance funds.
- Accepted the bid by American Uniform Sales, Alexandria, Va., for police uniforms.
- Accepted a bid of \$10,999 by JKJ Chevrolet for a dump truck cab and chassis and a bid of \$3,127 by Wilbar Truck Equipment for a dump truck body for the Parks and Recreation Department, from budgeted funds.
- Set November 11 as the date for a work session on "Planning for Tomorrow," the final report of the Citizen Advisory Panel on Redevelopment of Commercial Zones.

Road Bond Referendum Nov. 5

A road bond referendum question proposing the issuance of \$135 million in Fairfax County general obligation bonds will be on the November 5 general election ballot. The bond referendum includes the recommendation to begin construction of two segments of the Springfield Bypass.

One segment of the Bypass, from the Dulles Toll Road to Route 50, would provide added cross-county capacity and a major new access to I-66. The second segment would provide a new east-west connection across I-95 as an alternative to Old Keene Mill Road/Franconia Road and an additional access point into the HOV lanes. The total estimated cost for these two segments is \$89.575 million.

Twelve other projects included in the referendum are Blake Lane, Gosnell Road, Telegraph Road, South Van Dorn Street, Lockheed Boulevard/South Van Dorn Street extension, John Marr Drive, Franconia Road/Commerce Street, Route 7:/Baron Cameron Drive, Route 50/Graham Road, and Guinea Road.

Copies of the referendum package are available for review at all County libraries and at the Massey Building in Fairfax City.


FEEDER BUS ROUTE SURVEY




