Road Projects Enter Final Phase of 2023


hanks to American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, the Town of Vienna will be able to repave or repair more streets than usual this fall. The work on 22 milling and paving projects is scheduled to begin



the second week of September and will continue through the end of the year.

"This is the third phase of our efforts to repair or repave streets that were rated in poor or very poor condition by an independent survey expert using the Pavement Condition Index (PCI) and bring them up to high standards," said Vienna pavement management coordinator Dione Shillingford. "ARPA funds will cover approximately \$500,000 in road repairs, and the Town's Public Works capital and operations budgets will fund an additional \$450,000 in road projects."

In addition to milling and paving, Shillingford says road markings on previously completed paving projects should be finished by mid-September. Shillingford says weather conditions and contractor shortages caused delays in the Town's timeline for street markings. Once this year's projects are complete, the Public Works Department will reevaluate the town's road infrastructure to see which streets should get priority next year.


Community Services Board (CSB) will be speaking about his agency's role in the local partnership to divert behavioral health calls from the 9-1-1 public safety system to regional crisis call centers.

Marcus Alert is the name commonly used for the Marcus-David Peters Act, the Virginia law that requires 9-1-1, crisis call centers, law enforcement and behavioral health agencies to work together to improve responses to individuals in behavioral health crisis in Virginia communities. The Act was named for Marcus-David Peters, a young, black biology teacher killed by Richmond Police in 2018 during a mental health crisis.

Find out how local law enforcement and behavioral health agencies have been working together to provide appropriate behavioral health responses in the community. The Mayor and Chief will also be available to answer questions about any matter in Vienna. Refreshments will be served. The Vienna Police Department is located at 215 Center St. S., Vienna.

Word from Juan

Safeguarding Children from Internet Predators

ne of the most evolving online threats to children is the very technology that enables the digital world to thrive. While technology has many benefits, it also has made it easier for offenders to harm kids. Those who seek to exploit children use Internet apps to produce, sell, share and trade child sexual abuse materials, and to find and groom children for sexual abuse. Facebook alone flagged a staggering 73.3 million

pieces of content under "child nudity and sexual exploitation" in 2022. Instagram, YouTube, Twitter, TikTok, Reddit, Snapchat, Discord, and LinkedIn have also removed millions of posts and images that fall foul of community guidelines regarding child abuse.

Adult predators communicate via social media websites that are popular with young people and pretend to be their age. You may not think this could happen here, but it has. According to the F.B.I., an estimated 500,000 predators are online every day. More than 50 percent of online sexual exploitation victims are between the vulnerable ages of 12 and 15.

Social networking can be a great way to share information in a friendly way, but there are also some serious risks. To safeguard your children, help them create social media accounts and consider using parental control apps. Teach your children exactly how social media works and how to explore the web safely. At first, children require constant monitoring. But by teaching them smart ways to use the Internet, they will be able to safely navigate social media with limited oversight as they get older.



or the first time ever, the Vienna Mayor and Town Council races will be on the General Election ballot on Tuesday, Nov. 7, 2023. The change from a May to November election cycle was made to conform to a 2021 Virginia law requiring municipal elections to be held in during the General Election. All seats will be on the ballot in this year's race and in future elections, which will be held every two years. Mayor Linda Colbert is running unopposed this year.
