# **40 Years of Fun!**

'iVa! Vienna is almost "over the hill." Since 1984, people of all ages have come together to celebrate the warm-weather season in Vienna at this beloved Memorial Day weekend event. This year, the festival is set to mark its milestone 40th anniversary from May 25-27, on historic Church Street!

The whole family can enjoy seemingly endless carnival rides, games, live entertainment across three stages, and shopping booths and vendors (including arts, crafts and locally made artisan items). If that's not enough, don't forget about the countless culinary delights from all over the world with options for every kind of craving. On Monday, May 27, at 1 p.m., the main stage will feature a Memorial Day tribute to those who lost their lives in service to our country.

Returning this year is Brewfest Beer Garden on Mill Street, featuring an array of beer from local breweries, wine, more food options, and live music. While Brewfest is open to all ages, those who wish to purchase and consume alcohol must provide a valid I.D. to verify legal age, obtain a wristband and show the wristband when purchasing alcoholic beverages. All alcohol must be consumed within the restricted area of Brewfest.

This Town tradition is hosted by The Rotary Club of Vienna in partnership with the Town of Vienna. It serves as a major fundraising opportunity for the Rotary Club, which uses the proceeds to support charitable, educational and community groups in the Vienna area. In its inaugural year, 1984, ViVa! Vienna raised \$2500, enabling local children to attend summer camp. In 2023, the event raised nearly \$200,000 bringing the 40-year total raised to more than \$3 million! This year, for its 40th anniversary, Rotary hopes to raise \$250,000 for charitable causes. # **New Freeman Store Bridge Opens**

espite soggy weather, community members and local and state dignitaries turned out on Saturday, March 23, 2024, to celebrate the opening of the new Freeman Store pedestrian bridge. Construction was completed in November 2023, restoring an important link to the Town's history. The new ADA-compliant, steel and wooden passageway was constructed to modern-day standards and looks much as it did many years ago.

Since the Freeman Store opened in 1859, it has been a store, a home, a train depot, a hotel, a hospital, an officers' quarters, and a fire department, and the pedestrian bridge over Piney Branch to the store's side entrance has been an integral part of the structure. The bridge that existed prior to the new bridge collapsed in 2016, leaving only concrete footers behind. The new bridge was several wars in the meking and completion was delayed for COVID 10 n



years in the making and completion was delayed for COVID-19 pandemic-related reasons.

After a brief indoor ceremony and outdoor ribbon cutting to officially open the new bridge, participants returned inside to get the first look at the store's new museum exhibits, "Exploring Books Throughout Time" and "Vienna Unveiled Through Maps." Stop by and see them for yourself! The Freeman Store is open from 12-4 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday.

# **Annex Building Comes Down**

t's a work in progress, but the Town's Annex building demolition is underway. The Town's contractor began tearing down the building on Monday, April 15, 2024, and demolition and removal is expected to continue through May.

The Town Council voted to tear down the Annex building June 5, 2023, after an extensive feasibility study and a robust public outreach campaign were conducted to determine future use. With a price tag of more than a million dollars, it was determined to be too costly to bring the Annex building up to code for parks and recreation use, and the Council opted instead to start from scratch in accordance with community feedback.

The Town is still in the midst of the Annex Long-Term Use Study, and staff members are exploring alternative temporary uses for the property to ensure that it can provide benefits to the community until long-term plans are finalized and implemented. Temporary uses will require a conditional use permit, which the Town Council is expected to discuss at the May 20 Council meeting.

The Town bought the former Faith Baptist Church property in 2020, and it served as a temporary police headquarters while the new Vienna Police Department building was being constructed next door.

# **Traffic Signal Upgrades Begin**

fter a lengthy construction administrative process, work is now underway to upgrade 14 traffic signals along Nutley Street and Maple Avenue to modern-day standards. The Town's contractor is focusing first on the two intersections that require full signal replacement, and will then begin adding updated equipment on the remaining signals along the two streets.



"Work at the intersection of Maple Avenue and Follin Lane and the intersection of Nutley Street and Tapawingo Road are very old and need to be replaced," said Town transportation engineer Andrew Jinks. "Those locations require new concrete footers to be poured, new light poles, and boring underground to install new communication lines before updated signals can be installed."

Jinks says the Maple Avenue, Follin Lane intersection will also get an additional feature to enhance pedestrian safety.

"That intersection currently has crosswalks, but no pedestrian crossing signals," Jinks said. "The contractor will remedy that situation and install the crossing signals at the same time that the new traffic signal is installed."

The technology currently used for the town's main arteries was stateof-the-art when it was installed in the late 1990s, but the system was not designed to accommodate the volume of traffic that passes through Vienna today, and motorists sometimes grow frustrated by signal delays. Jinks says barring any unforeseen circumstances or weather delays, the new, more efficient signal system along Nutley Street and Maple Avenue is expected to be operational by May 2025.

A parks and recreation master plan outlines the goals and vision of a community's parks, recreational programs, events, trails, and open spaces. # Warmer Weather Calls for Conservation

The U.S. population has doubled in the last 50 years, and water usage has tripled! Water usage always goes up in warm-weather months, which is why it is important to be good stewards of our natural resources and use water wisely. Conserving water saves property owners money on utility bills and reduces community expenses for water and wastewater treatment. It also reduces the cost of energy needed to heat and pump water, and it keeps the environment healthy by reducing the need to divert water from rivers, bays, and other water bodies.

