BEAUTIFICATION PROJECTS: A landscaping proposal, designed to enhance the business area of Maple Avenue, was recently submitted by Mr. Edward B. Willard, Landscape Architect, was reviewed by the Beautification Advisory Committee, and accepted by the Town Council. Implementation of the first phase of this program will begin within the next few weeks with the planting of a number of young maple trees along Maple Avenue where permission of the property owners can be obtained. Other portions of the recommendations, including underground wiring and beautifying the commercial parking areas, will receive attention as the resolution of financial and legal technicalities can be achieved.

One of the major projects to be undertaken by a civic group is that of the development and installation of attractive signs and shrubbery plantings at the entrances to Vienna. This proposal by the Vienna Jaycees will give a strong boost to beautification efforts, as well as pride in our community. The Advisory Committee will be contacting all organizations for assistance during the coming months and plans to encourage "keep our block clean" projects in the residential areas.

SPRING AND DOGS: All Vienna dog owners are advised that Town ordinances strictly prohibit dogs running at large. It is hoped that owners of dogs will recognize the fact that "loose" dogs constitute a possible menace, particularly to children, and are a real nuisance at spring planting time. While voluntary compliance with our "dog control" ordinances is preferable, dog owners should be aware that all necessary action to obtain compliance will be taken.

VIENNA-OAKTON HAMSTERS TO PRODUCE 'MARY, MARY': This humorous play on everyday life, written by Jean Kerr, will be presented at the Community Center on May 10th and 11th, and again on May 17th and 18th. Directed by John F. Duncan, Supervisor of Fine and Performing Arts for the Fairfax County Public Schools, admission will be \$1.50 for adults and \$.75 for children.

COUNCIL SALARY AND REIMBURSEMENT POLICY: Some reports to the contrary, Members of the Vienna Town Council do not have expense accounts. They are reimbursed for their expenses for out-of-town travel on Town business or in attandance at Town-related conferences and conventions. Members of the Council receive \$1800 per year. The Mayor receives \$3,000 annually.

VIENNA AUTO LICENSE PLATES REQUIRED BY APRIL 15TH: Tags are on sale daily in the Town Hall during regular business hours (8:30-5:00). For the convenience of residents unable to come to the Town Hall during weekdays, plates will be sold on Saturday, April 13th, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. A few Vienna residents are continuing to receive auto tag applications from Fairfax County. If such forms are received, the County should be notified of this error.

PARENTAL LIABILITY FOR VANDALISM: The loss last Spring of several dozen lovely trees in our Southside Park and the annual malicious vandalism of tables, swings, and other park equipment, make it advisable to outline at this time of year the responsibility of parents. While vandalism in Vienna is not a major problem, the destruction of any property belonging to the community should not be tolerated.

The last session of the General Assembly passed two bills relating to parental responsibility. One provides that the governing body of a Town may institute an action and recover from the parents of a minor, damages suffered by reason of the willful or malicious destruction of or damage to public property. The second provision gives the same right to property owners other than governing bodies.

* * * * *

GENERAL ASSEMBLY REPORT: We are happy to report that all legislation of concern to the Town of Vienna was either "killed" or satisfactorily amended during the recent General Assembly Session. Of the two particular bills discussed in a special report from the Town Council, Senate Bill 210 was "killed", and Senate Bill 237 was amended favorably. The Town Council is pleased with the efforts of its representatives and their concern for Vienna and its citizens.

VOTING INFORMATION: The Town of Vienna will hold an election on Tuesday, the lith of June, to elect a Mayor and three members of Council. Residence requirements for voting in the Town Election are 1 year residency in Virginia; 6 months residency in the Town of Vienna; and 30 days residency in the precinct. Voters must be registered by May 11th. For the convenience of qualified residents who have not yet registered, registrars will sit in the Town Hall on two Saturdays, May 5th and May 11th, from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Application for absentee ballots must be made to the General Registrar's office in Fairfax, or may be obtained from neighborhood assistant registrars. Voting must be done before a notary and forwarded by certified mail to the General Registrar's office in Fairfax on or before June 6, 1968. If desired, voters may vote absentee ballot by going directly to the General Registrar's office in Fairfax.

Vienna residents who wish to be a candidate for office in the Town Election must file a notice of intent to run for such office with the Clerk of the Fairfax Circuit Court no later than April 12, 1968.

Vienna's Recreation Department has been urged to consider the possibility of offering a beginners class in gem cutting at the Community Center next Fall. Since this course would require the purchase of a considerable amount of equipment, it is essential to obtain some indication of those who might be interested. If you are interested in this course, or any other hobby or craft you would like to see added to the recreation program, please send a letter or post card to the Director of Parks and Recreation, Town of Vienna, 127 Center St., S. Vienna, Va. In planning recreational programs, the Recreation Department is anxious to include all possible programs compatible with the desires of a majority of our citizens.
