1988 Town of Vienna vehicle stickers go on sale March 14 and must be displayed by midnight April 15. The cost is \$15 for cars and trucks under 4,000 pounds empty weight, \$20 for cars and trucks 4,000 pounds and over, \$8 for motorcycles, and \$1 for out-ofstate military personnel.


Participants in the hands-on workshop, using various stenciling techniques, may create their own notecards, wooden pieces or material for a floor cloth.


