# Help Defend Vienna's Title as "Most-Fit Community"

ienna Mayor Linda Colbert is rallying Vienna residents, businesses and Town government employees to defend the town's title and retain the trophy as the "Most-fit Community" in the third annual Mayors Fitness Challenge! The friendly eight-week competition from March 18-May 13 encourages residents in the Town of Vienna and the cities of Fairfax and Falls Church to get moving and log their exercise minutes to support their community's collective effort to win a trophy and bragging rights as the fittest town around! Best of all, participants get to choose the way they exercise. Walk, bike, hike, practice yoga, or play in the park - the opportunities are endless.

The Mayors Fitness Challenge began in spring 2021 to encourage people to get out and enjoy some exercise and sunshine after a year of virtual isolation due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Falls Church won the first competition, and Mayor David Tarter presented the trophy to

Vienna Mayor Linda Colbert in 2022 after the Town of Vienna edged out the inaugural winner.



Registration for the 2023 event is now open and required. Vienna residents, businesses and Town government employees are eligible to join Team Vienna. Participation is free, and optional 2023 Mayors Fitness Challenge T-shirts are available for purchase for \$5 each at the time of registration. The community that tallies the greatest number of exercise minutes at the end of the competition gets the title of "Most-Fit Community!"

# **Bridging the Gap**


here's a great deal of history tucked away between the Freeman Store and W&OD Trail. The historic site has been a store, a home, train depot, hotel, hospital, officers' quarters, and fire department in its history dating back more than 160 years. For much of that history, the structure included a pedestrian bridge over Piney Branch to the store's side entrance. The most recent bridge collapsed in 2016, leaving only pre-existing concrete footers behind. Soon, an ADA-compliant, steel and wooden passageway will be constructed and look as it did many years ago.

Throughout the Freeman Store's history, the pedestrian bridge has been an integral part of the structure. In more recent years, it gave trail users easy access as they passed through on their walk or bike ride. The new bridge construction, spearheaded by Vienna's public works department, is expected to be completed sometime this summer.

Until the new bridge is finished, a trail detour has been set up between Maple Avenue and Church Street for the duration of the project. There are signs on both ends of the detour, directing foot traffic through the parking lot next to the trail.



# **Economic Development Director Named Exceptional Leader**



own of Vienna Economic Development Director Natalie Monkou is among those named as one of Northern Virginia's 40 Under 40 honorees! The annual recognition is presented by the Leadership Center for Excellence and Leadership Fairfax, and it recognizes young professionals who have demonstrated exceptional accomplishments in their profession. All will be recognized at a virtual event on Friday, March 24, and at an in-person reception later that evening for honorees only.

"The Northern Virginia 40 Under 40 event serves as both a celebration and an annual reminder of the need for leaders who work daily to effect change, collaborate with others, and create a positive impact within their community," said Lisa Fikes, President and CEO of the Leadership Center for Excellence.

Monkou is being recognized for her eight years of leadership to improve the quality of life, experiences and services for residents, visitors and business owners within Northern Virginia, especially the Town of Vienna, where she has served for the past three years, and in Arlington County, where she served as business development manager before moving to Vienna.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Monkou facilitated the distribution of \$1 million to assist Vienna businesses struggling as a result of the health crisis. Through her work and with

direction from the Town Council, Vienna was able to leverage this amount through a partnership with Fairfax County, which provided \$2.76 million in emergency relief to 254 Vienna businesses and nonprofit organizations through the county's RISE Grant program.

"Vienna's quality of life is directly connected to the health of its business community, and Natalie Monkou was masterful in her approach to supporting businesses through the pandemic," said Town Manager Mercury Payton. "Because of her leadership, many businesses were able to weather the storm, and this is just one of many examples why she is most worthy of being named to the 40 under 40 list of exceptional leaders."

Monkou's Town leadership also contributed to successful partnerships between the Vienna Business Association, Patrick Henry Library

and the Fairfax County Department of Economic Initiatives. Over the last three years, these organizations have worked together to provide small businesses and emerging entrepreneurs expertise in a variety of topics including finance, HR support, marketing, and website creation through their Ignite educational series.

Now that the pandemic has waned, Monkou is leading efforts to raise awareness of new businesses in the Town of Vienna and providing them with new resources to support their growth. She helps organize and oversee pop-up markets and ribbon-cutting events, and educational series for new and emerging businesses, and she continues to introduce Vienna to prospective companies that are looking for a new place to call home.







