Vienna Streetscape Project Begins

owntown Vienna is getting a makeover this fall! The Town Council-approved plan calls for 81 landscape planters on both sides of Maple Avenue and 46 planters on both sides of Church Street to be transformed into a welcoming, vibrant display of seasonal color from spring to fall. The new look includes a thoughtful selection of shrubs, ornamental grasses, perennials and annuals.

As part of this project, some trees that are in poor or declining condition will be removed. This will not only improve the health of the remaining street trees but also increase sunlight exposure and reduce root competition. To maintain the tree population, an equal number of new trees will be planted, enhancing both consistency and biodiversity.






New Crosswalk Provides Safe Passage

he Town of Vienna's new crosswalks at the intersection of Church and Mill streets are reminiscent of the old, with one big difference – the new version improves safety for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists. The old, deteriorating brick crosswalks were replaced this summer with stamped asphalt resembling brick, creating a smoother surface that reduces the risk of tripping and falling. Newly installed ADA-compliant curb ramps also improve accessibility for people who use wheelchairs and other mobility devices. The Town plans to complete similar improvements at other intersections along Maple Avenue and Church Street.





Keeping in Stride with Robinson Trust Sidewalks

early four years ago, Vienna's longstanding plan for a walkable community began to rapidly take shape thanks to a generous legacy bequest left by former Councilmember Maud Robinson. She and her late husband, longtime Mayor Charlie Robinson, enjoyed walking around town and envisioned a community that provided safe passage for people of all ages and abilities. To date, the multimillion-dollar Robinson Trust bequest has funded more than five miles of sidewalk throughout the Town of Vienna, and projects are scheduled to continue through 2024. Recently, a cement stamp was created to mark the Robinson Trust sidewalk projects. It's a small tribute to commemorate the generous gift that helped make the Town's vision of a walkable community a reality.

Pedestrian Bridge Construction Resumes

he pedestrian bridge connecting the Freeman Store to the Washington and Old Dominion (W&OD) Trail was expected to open this summer. However, construction doesn't always go as planned, and the Fairfax County permitting process became complicated and took longer than expected. The good news is that all permits have been obtained and the bridge is now on track to open by the end of 2023.

"The Town's contractor will pick up where it left off earlier this year," said the Town's transportation engineer, Andrew Jinks. "The crews are scheduled to clear weeds and brush in September and prepare the site for concrete foundations in late September or early October. After that, passers-by will start to see the bridge take shape as the lumber portions are erected."

Throughout the Freeman Store's history, the pedestrian bridge over Piney Branch to the store's side entrance has been an integral part of the structure. Since the historic building opened in 1859, it has been a store, a home, a train depot, a hotel, a hospital, an officers' quarters, and a fire department. The most recent bridge collapsed in 2016, leaving only pre-existing concrete footers behind. The new ADA-compliant, steel and wooden passageway will be constructed to modern-day standards and look as it did many years ago.





Community Survey Measures Resident Satisfaction

or the first time since 2018, Vienna residents are being asked what they think about the services they receive from the Town of Vienna government through the National Community Survey. The anonymous questionnaire is being sent this month to thousands of Town of Vienna households selected through a random sample by the Town's survey contractor, Polco, a national firm that administers the scientific survey to hundreds of communities across the U.S. The purpose of the survey is to gauge satisfaction levels on a variety of topics ranging from specific Town services to the community's overall quality of life. It is usually conducted every two years. However, the 2020 Town of Vienna survey was cancelled for pandemic-related reasons.

Residents who receive the survey in the U.S. mail are asked to fill out the paper version and mail it in the postage-paid return envelope or complete the survey online at the link provided in the mailed survey. On Oct. 30, 2023, the survey will be open electronically to all Vienna households, and the link will be

provided in the November issue of Vienna Voice, the Town website and the Town's social media channels. The comprehensive questionnaire is effectively a snapshot of how residents feel about The Town of Vienna and the quality of specific services including public safety, transportation, utilities, education, culture, arts, parks and recreation, and community engagement. The survey results will be shared publicly in January and will help the Town Council identify future priorities for the community. ♥

Town Council Elections -Know Your Polling Place

arly voting is underway for this year's November General Election, and for the first time, Vienna Town Council races are on a November ballot. Because of a 2021 change in state law, all municipal elections, including the Vienna Town Council election, which used to be held in May, were moved to November.

Under the Vienna Town Charter, the mayor and councilmembers must run as non-partisan candidates. After the new state election law was passed, the Mayor and Town Council voted to eliminate their staggered terms and place all seats on a two-year election cycle beginning in 2023.

Do you know where to vote?

In the old days of May Town elections, the Community Center was the only polling place on election day. Now, the Community Center is one of four election-day polling places for Mayor and Town Council elections. Vienna residents can vote early at any early-voting location, or on Election Day, Nov. 7, at the precinct where they usually vote for state and national offices. These four precincts/locations are: Cunningham Park Elementary School, Vienna Community Center, Cedar Lane School, and Madison High School. Seats on the Ballot

Town of Vienna residents have the opportunity to vote for 21 elected positions including Mayor and Town Council. The other seats are State Senator, State Delegate, Fairfax County Board Chairman, Hunter Mill District Supervisor, Fairfax County Commonwealth Attorney, Fairfax County Clerk of the Court, Fairfax County Sheriff, Fairfax County Hunter Mill district School Board Representative, three at large Fairfax County School Board Representatives, and three Fairfax County Water and Soil Board positions. Help Kids Avoid Drug Dangers

new school year brings opportunities for new learning and making new friends. However, sometimes those new friends can influence your children to make

poor choices leading to tragic consequences, and you may unknowingly be contributing to the problem by storing old prescription medications, including narcotics! Keep all unused or partially used medication bottles out of children's reach, and if the medications are expired or no longer needed, get rid of them safely through events such as National Drug Take-Back Day. You can drop off the medications at the Vienna Police Department on Oct. 28, 2023 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Remove any personal information from the bottles, drop them off, and local police officers will turn them over to the Virginia State Police for proper disposal.

The goal of Drug Take-Back Day is to combat prescription drug abuse among children and adults. The added benefit is to protect water sources. Wastewater treatment plants are unable to remove many compounds found in medications. That's why flushing or disposing of them in a landfill can result in drugs being discharged into our surface and groundwater and consumed by wildlife and humans. Let's all be careful and dispose of medications safely. As Benjamin Franklin once said, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!" **V**
