Independence Day Fireworks Scheduled for July 2

elebrate the nation's 247th birthday early with the Town of Vienna fireworks display on Sunday, July 2, 2023, at Yeonas Park. Festivities including live music, children's entertainment, games and other family fun begin at 4 p.m., and a 20-minute fireworks display will begin at 9:30 p.m.

"While July 2 is not our preferred date, we are excited to contract with Garden State Fireworks to provide the fireworks display for the Town's Independence Day Celebration," said Vienna Parks and Recreation Director Leslie Herman. "After our show is over, the company will head to Washington D.C. to finalize details for the national fireworks display on July 4."

Due to a shortage of licensed pyrotechnicians to meet the demand for 4th of July events, communities nationwide are opting to reschedule their celebrations rather than cancel them altogether. If you plan to attend the Vienna celebration, you may want to bring lawn chairs or a picnic blanket. You can also purchase food and beverages from the Vienna Little League concession stand or local food trucks, or you can bring your own snacks. No alcohol, glass containers, sparklers/fireworks or dogs are permitted. Lawn chairs are not permitted on the baseball fields but may be used anywhere else in the park.

For safety reasons, the fireworks display will be launched from nearby Southside Park and will be visible from Yeonas Park. For more information about the festivities and nearby street closures, visit www.viennava.gov/fireworks.







Let Freedom Ring!

n the words of Patrick Henry, "Give me Liberty... Amendments Month!" Get ready for a month full of history, education, fun and excitement during the Town of Vienna's third annual Liberty Amendments Month, June 17-July 17, 2023. This annual celebration offers residents a chance to learn about local history and how it relates to the four Amendments that granted equal liberties to people who were previously excluded from the U.S. Constitution.

What are the Liberty Amendments?

The Liberty Amendments are the 13th, 14th, 15th, and 19th Amendments to the U.S. Constitution. The 13th

Amendment abolished slavery in the United States. The 14th Amendment defines citizenship and rights of citizens including due process, life, liberty, and property. The 15th Amendment prohibited governments from denying U.S. citizens the right to vote based on race, color, or past servitude. The 19th Amendment granted women the right to vote.

What to Expect:

Liberty Amendments Month begins with the Juneteenth celebration at Vienna's First Baptist Church on Saturday, June 17, from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. Each week, one of the four Constitutional amendments will be highlighted through children's programs, education events for teens and adults, trips to museums, a multicultural festival and so much more! While most events will occur at the Vienna Town Green or the Vienna Community Center, attendees can expect to see ongoing virtual and in person events and activities all over town, including "Liberty Minutes," a weekly social media video series highlighting each of the four amendments. New Landscape Design Proposed for Town Planters

ust as worn carpets and drapes need replacing over time, the Town's landscape planters along Maple Avenue and Church Street are due for a makeover. The existing landscape plants have matured over the last 20 years, and the uniformity of design has waned resulting in a less welcoming appearance for residents and visitors. Starting this fall, the Town plans to improve the appearance of 81 landscape planters on both sides of Maple Avenue and 46 planters on both sides of Church Street with the help of its contractor, LSG Landscape Architecture. Representatives will present the Maple Avenue and

Church Street Streetscape planting design concepts at the June 20 Town Council meeting, which is open to the public. The design will also be shared during another public informational session for business owners and residents on June 29 at 6:30 p.m. at the Vienna Police Department. At that session, the landscape firm will answer questions, gather feedback and identify solutions that may address concerns before starting the work. The new plants are expected to be in place by the end of November.

The Dos and Don'ts of Lawn **Fertilization**

ost people love a lush, green lawn, and by being mindful of when to apply fertilizer, you can get the desired result and respect the environment, too! Fertilizing too early encourages leaf growth at the expense of root development. It also feeds the weeds and can lead to disease and insect problems later in the season.

If you must fertilize early, limit it to a light feeding (half-pound of 10-10-10 per 1000 sq. ft.) after the initial flush of growth has subsided in May or early June. A recycling alternative is to mulch mow your grass clippings and leave them on the lawn. Mulched grass clippings left on the lawn will contribute a substantial amount of nitrogen and other nutrients to the soil, reduce fertilizer requirements, and help restrict weed growth.



Town Council Adopts FY2024 Budget



his time next month, the Town of Vienna will be operating under a new balanced budget. The Vienna Town Council adopted the \$50-million spending plan at its regular meeting on Monday, May 15, 2023. Mayor pro tem Ed Somers presided at the meeting while Mayor Linda Colbert participated remotely. The vote ended a months-long budget process in which the Council reduced the tax rate beyond the Town manager's original proposal to mitigate the financial burden on taxpayers stemming from large increases in real estate assessments without compromising service. The adopted budget reduces the property tax rate by one cent to 19.5 cents per \$100 of assessed value.

