Housing Expense Relief

December 31 is the deadline to apply for Fairfax County's Housing Expense Relief Program. This program provides up to \$150 per year to low-income homeowners or renters who are between the ages of 55 and 64 or who have minor children living at home.

To qualify for the program, an applicant must have a gross income from all sources of no more than \$10,000 annually, excluding the first \$4,000 of income of each relative other than the spouse residing in the household. In addition, the combined financial net worth of the applicant and spouse living in the household may not exceed \$35,000, excluding the value of the residence, if owned, and up to one acre of land around it.

The actual grant amount will be based on a formula derived from family income and the annual rent paid. In the case of homeowners, an "annual rent equivalent" will be

Place Your Order For Leaf Mulch


From January through March 14. weather permitting, the Department of Public Works will deliver leaf mulch free of charge to residences within the town limits.

Permit Required to Install TV Satellite Antennae

Town residents considering installing a satellite antenna on their property should contact the Zoning Office at Town Hall prior to buying the device. A building permit is required before installation can begin.

The antenna can only be located in the rear yard, and it must be screened from adjoining properties by plantings or a fence. An antenna mounted on the roof of a building must be four feet or less in diameter.
