tations on the amount and type of debris are as follows:

- * Each residence is limited to 300 pounds each of concrete and scrap metal. Whole automobile bodies will not be picked up.
- * Leaves will not be picked up by Cleanup crews. Leaves in plastic bags will be picked up on regular trash collection days.
- * Only two major appliances may be discarded per residence. These include stoves, dishwashers, refrigerators, washers, driers, hot water heaters, air conditioners and furnaces.
- *No debris of any kind may be brought in from outside of town for pickup by Cleanup crews.

Please separate brush and branches from other discards, and keep all Cleanup items away from regular trash, fire hydrants, water meters, gas valves, fences and utility poles.

Cleanup crews comprise the same crews who perform street maintenance and other public works duties, and they have time to make just one Cleanup sweep through each quadrant of town. Crews cannot double back along the Cleanup route.

Citizen Comment

Four-way Stop Sign Rules

A 26-year town resident comments on the need to educate the Vienna driving public about rules that apply to intersections with four-way stops.

I have seen a large increase in the installation of four-way stop signs within the Town of Vienna, and have also noticed an increase in confusion and sometimes anger displayed by drivers who think that I and others are breaking some right-of-way rules at such intersections when we are not. I have discussed driving rules that apply to intersections with four-way stop signs with the Vienna Police Department. What follows is my summary of these rules.

- When two or more vehicles approach the intersection, the vehicle that comes to a stop first has the right-of-way to proceed straight through or to make a left or right turn. Turn signals should be used if a turn will be made.
- When two vehicles traveling in opposite directions on the same street stop at the same time at the intersection, each may proceed without regard to the other unless one vehicle wants to make a left turn. In this instance the vehicle wanting to turn left must yield the right-of-way to the vehicle that desires to proceed straight through the intersection. The left-turning vehicle should activate turn signals.
- When two vehicles stop at the same time at the intersection on different streets, the vehicle on the right of the other has the right-of-way to proceed first in a straight line or make either a right or left turn. If turns are to be made turn signals should be used.
- For the same situation as above, if there is also a stopped vehicle behind the first vehicle on the right of the other vehicle, that driver has not yet reached the intersection and does not have the right-of-way over the stopped vehicle on his left. Right-of-way rules do not apply to second-in-line vehicles

until they have moved up to the intersection and again stopped when the vehicle in front of them has moved on.

- •When three vehicles all arrive at the intersection and stop at the same time, the vehicle on the right of the other two has the right-of-way. When this driver moves through the intersection, the next driver on the right of the other remaining vehicle has the right-of-way to move first.
- If four vehicles stop at the same time on four different traffic lanes (an unlikely situation), none of the above rules can apply. One vehicle should proceed cautiously through the intersection, thus allowing the three-vehicle rule to apply.



Neighborhood Watch Report



July Reports

The Vienna Police Department received six burglary reports for the month of July. This total reflects a two case decrease from the same period in 1985. Five of these burglaries occurred in commercial areas and one was residential, located in the 200 block of Cedar Lane, which is not in a Neighborhood Watch area. There were several larcenies reported; however, none occurred in a Neighborhood Watch area.

There was no significant increase in major crimes during July.

Stolen Goods Recovered

Five persons, two adults and three juveniles, were arrested and charged with possession of stolen property on August 19. At approximately 12:25 a.m., Sgt. Paul L. Stewart, while responding to a suspicious vehicle call in northwest Vienna, observed the suspect vehicle on Malcolm Road. The vehicle was stopped, and as Sgt. Stewart approached he observed an IBM computer and other large items on the back seat. Subsequent investigation revealed that the computer and computer components had apparently been taken during a burglary at Fairfax High School.

911 Emergency System Upgraded

Fairfax County implemented an upgraded 911 emergency telephone system on August 1. The highly sophisticated system permits call-takers to look at a video display screen and read the address and telephone number of the caller at the instant the call is received.

The ability to know immediately the location of a 911 caller will be especially crucial when the caller is injured or otherwise unable to give vital address information. Emergency units can be dispatched to the location of an accident, injury or fire in instances that previously would have resulted in delays as dispatchers attempted time-consuming methods of identifying the caller's location.

The 911 emergency number should be dialed only when there is an emergency requiring fire equipment or an ambulance, such as automobile accidents, serious injuries, emergency illnesses such as heart attacks and strokes, brush fires, house fires, fallen power lines and similar incidents. For fastest police response in Vienna, residents should continue calling the Vienna Police Department, 938-4900.

The critical responsibility for users of the 911 system continues to be appropriate use. Abuse of the system, primarily its use for non-emergency calls, seriously impedes its effectiveness. Overloading of the 911 number for non-emergencies creates busy lines that could cause callers with real emergencies to experience a delayed response, or not to get through at all. When all incoming 911 lines are busy, callers will hear a busy signal; Fairfax County will not use a pre-recorded message.

Jay C. Reed, Jr., an 18-year veteran of the Vienna Police Department, has been appointed to the rank of captain and assigned to the position of Commander of Support Services. This division includes communications, records, property, identification, training, budgeting and equipment.

Capt. Reed joined the Vienna Police in 1968. He served in the Patrol Division for 15 years, receiving promotions to the rank of corporal and later to sergeant. In 1983 he was assigned to the Criminal Investigations Bureau as supervisor, and last year he was promoted to the rank of lieutenant.

Capt. Reed is a graduate of the Northern Virginia Criminal Justice Academy and holds an associate degree in business administration from Chowan College. He has also attended a number of management and law enforcement schools and seminars.

Vaccine for animals over a year old costs \$6 and gives protection from rabies for three years. Vaccine for animals under a year old costs \$4 and protects for one year.

In bringing animals to the clinic, dogs should be on a leash and cats confined to a box or basket.

Certificates will be given to pet owners at the clinic to verify each vaccination. Town of Vienna dog tags will be sold at the clinic for \$5 each.
