Budget Approved With 1¢ Tax Cut

A \$10 million budget for fiscal year 1986-87 was adopted by the Town Council on June 16. Council was able to lower the real estate tax rate by a penny, to 32¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation, by trimming a total of \$70,-752 from a number of accounts. The new budget provides for continuation of all current Town services and funding for some major capital improvements.

The water and sewer fund is based on new water rates of 97¢ per 1,000 gallons for town residents and \$1,29 for out-of-town customers, and a sewer rate of \$2 per 1,000 for all customers. This increase of about 5% is necessary to keep this fund self-supporting and cover rising costs for wholesale water purchases from Falls Church and other expenses. The rates charged Vienna residents are still lower than those in most neighboring jurisdictions, as shown below. The new budget retains the excess use charge for water service.

APRIL 21, 1986

- *Following a public hearing, established a residential permit parking zone on Tapawingo Road between Nutley and Ware Streets and on Meadow Lane from Kingsley Road to Gibson Drive effective May 19. Parking will be restricted Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, from 7 to 10 a.m. and from 3 to 6 p.m.
- Approved a request to waive construction of the part of the fence between Vienna Park Condominiums and 109 Patrick St., S.E.
- Requested the Fairfax County Planning Commission to defer action on an application to rezone 7.2 acres for apartments in the area of Chain Bridge Road and Horseshoe Drive until the Town has had an opportunity to study the request and develop a recommendation to present to the Commission and the Board of Supervisors.
- Accepted for maintenance the public facilities installed in Madison Oaks Subdivision and directed that the maintenance bond be held for two years.
- Increased the Town Manager's salary from \$52,000 to \$56,500.

May 12, 1986

- * Following a public hearing, approved an addition to the Vienna Community Center at a total estimated cost of \$883,-000, funds to come from the bond fund, contribution from Fairfax County, and general fund reserves, and an additional \$20,600 for installation of a fire hydrant. The public is also encouraged to contribute to the project.
- Approved a waiver request to allow 65% lot coverage for dental offices at 212 Park St., S.E.
- Approved the landscape plan for Park Professional Building, 124 Park St., S.E.
- Accepted a bid by Vision Technology, Reston, of \$32,877 for a police automated records management system, to come from budgeted funds.
- Granted a Town employee extraordinary sick leave not to exceed 952 hours.

May 20, 1986

- Following a public hearing, approved an application by Vienna Trophies and Awards for a wall sign as originally submitted to the Board of Architectural Review.
- Directed that a double yellow center line be painted on Broadleaf Drive, N.E., along with white lines on each side of the street to create parking lanes. The Town staff is to test on a non-public roadway the effectiveness and safety of speed humps. The stop signs installed at Broadleaf and Glyndon Street will remain in place.
- Took no action on a request for the Town to vacate a portion of Ayr Hill Avenue, N.E., between Mill and Park Streets.

June 2, 1986

- Conducted a public hearing on the proposed Town budget for fiscal year 1986-87.
- Set a sewer availablity fee of \$1,250 for the bathroom facility at the tennis courts of Vienna Woods Swim and Tennis Club, a reduction of \$1,320 from the standard charge.
- Approved the final plat of Townes of Vienna subdivision, Nutley and Roland Streets, S.W.
- Directed to the Board of Zoning Appeals a request to allow a dental practice at 130 Casmar St., S.E., while the dentist temporarily resides elsewhere.
- Awarded the contract for consultant services for the procurement and installation of a telephone system for all Town-owned facilities to National Communication Services, Vienna, at the rate of \$65 per hour or not to exceed \$9,750.

School Grounds Off Limits at Dark

Did you know that being on public school property after dark is against the law? Even though the property may not be posted, the Virginia State Code prohibits being on the grounds at night unless there is an activity at the school.

Fairfax County Schools security personnel have recently arrested a number of young people at Vienna area schools, although they had committed no crime other than unknowingly trespassing.

Make sure that your children understand that all public schools and playgrounds located on school property are closed after dark.

Neighborhood Watch Report

The Vienna Police Department showed no significant increase in major crimes over the past month.

Reported vandalism did increase, especially in construction areas, and Neighborhood Watch groups are asked to note any unusual activities where construction is taking place.

There were five reported burglaries. Two of these were commercial businesses and three were residential. Malcolm-Windover Neighborhood Watch area had two of the residential burglaries. Entrance was gained through unlocked doors and windows. Property loss included appliances (color TV) and silver. The losses were in excess of \$6,000.

Fireworks Safety

Have a safe 4th of July and stay away from dangerous and illegal fireworks. Fireworks that explode, emit a flame or sparks higher than 12 feet, or perform as a projectile are prohibited by the Fairfax County Fire Prevention Code. A permit is required to sell approved fireworks, and the permit is valid only from June 1 to July 15 each year.

Firecrackers, cherry bombs, and skyrockets are just a few of the fireworks
that are illegal in Northern Virginia.
Even the possession of unapproved
fireworks is prohibited in Fairfax County, and such fireworks may be confiscated and the person possessing them
charged with a Class I Misdemeanor,
which carries a maximum penalty of a
\$1,000 fine and/or one year in jail.

During 1985 six people in Fairfax County were injured by fireworks. All of the injuries occurred in June and July and most were to teenagers and young children. Several were serious and left permanent damage. Don't let your holiday celebration turn into a tragedy. Use fireworks safely. If you have questions about fireworks, call the County Fire Prevention Division, 691-2331, or the Public Affairs Section, 691-3366.

Relief for Families Of Disabled Adults

The Fairfax County Department of Social Services' Respite Companion Services Program is available to eligible incapacitated adults who live with their care-givers. The program is designed to give up to 10 hours of relief each week to family members that have the responsibility of constant-care and supervision of a disabled adult.

Respite companion services involve assisting incapacitated adults with the activities of daily living and include food preparation, light house-keeping and personal care. Through the program, the care-giver is given temporary relief while the companion takes care of the client's needs.

To be eligible, disabled clients for whom respite services are requested must meet income guidelines, reside with their care-givers, and require almost constant care and supervision.



Vienna Community Band Marks Anniversary

When the Vienna Community Band performs at this year's July 4th celebration, it will also be observing its 11th anniversary. The band was begun in January 1975 in conjunction with plans to celebrate the Bicentennial. This was the beginning of the Vienna Community Band.