Most household water usage comes from bathroom and kitchen fixtures, washing machines, and pipe leaks. Here are some simple things you can do to ensure you are using water wisely:

- Monitor your water consumption. If your water consumption rises, check for leaks. Toilet leaks are the most common household leak.
- Purchase high-efficiency appliances and low-flow showerheads.
- Irrigate responsibly. Consider adding mulch to flower beds to make irrigation more efficient, learn about the "cycle-and-soak" irrigation method, and purchase native, climate-appropriate plants.
- Use a dishwasher rather than wash dishes by hand, and only run the dishwasher when it is fully loaded.



 Take showers rather than baths. A 10-minute shower uses 25 gallons of water, compared to 35 – 50 gallons for a bath.

# Local Drinking Water Meets New Federal Safety Standards

n April 10, 2024, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced final national drinking water standards for six types of poly- and perfluoroalkyl substances known collectively as PFAS. These manmade chemicals are found throughout the environment after decades of use in industrial processes, and they can be harmful to human health at high levels. The new drinking water standards regulate the maximum containment levels (MCLs) of six PFAS compounds and establishes a health index for four other PFAS compounds.

Currently, the Town of Vienna purchases drinking water from Fairfax Water, which is distributed by the Town of Vienna's water utility network to thousands of customers within and just outside Town limits. The Town of Vienna and Fairfax Water have been voluntarily testing for PFAS and all Town of Vienna drinking water test results show PFAS levels below the MCLs proposed by the EPA.

PFAS are used in coatings, paints, fabrics, and foams to resist heat, oil stains, grease, and water. They do not break down naturally and they build up in the environment over time, and water utilities are passive PFAS receivers as a result. Most humans are exposed to PFAS through food, consumer goods and drinking water.

The Town of Vienna recognizes that safe drinking water is vital in protecting public health, and the Town will continue to work with Fairfax Water and other regional partners to continue to provide customers with quality drinking water that meets federal safety standards. The Town of Vienna will also continue to stress the importance of protecting local water sources and the Town's role in keeping drinking water supplies safe.

# Earn Tax and Energy Credits with Solar Power

f you think solarizing your home is financially out of reach, think again. Solarize Virginia makes transitioning to solar easier and more affordable for Vienna residents and businesses, and solar power can drastically reduce your family's utility costs as well as your family's carbon footprint.

Vienna resident Chris Thayer went solar more than two years ago through Solarize Virginia, a community-based outreach initiative managed by the Local Energy Alliance Program (LEAP)



and promoted by the Town of Vienna's Conservation and Sustainability Commission. Though the initial cost was pretty steep, he knew the energy-efficient move would help the environment, qualify him for tax credits, reduce utility costs in his all-electric house, and eventually pay for itself.

"Most months my wife and I pay very little because our solar panels generate a good bit of energy," Thayer said. "Our highest bills come during the winter months when there is less daylight to generate energy, and even then, the bills range from around \$100-\$160, compared to more than \$300 before solar."

Thayer also realized another benefit. "Some of the electricity we generate goes back to the power grid," Thayer said, "and every once in a while, I get a small payment from the sale of SRECs (Solar Renewable Energy Certificates). That's all handled automatically."



Thayer says with the year-to-year savings and ongoing tax credits, the solar energy panels will probably pay for themselves in another four to five years.

You can sign up for Solarize Virginia through June 30, 2024. The program includes free assessments to ensure eligibility; pre-vetted installation contractors who are experienced, highly qualified and insured; discounted rates with minimal up-front costs; and ongoing support and education. ## Green Tips for a Lush Lawn

re you looking for a healthy, lush, green lawn? When it comes to using fertilizer, you can obtain the yard you've always wanted and help protect the environment, too! Follow these simple tips to create a healthy lawn that's less susceptible to weeds and disease:

- Apply fertilizers only when it's necessary and at the recommended amount.
- If rain is in the forecast, hold off on applying fertilizer or it will be washed away and pollute the waterways.
- If you need to fertilize early, limit it to a light feeding (half-pound of 10-10-10 per 1000 sq. ft.) after the initial flush of growth has subsided in May or early June. Fertilizing too early encourages leaf growth at the expense of root development.
- Leave your mowed grass clippings on the lawn. They can cut down on your need for fertilizer and provide nitrogen and other nutrients to the soil.

If you spill fertilizer on sidewalks or driveways, sweep it up and reuse it later. This way it won't get washed into our streams and rivers. 🔍

# **Picture it!**

The Vienna location opened in 1947 at 100 Park St., SE at Maple Avenue – the corner where Crumbl Cookies is now located – and ended its 55-year run when it closed in 2002.





### Beware: Financial Scammers are Targeting Students



s banking evolves with the times, so do the tactics that thieves use to steal your money. The scheme via electronic check deposits is complicated, and the result can be devastating.

The swindle usually begins when a fraudster posing as a hiring agent contacts people who are desperately looking online for a job or internship, like students or recent college graduates. The scammers tell the students they are candidates for a job, and conduct interviews via phone, text, or email - never in person.

After the "interview," the students are always told they got the job or internship and have been hired. The scammers then email their victims forms, much like a legitimate hiring manager would do. The unsuspecting

students email the completed forms back with personal information, and then receive images of checks via email, and are told to cut them to size and electronically deposit them in their bank account to pay for their work equipment.

The bank typically gives the students or graduates immediate credit because of their good relationship with the bank. The scammer then immediately instructs their victims to send payments to various vendor accounts to pay for their office equipment. After a few days, the bank attempts to verify the deposited



checks and realizes the notes are fake. The bank reverses the transactions to each student's account, and now the students owe thousands of dollars!

Young people, please beware! Legitimate hiring managers do not conduct final interviews via email or by phone. Most want to meet you in person, or at least via video call. And if your new job requires new equipment, the companies typically furnish that to you. As always, if an offer seems too good to be true, it is probably a scam.

# Vienna Rotary Bestows "Service Above Self" Awards