# **Vienna Police Captain Honored for Service**

he Vienna Police Department is on a roll! Right off the heels of Captain Art Sylmar's graduation from the FBI National Academy, Captain Tu Farhan was presented with the Law Enforcement Medal and Commendation from the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution Fairfax in February.

Captain Farhan has been a member of the Vienna Police Department since 2000, rising through the ranks as officer, detective, supervisor, and now Captain. With 22+ years of experience under his belt, Captain Farhan continuously strives to make the department and community a better place. To top it off, he even speaks five languages and routinely assists officers with translation which helps to bridge the gap when language is a barrier.

### **Turn Around, Don't Drown!**

Severe storms and other extreme weather events can flood roads quickly and attempting to cross them can be a dangerous mistake. Even six inches of water can cause a motorist to lose control of a car and jeopardize the integrity of a roadway. If you encounter a flooded road, the safest decision is to turn around and find another way out.



# **Keeping Your Drinking Water Safe**

afe drinking water is often something we take for granted. Fortunately, not many of us have to think about how clean our water is, thanks to public works crews, the Fairfax County Water Authority and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. A lot of work goes into making sure the Town's drinking water is safe.

Each spring, the water treatment process switches from combined chlorine to free chlorine to clean out the water distribution system. Public works crews also flush water mains at the same time to ensure the Town's 800+ fire hydrants operate properly. All of this may leave you wondering if your water is safe to drink during this time.

"The answer is yes, your water is safe to drink during treatment and flushing," said Emily Goodman, Town of Vienna Meters, and Water Quality Supervisor. "During the time that free chlorine is used, you may notice a chlorine taste and odor in your drinking water, but it's still absolutely safe to consume."

If you do notice a chlorine taste or odor, you can reduce the taste or smell by running the cold tap for 2-5 minutes, refrigerating cold tap water in an open container, or using a water filter. All of these strategies will help improve taste during the water treatment period.

The work this year begins on March 31 and goes until May 19 or until all mains have been flushed.

The flushing work takes place from 10:30 p.m. until 7 a.m. To learn more about Vienna's water main flushing program, visit https://bit.ly/WaterMainFlushing.

# **Great Leaders Understand the Power of Focus**



n the July 2022 Vienna Voice, I posed the question, "How is your Vision?" Leadership expert, John Maxwell said, "Great leaders ... are both highly visionary and highly practical."

To encourage visionary leadership, it was suggested the Vienna Town Council select four top priorities to be completed in 2023. On Jan. 9, 2023, the Town Council adopted its four top priorities for this year. They are:

- Complete Code Create Our Zoning Code needs to be written in clear language that preserves our neighborhoods and provides for reasonable growth while maintaining our small-town ambience.



- Protect and increase the Town's tree canopy According to a Tree Canopy Assessment conducted by the Davey Group, Vienna has lost 5,000 mature trees and 163 acres of tree canopy (a 13% loss) over the past 10 years. An excellent analysis by Kirkland and Ellis, encourages existing tree preservation, increasing spending to plant new trees, and setting up a Vienna Tree Commission.
- Review and revise our current noise ordinance Our noise ordinance needs to protect the "normal enjoyable use of any residential area" by ensuring commercial operations such as loading and unloading, excavation, home construction, use of heavy equipment; and noisy residential yard work and home-improvement activities are done during reasonable hours.

In addition to being visionary, great leaders, also, are practical and understand the power of focus. Warren Buffett, whose business success is legendary, said it is a "simple fact you can't focus on lots of things at once." The Town Council's focus on its top four priorities gives the Town staff guidance on what is most important for 2023. It focuses our energy, allows for more in-depth research, and achieves more in less time. It does not mean that time-sensitive emergencies or critical issues cannot be addressed.

Our vision is clear. Let our focus be sure. We will notice a difference in 2023.



# **Calling All Photographers!**





### **Picture it!**

**IENNA**, **around 1921** – Virginia Governor Westmoreland Davis inspects the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department's new truck on a visit through the area. Davis was elected in 1917 on a "wet," or anti-Prohibition, platform. As governor, Davis sent increased funding to Virginia's colleges and universities. He also pressed for aid to farmers and funding for scientific farming research, and his administration's policies reformed and modernized the Virginia government. While governor, he was a delegate to the Democratic National Convention of 1920 – the year women first had the right to vote.