"A one-cent decrease in the property tax rate amounts to \$673,000 in revenue," said finance director Marion Serfass. "It is not quite enough to equalize the 2024 tax bill to last year, but the average annual increase in homeowner property tax is \$86. Some increases will be less, some will be more depending on the value of the home."

The FY2024 budget also funds compensation increases for eligible employees, addresses inflationary increases in operating costs, and adds two personnel positions identified as priorities - a senior planning and zoning compliance officer and a public works civil and capital projects engineer.

The adopted budget also includes a 9.3 percent increase in water and sewer bills due to increases in operational costs from the Town's service providers - Fairfax Water and the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority. The result is an average annual water service increase of \$81.

The FY2024 Town Budget takes effect July 1, 2023. The adopted budget will be posted online at www.viennava.gov/budget.

Annex Study Update

he big question facing the Annex property is, what's next? After gathering input from elected officials, Town staff, and community members via a survey and community workshops, four options for the Annex's next steps were presented at a Town Council conference session in May.

The options include keeping the whole building and spending the necessary funds to bring it to compliance with the Town's building code, keeping part of the building,

demolishing the building, and consider programming for a "flat site" without a key building, or demolishing the building and starting fresh. The Town Council is expected to provide direction on next steps at the Monday, June 5 Council meeting at 8 p.m. at Vienna Town Hall. The Annex is also expected to be a discussion topic at the Monday, June 12 Council conference session at 7 p.m. in the Vienna Police Department Community Room. inner, winner chicken dinner! For the second consecutive year, Team Vienna emerged the victor in the annual Mayors' Fitness Challenge. The friendly competition between the Town of Vienna and cities of Falls Church and Fairfax encourages residents to get moving and log their minutes of exercise in the name of community spirit and team pride. Vienna's 195 participants, ranging in age from 8 to 88, tallied a collective 466,142 exercise minutes (7,769 hours) from March 18-May 13, 2023. That was nearly double the number of minutes recorded last year and enough for Vienna to retain its title as "Most-fit Community" followed by the City of Fairfax and the City of Falls Church.

The Mayors' Fitness Challenge started in 2021 with a collaboration between the three communities to encourage people to get outside after being cooped up at home for more than a year for COVID-19 pandemic-related reasons. To motivate people, the mayors of each community rallied residents to choose activities they enjoy. This year's participants recorded activities such as walking, pickleball, weightlifting, gardening and basketball among others.

Digging a Little Deeper




n the surface, the Town Green is a central part of Vienna, offering a great place for community gatherings. But just beneath the surface lies clues to a rich history dating back generations. Vienna residents got a glimpse of that past during the recent Mayor and Chief at Your Service presentation at the Vienna Police Department as Historic Vienna, Inc. and an archeologist shared what they found during an archeological dig in March. Picture it!

Vienna, May 1942. "Frozen" cars stored on a farm on the outskirts of Vienna (believed to be off Lawyer's Road). Just months after the attack on Pearl Harbor, the U.S. government halted all private car sales, plus the delivery of automobiles to customers who had previously contracted them, as American automakers turned their production over to creating vehicles for military use only to support the war effort. No private cars, commercial trucks or automotive parts were made for personal use. Fuel was strictly rationed, and non-essential vehicles were "frozen" and put away in storage.





"Word from Juan"

Warning about Key Fobs

hese days, almost every vehicle has a push start button, eliminating the need to dig for your keys when you get in the car. Keyless ignitions systems come with a fob that transmits a unique, low-frequency signal to a specific vehicle, making car entry quick and convenient. The down side is that it also makes it very easy for thieves to steal your vehicle while you are at home.

With the help of inexpensive relay boxes, thieves copy and transmit the signal from your key fob while it is inside your home (kitchen counter,

hanging from a wall, bedroom, garage, on your person, etc.) One thief stands close to the house with a relay box to retrieve the low frequency signal, while a second thief stands near the car door with a second relay box that amplifies the signal and causes the car computer to think it's the real vehicle key. Once that happens, the thieves can unlock and start your car, drive away and have it re-keyed later.



Your best defense against this crime is to place your car keys and spare keys in a faraday case, pouch or box when you get home to block all electromagnetic fields. These are sold online, and they are very inexpensive. Another lower-cost alternative is to wrap your keys in aluminum foil to block the low-frequency signal. Doing so will help ensure your car stays right where it belongs when you're home – in your own driveway!
