Town Seeks Community Input on Annex Property

ow do you think the Town should use the three-acre annex property located at 301 Center St., S? The Town bought the former Faith Baptist Church property in 2020, and it served as a temporary police headquarters while the new Vienna Police Department building was being constructed next door. Now that the police have moved into the new building, a land feasibility and community needs assessment is being conducted to determine long-term plans for the Annex.

"It is important that we understand community perspectives and unmet needs as we chart the course for this site's future," said Vienna Parks and Recreation Director Leslie Herman. "While land experts assess the site features and determine what uses are feasible, residents are encouraged to share their ideas to help inform the Town's decision about the property in the next decade and beyond."

Vienna Restaurant Week a Success

o one knew what to expect from the first Vienna Restaurant Week since the pandemic started, but the results clearly show people were hungry for a change of pace! Many participating restaurants and specialty eateries reported dramatic increases in business – almost double the average in some cases – and social media was abuzz with rave reviews from diners to business owners.

"It's the greatest turnout I've seen in 49 years of fine dining work," wrote a representative from Café Renaissance. "We've been packed every night," said Foster's Grille assistant manager Bronwyn Phillips toward the end of Restaurant Week. "We saw so many new faces, and several asked how long we had been here (21 years). They said they have lived in Vienna for years and didn't know we were here!"

Several other business owners also acknowledged seeing many new customers and appreciated the increase in awareness Restaurant Week promotions generated.

"A huge thank you to all the wonderful neighbors who came out and dined with us," wrote a Sushi Kojo representative on social media. "We can't imagine being in a better community."

Restaurant Week was organized by the Town of Vienna Economic Development Division to encourage diners in the region to explore the diverse culinary options Vienna has to offer. The result was an economic boost to local businesses and the local economy, and it increased awareness of and renewed appreciation for the tastes of the world that await just moments from home.

"Already looking forward to next year's event," said Supervisor Walter Alcon via social media.

The Town is, too! Plans have already begun to offer more Restaurant Week options in 2024.

Friendly Reminder: Time to Tidy the Lawn. It's the Law.



s warm weather approaches, homeowners and lawn services will be hard at work trimming hedges and mowing lawns. Overgrown grass and landscaping are not only unsightly, they create public health and safety risks. The Town's zoning ordinance requires property owners and managers to maintain lawn and grass areas at no taller than six inches in height. Property owners and managers are also required to keep shrubs, grass and other landscaping on their property trimmed so that they do not encroach into public sidewalks and streets. While most people take pride in keeping their property tidy, Town staff will enforce the regulations with those who do not comply. The Long Council

he Council Corner in the Vienna Voice traditionally disappears six months before the next election. Thus, this is the

last article for the current Council, and therefore a good time for reflection.

From 1648 to 1660, there were no elections for the British House of Commons. This 12-year session became known to history as the "Long Parliament." Fast forward almost 400 years and cross the ocean. Because of election law changes, the current Vienna Town Council will have met for three and a half years upon its closing in December 2023 – almost twice as long as the normal two-year session. This extended session has coincided with a burst of productivity. To date, the accomplishments of the Vienna "Long Council" include:

Budget

- Successfully managed the COVID-19 crisis, emerging with a strong Town financial position.
- Instituted new annual budgeting process by establishing priorities early in the cycle.

Police and Public Safety

- Established a separate police pay scale to attract and retain top quality officers.
- Successfully managed new police station/community center



construction, delivering projects on time and under budget.

 Passed a new ordinance allowing for temporary medical testing facilities during public health emergencies.

Library

Worked with County to develop plans for the new Patrick Henry Library.

Infrastructure

• Used federal ARPA money to hasten replacement of our aging sewer system.

Livability

- Eliminated mulching operations at Beulah Road facility.
- Allowed for covered decks and new porches, while maintaining Vienna's low lot coverage standard.
- Added approximately two miles of sidewalks.
- Authorized outdoor dining options at restaurants.

Parks and Recreation

- Acquired Baptist church property for future park and recreation use.
- Approved Southside Park rebuilding.

Economic Development and Housing

- Supported new Economic Development Office.
- Completed long-term economic development study.

- Blocked County proposal to bury new sewer main along Maple Avenue.
- Approved diverse housing options, including cottage housing, condominiums, and apartments.

Diversity and Social Justice

- Established Liberty Amendments Month, and initiated legislation to make it a statewide commemoration.
- Renamed Wade Hampton Drive to Liberty Lane.

Our work is not over. The Council has chosen the following four priorities to complete before the end of its term:

- Rewrite the Town's zoning code to bring it in line with modern practices.
- Update the Town noise ordinance.
 - Address the loss of tree canopy.
 - Identify the best long-term use for the former Baptist church property.

That is a lot to accomplish over the remainder of 2023. But with the help of our informed residents, we are optimistic that the "Long Council" will be remembered as one of the most productive ever. \heartsuit


