

### **New Year, New Council!**

ienna's new Town Council is set to be sworn in on Tuesday, Jan. 2, 2024, at 6 p.m. at Town Hall. For the first time ever, the Mayor and all six Town Council members will be sworn in at the same time. Prior to the November 2023 election, Mayor and Council seats were up for election in May on a staggered, two-year-term basis. Because of a change in state election laws, municipal elections were required to move to the November General Election ballot.

Mayor Linda Colbert and returning Councilmembers Chuck Anderson, Ray Brill and Howard Springsteen will take the oath of office along with new Councilmembers Sandra Allen, Roy Baldwin, and Jessica Ramakis. After the ceremony, the Council will adjourn to a conference session to go over parliamentary procedure. The swearing in ceremony and the conference session are open to the public.





# Holiday Decorating Contest Hits New Record

he Town of Vienna's annual decorating contest hit a new voter participation record in December with 1167 votes cast to determine the finest residential holiday displays in Town! It was all part of the third annual "Shine Bright" Holiday Decorating Contest sponsored by the Town Business Liaison Committee and the Vienna Parks and Recreation Department. Bonus points were awarded for displays that included a representation of Vienna Elementary School in commemoration of its 150th anniversary.

First-place honors in the residential display category went to residents of 121 Casmar St., SE, followed by 317 Patrick St., SW in second and third place winner, 524 Walker St., SW. Winning households received a gift card from a local business and a 2023 Town of Vienna holiday ornament.

Members of the Town Business Liaison Committee judged the business entries. First place went to Trousseau, followed by Simply Social Coffee in second place and Blue Ribbon Barber Shop in third. Pennywise Thrift Shop also received the "People's Choice Award," as determined by popular vote, and Trace: The Zero Waste Store received an honorable mention award for creatively including snowflake ornaments created by Vienna Elementary School students in its display.

All awards were presented at the Mayor and Town Council Holiday Reception at Vienna Town Hall on Friday, Dec. 8, 2023. The winning business received one hour of Mayor Linda Colbert's time as a guest employee.

### **Police Lineup Leads to Lifesaving Campaign**

alk about a nail biter! It was neck and neck for Town of Vienna Police as they fought hard to claim "victory" over the competition in this year's nationwide Zero Cancer Grow-and-Give campaign. For the third year in a row, Vienna Police finished in first place, edging out their competitors nationwide by just \$1.29!

As in years past, officers went "undercover" to take part in #NoShaveNovember to raise awareness about prostate cancer and to generate support for research to find a cure. Police Chief Jim Morris suspended the dress-code rule, relaxing the department's



no-beard policy for the entire month of November so officers could participate, and their efforts paid off! The department raised a total of \$3,052.70, the most money in the competition for the First Responder category.

In addition to raising awareness and funding

research to find a cure, the Zero Cancer organization provides educational materials to men and their families and offers screenings for men who would otherwise be unable to afford them.

"Over the past three years, our department and community have come together to raise awareness for this important cause," said Vienna Police Chief Jim Morris. "We are in the safety and prevention business, and our hope is that our participation raises awareness and encourages men in our community to get regular, potentially life-saving screenings." Nearly 250,000 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States this year alone, and the illness is very treatable if diagnosed early. This year's campaign proves that coming together for a good cause can have a lasting impact, and that every dollar counts.

### **Vienna Police Join Forces for Santa's Ride**



anta's Ride 2023 is in the record books, and oh what a holiday memory it is! This convoy of philanthropic police officers from Vienna and other Northern Virginia jurisdictions teamed up with Santa and friends on Dec. 12, 2023, to collect toys and other surprises donated by community members and deliver them to sick children at Fairfax Hospital, Georgetown Lombardi Cancer Center and to children in need in the community.

After fueling up for breakfast at the Vienna Police Department, Santa and friends headed out on their traffic-stopping, holiday-season goodwill tour to pick up donated gifts at schools and other locations in Fairfax County. Even the Grinch got into the holiday spirit! Thanks to the community's generosity, donated toys will be used to cheer young hospital patients well into the New year.

### For Winter Weather Cleanup - Less is More!

hen Old Man Winter dumps ice and snow on the area, please go easy on the rocks! A little salt goes a long way in deicing driveways, sidewalks and other surfaces to ensure pedestrian and motorist safety. Too much salt can cause vehicle corrosion, damage sidewalks and roads over time, and contaminate streams impacting fish and human drinking water sources. When applying salt, think less is more. One coffee mug of salt can treat a 20-foot driveway. Scatter it so there is plenty of space between grains. You can also reduce the need for salt by removing snow in stages as it falls and before it turns to ice. This way, you'll be able to use less deicer, and it will be more effective on a slick surface that's not so deep!

### Mail Thieves Bring New Meaning to "One-Armed Bandit"



ext time you leave mail in your mailbox for the postal carrier to pick up, think again. Mail theft incidents are on the rise in the U.S., and residents in the Town of Vienna have also been affected by this alarming trend.

The flag arm pointing up on your mailbox is meant to signal the postal carrier to pick up the outgoing mail. That arm is also a signal to thieves that opportunity awaits. They drive through neighborhoods looking for outgoing mail that contains checks to pay bills, and once they steal the checks, these crafty criminals use chemicals to erase and alter the check information, keeping your signature intact. They then alter the payee and the amount and cash the check using the

account information on the bottom of the check to commit additional fraud. One victim reported that these criminals not only cashed the original check, but also made hundreds of copies, circulating them between other



criminal organizations in different states!

If you must pay your bills by check, your safest bet is to hand the mail directly to your mail carrier or drop it in the box inside a post office. Another option is to pay your bills to legitimate and well-known companies over the phone by calling the customer service number on the bill. You can also consider paying bills online or setting up autopay with your checking account or credit card if possible. All of these options will help ensure your bills are paid and your checks stay out of the hands of criminals.
