Applicants were also invited to work with the Town's Parks and Recreation Department to plan a one-time, celebratory gathering to commemorate their display. Displays were required to be installed between Nov. 28 and Dec. 3 and may remain on the Town Green lawn until Jan. 10, 2024. Happy Holidays, Vienna! 🖖

New Town Council Decided in First-Ever November Election

'ienna's Mayor and Town Council will comprise four incumbents and three newcomers after an election that put all seats on the ballot in the same year, rather than staggered, two-year terms in previous May election cycles. The November election cycle was historic, and the finish was exciting as the Town of Vienna had to wait a week to learn final results!

After the polls closed on election night, Tuesday, Nov. 7, 2023, it was clear that Mayor Linda Colbert won reelection, and winners of five Town Council races were apparent. But the next-highest vote-getter was "write-in," leaving the winner of the sixth Council seat unclear. Elections officials had to tally the results to determine whether all write-in votes went to a single candidate, or whether there were multiple write-in candidates. No individual write-in candidate got enough votes to win a seat in office, and the following were elected to serve on the Town Council beginning Jan. 1, 2024:

The total number of ballots cast in the Vienna election was 5,981 accounting for a 48.53% voter turnout among Vienna's 12,323 registered voters. All non-partisan Vienna Town Council seats will continue to be on the November ballot in future elections, which will be held every two years beginning in 2023. The change from a May to November election cycle was made to conform to a 2021 Virginia law requiring municipal elections to be held during the General Election. \boldsymbol{V}





Signal Upgrades Get the Green Light to Proceed

otorists' days of idling at a traffic light on Maple Avenue and wondering when the signal is going to change are coming to an end! The Town's contractor recently received a notice to proceed with the project to upgrade 14 signals to modern-day standards in the Maple Avenue and Nutley Street corridor. The \$2.1 million project is expected to help reduce signal wait times and more efficiently move traffic through town.

"This project has been in the works for years, and it required coordination with the Virginia Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration," said Town of Vienna Transportation Engineer Andrew Jinks. "The COVID-19 pandemic contributed to the delays in our timeline, and it also had an impact on supply and project costs, which resulted in more delays."

The technology currently used for the town's main arteries was state of the art when it was installed in the late 1990s, but the system was not designed



to accommodate the volume of traffic that passes through Vienna today, and motorists sometimes grow frustrated by signal delays. Jinks says updated signaling equipment is now on order, and construction is expected to begin in early 2024. All upgraded signals are expected to be fully operational by May 2025.

Bridge Connects Pedestrians to Iconic Store


t long last, the pedestrian bridge connecting the Freeman Store to the Washington and Old Dominion (W&OD) Trail is complete! Construction was completed in November, restoring an important link to the Town's history. Once County code inspections are complete, the bridge will be open for pedestrian use.

Since the Freeman Store opened in 1859, it has been a store, a home, a train depot, a hotel, a hospital, an officers' quarters, and a fire department, and the pedestrian bridge over Piney Branch to the store's side entrance has been an integral part of the structure. The most recent bridge collapsed in 2016, leaving only pre-existing concrete footers behind. The new ADA-compliant, steel and wooden passageway was constructed to modern-day standards and looks as it did many years ago.

The Town will celebrate the new bridge when the Freeman Store and Museum opens in March, following its winter hiatus. So mark your calendar for Saturday, March 16, 2024, for the official grand opening of the new bridge!

New Year, Newly Updated Code

ave plans for home improvements or want to build a new house? How about starting a new business? If these are things you are considering starting in the near future, you might want to do your homework first, after all—it pays to stay in the know!

Beginning Jan. 1, 2024, the Town's new zoning and subdivision code updates take effect. Any applications received between now and Jan. 1, 2024, will be reviewed using the current code. If you prefer to have a project reviewed using the updated code, you can wait until the new year to apply, or if your application is already submitted and still under review after Jan. 1, you can request to withdraw and resubmit your application at no extra review cost.

While there is an updated and restructured code, future amendments that require further review are anticipated. All future code amendments will be posted on the Town's webpage www.viennava.gov/codeupdates.

Avoid Holiday Cyber Scams



very year, thousands of online shoppers fall prey to holiday scams, which can lead to the loss of hard-earned money and personal information, not to mention their festive mood! Scammers use various tactics such as non-delivery scams, non-payment scams, auction fraud, and gift card fraud to deceive people.

To avoid becoming a victim, practice good cybersecurity hygiene. Don't click on suspicious links or attachments in emails, on websites, or on social media. Be cautious of phishing scams that trick you into giving up personal information such as your

name, password, and bank account number. If you get an email asking you to update your password or account information, do not comply until you can verify the request by calling the company yourself. These messages are almost always scams, because legitimate companies do not ask for this information via email.

It is also important to do your research before buying or selling anything online. Check the website's URL to ensure it is legitimate and secure, with "https" in the web address. If possible, read reviews of the company or seller before making a purchase, and be wary of buyers and sellers with unfavorable feedback ratings or no ratings at all. Be cautious of sellers who post an auction or advertisement as if they reside in the U.S. but then respond to questions stating they are out of the country on business, for a family emergency, or similar reasons.

When making payments, never wire money directly to a seller, and avoid paying for items with pre-paid gift cards. Use a credit card when shopping online and check your statement regularly for suspicious transactions. A little cybersecurity vigilance on your part will go a long way in ensuring your seasonal celebration will be merry!

If you see running water on Town of Vienna streets or sidewalks, please call the Public Works Department at (703) 255-6380 during business hours or police dispatch at (703) 255-6366 after hours. Please don't delay! The longer a water main break goes

unattended, the greater the damage to the road.

Once public works staff verifies a water main break and surrounding utilities have been marked by Miss Utility, Town work crews will excavate the area and surrounding compromised road, repair the break and finish with temporary asphalt. Permanent asphalt will be installed in the spring.
