### TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

OCTOBER 19, 1987

- Requested the Transportation Safety Commission to investigate traffic safety at the intersection of Wade Hampton Drive and Roland Street, S.W., taking into account the traffic signal system at the intersection of Maple Avenue and Nutley Street. Requested the Police Department to investigate the desirability or appropriateness of invoking commuter parking in the area of Wade Hampton and Roland.
- Directed the Town staff to move immediately to begin discussions with Fairfax County staff on construction of a bypass around Vienna.
- Approved in concept a proposed boundary adjustment program. The Town staff is to begin discussion with the Fairfax County planning staff with the understanding that Council will be advised of the status of the program prior to the matter being scheduled before the Board of Supervisors.
- Approved in principle recommendations from the Town/Business Liaison Committee on beautification of commcrcial areas, and requested the Town staff to recommend priorities and provide cost estimates.
- Approved disbursement of \$15,127 in State Fire Program funds to the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department for purchase of a new pumper truck.
- Awarded a contract for Talahi Road public improvements to E.E. Lyons Construction Co. of Vienna in the amount of \$9,792.
- Following a public hearing, adopted a Town Code amendment deleting any reference to conditional uses in multi-

### NOVEMBER 2, 1987

- Following public hearings, adopted amendments to the zoning code, one establishing a 90-day time limit for decisions by the Board of Zoning Appeals on applications for use permits, another establishing civil penalties for certain zoning violations.
- Approved the landscape plan for Tech Center II, 911 Follin Lane, S.E.
- Set December 7 for a public hearing on an application to rezone the property at 627 Pine St., S.E., from RS-16 to RS-12.5.

- Awarded a contract for renovations at Town Hall to Charles E. Smith Management Construction of Arlington in the amount of \$37,851.47.
- Eliminated the \$5 monthly fire sprinkler service charge for condominiums and apartments.
- Awarded a bid to JKJ Chevrolet of Vienna for a 4X4 cab and chasis, single axle truck at a price of \$12,882.
- Awarded a bid to Dictaphone Corp. for a multi-channel logging recorder system in the amount of \$19,544.
- Requested the Town Manager to obtain information concerning the proposed rate increase by Media General Cable and to request the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors for time that Town representatives may appear at the public hearing, when scheduled.
- Set December 7 for adoption of an ordinance to control dangerous dogs.

## Let's Trim Those Branches

Recent Citizen Comments on the Town's Spring and Fall Cleanups prompted an Upham Place resident to write on a related issue:

Reading the November issue of the Newsletter about retention of twice-a-year Cleanups, I respectfully bring to the attention of my fellow residents the matter of tree limbs and other brush materials that have grown over into the Town's right-of-way that could have been cut and placed at curbside for the fall pickup if the adjoining homeowner had taken the time and effort to do so.

It is great that now I can ride a bus from near my home to the Vienna subway, but in the early morning darkness and early sunsets, one cannot use the sidewalks to get to the bus stop without walking into the roadway to avoid getting "attacked" by tree branches in the dark.

Trees are beautiful, and should be saved wherever possible, but the homeowner should recognize how simple it would be to prune and/or trim back these growths, saving the trees yet doing away with a serious hazard.

Maybe, over the fall and winter months, attention could be given to this matter before the spring blossoms return. If each of us takes a serious look around our property, we could perform the needed "surgery" in time to place the materials out for the Spring Cleanup.

# Town to Accept Waste Motor Oil

Beginning this month, the Department of Public Works will set aside one Saturday morning every three months to accept small amounts of waste oil from town residents. Waste oil from commercial businesses will not be accepted.

Waste oil may be taken for disposal to the Town's property yard on Nutley Street, N.W., between 8 a.m. and noon on the following dates: December 5, March 5, June 4 and September 3.

The fate of used motor oil is important due to its potential impact on the environment, particularly water resources. Automotive oil contains high concentrations of metals such as lead and other hazardous substances. As little as one quart of oil, when fully dissolved, can contaminate up to two million gallons of water.
